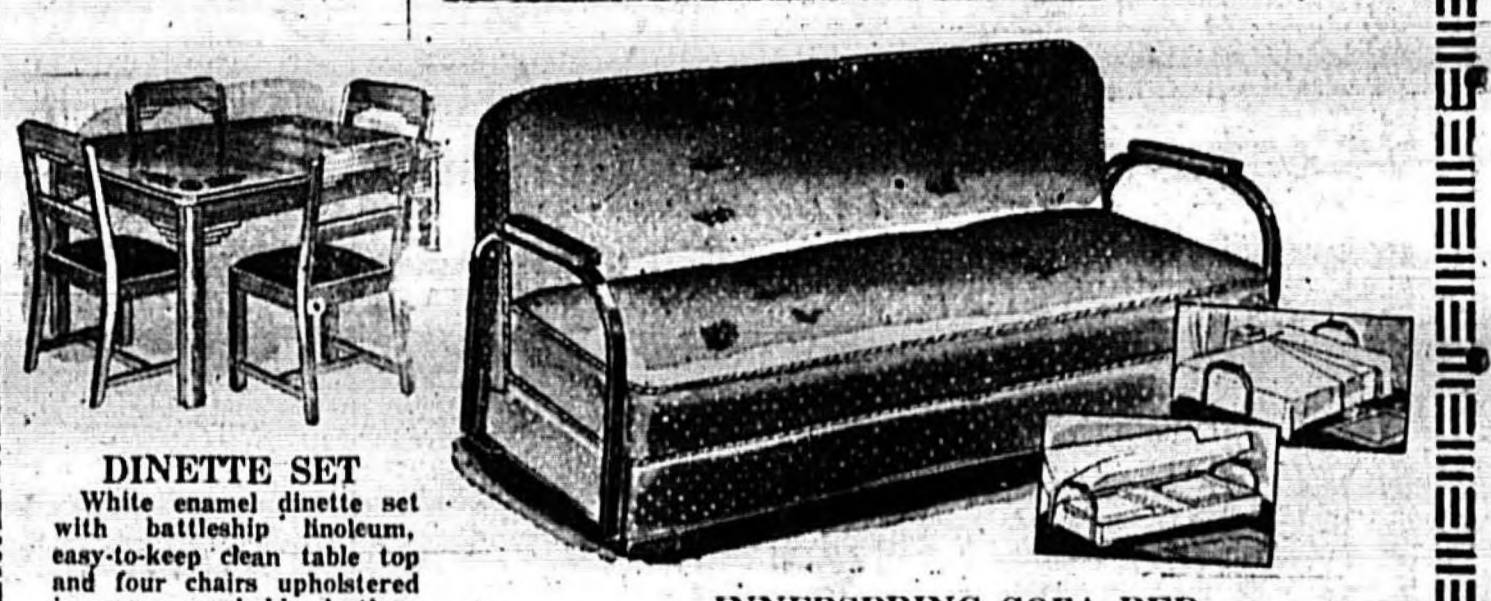

All strikes, as Editor and Publisher says, are "an economic waste." Seldom does any party to a strike gain any worthwhile benefits.

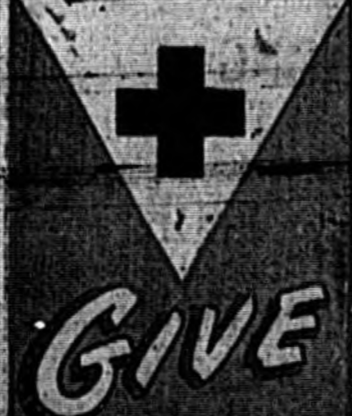

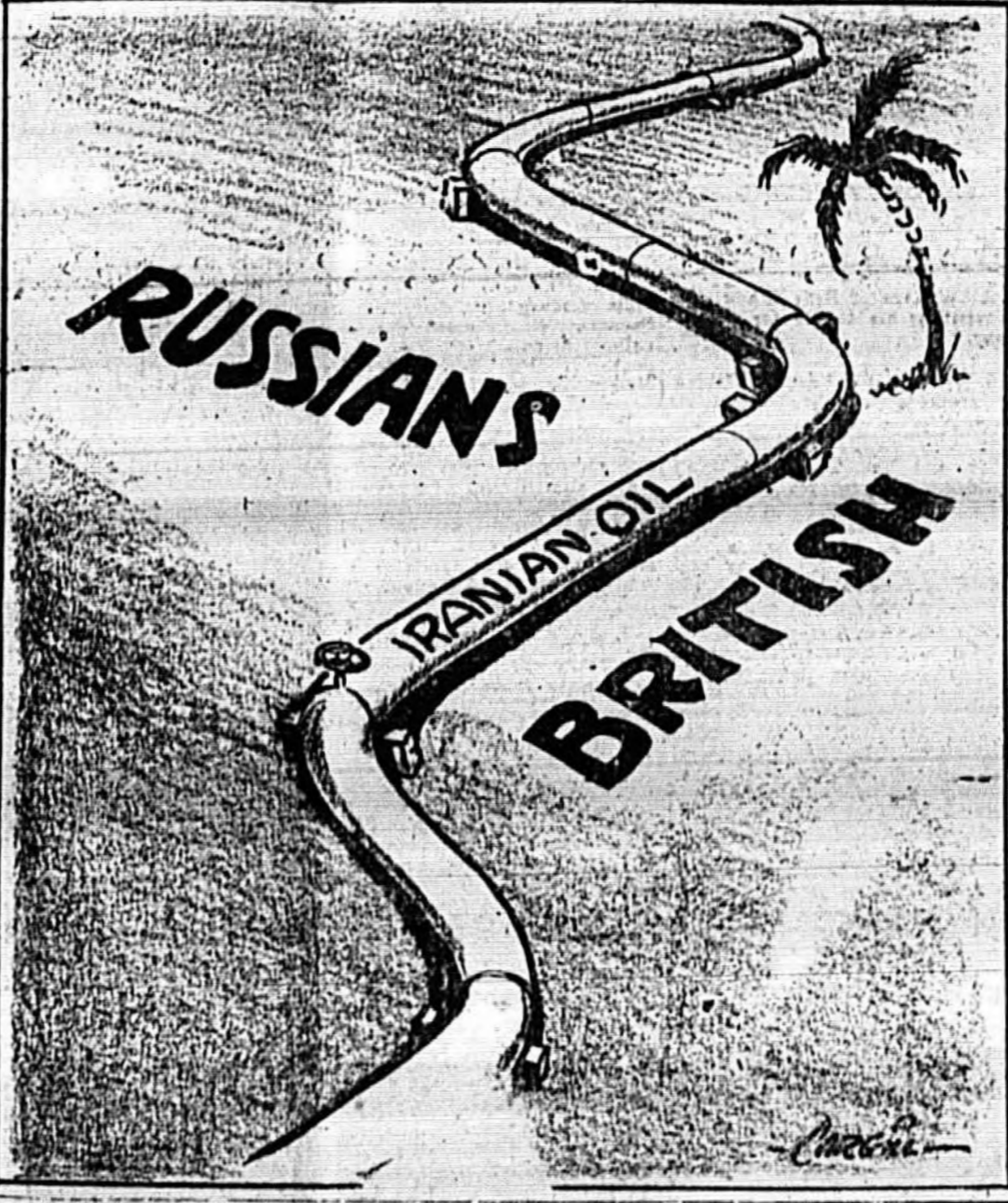

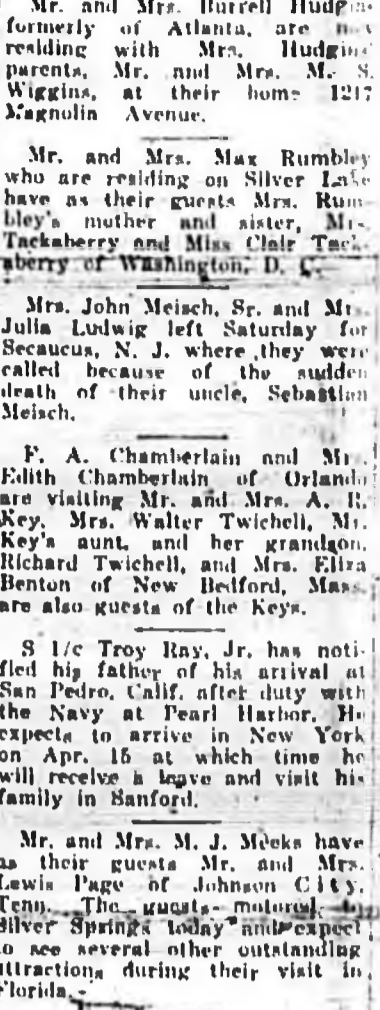

Tiny Village In Switzerland Mecca For Exiled Royalty

Gstaad, Switzerland — This tiny village of 700 persons, located in the heart of Bernese Oberland midway between the Lake of Geneva and Lake of Thun, is the mecca of Europe's exiled royalty and international society, this first postwar winter.

Fourteen hotels, dot the hills surrounding the railroad station in the valley but members of the "haute monde" name only one as they step from their train into horse-drawn sleighs and are wrapped in fur robes. It is the Royal and Winter Palace Hotel. Located above the village, the eight-story stone building presents a castle appearance with its turrets, above one of which the red and white flag of Switzerland flutters in the crisp mountain air.

Slide through the one main street of the village and the horses strain to haul their tilted burdens up a winding road to the hotel.

The guest list displayed in the lobby testifies to the hotel's popularity among Europe's bluebloods. Like pages out of the Almanach de Gotha, the bulletin board announces that in residence now are "Her royal Majesty, Queen Victoria of Spain," "Princess de Rohan et suite" (second wife of exiled King Leopold of Belgium), "Le Comte et La Comtesse de Saxe-Coburg et Gotha" and "Don Juan, pretender to the throne of Spain).

Not listed, but known to all as being there, too, is exiled King Leopold of Belgium. Protected from the curious by four bodyguards who accompany him even while skiing, Leopold enjoys the privacy of a 200-year-old chalet on the hotel grounds, dines with his family there and seldom mingles with the other guests.

Throughout the day, the royal and wealthy vacationers ski over the surrounding hills or skate on the hotel's private rink, men and women vying with each other in colorful sports attire.

With darkness and the cocktail hour, the hotel corridors, the lobby, bar and dining room fill with women in chic evening dresses, ablaze with jewels and protectively draped with luxurious furs. The men are in white tie and tails or dinner jackets.

A dance orchestra plays—mostly American jazz—until the small hours of the next morning, while outside the stars twinkle in a crisp sky and the trees crack in the sharp winter cold of Switzerland.

SWISS CAN HAVE MONEY
ZURICH, (AP)—Swiss nature protectors have figured out a new wrinkle to raise money for the preservation of the beauties of Silsersee, a lake in the Upper Engadine valley. To entice contributors, they issued a "Silsersee dollar," made of milk chocolate to be given to each donor to the fund. Chocolate was still rationed, but the Silsersee dollar, minted by special permission of rationing authorities, was coupon-free.

Thirty Italian Children Find Home In Rome's Royal Palace

ROME—Thirty small children—once healthy and normal, but today blind or crippled refugees from Cassino and other Italian towns where the Allies fought the Germans—have found a home in Rome's royal palace.

Boys and girls four to 12 years old, some without legs and arms, are living in the Quirinal, the palace of prince Umberto, lieutenant general of the realm.

More than a year ago the prince assigned the children a building facing the principal garden of the Quirinal. It is next door to the building where the Regent lives with his wife, Princess Marie Jose of Belgium, and their four children.

Ancient Order Helps
The children are wards of the Italian Chapter of the Sovereign Order of Malta, organized in 1099 to take part in the Crusades. Today the Order supports hospitals, child clinics and other welfare projects in many European countries.

Found by American, British and Brazilian soldiers in the battle area during the fighting for Central Italy, they were given first aid and hospitalization and later brought to Rome.

"The greatest difficulty," said Prince Umberto recently, "was to remove the traces of the shock from which they were suffering."

The prince described how the attentions and care of the Sisters of Charity, members of the blue-garbed order of hospital nuns founded by St. Vincent de Paul, have helped the children.

Prince Well Known
Because of their frequent visits, the prince and his children are well known to most of the children.

When, during a recent visit, 7-year-old blind Vittoria called him over to show him a toy, the prince explained that Vittoria was in his mother's arms when a German bullet killed her, grazed the child's temple and cut the optic nerve.

Umberto pointed out little Italo, aged 10, who lost not only his sight but also both arms below the elbow.

"While most of the children who have lost their sight are learning to feel things with their hands," the prince said, "Italo is doubly handicapped, but still has the spirit to take a lively interest in everything."

Umberto explained that doctors nothing but a borrowed cap to identify them, Hunt said: "Unless conditions improve, mailmen will be wearing civies."

Coal Men Await Reply From Lewis

Bituminous Contract Ends Sunday At Midnight Unless Lewis Agrees To Extend It

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26. (AP)—John L. Lewis today notified bituminous coal operators that he will end their present contract on Sunday at midnight. Lewis said that 400,000 coal miners "will stay home with their families next week."

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26. (AP)—Bituminous operators are awaiting their cue from John L. Lewis on the next move in their contract talks. The burly chief of the United Mine Workers Union is still to reply to the operators' summation on Lewis' general proposals. Although Lewis had asked the mine owners to make him an offer, as he put it, the answer to his proposals was as unresponsive as the proposals.

The present bituminous contract expires at midnight Sunday night. Lewis' reply under a policy of "no contract—no work." One ray of hope in the coal-black picture is the fact that the miners' negotiating committee still has the operators' reply under study. At least it is felt the negotiations are being kept alive one more day.

In the meantime, Lewis has summoned his anthracite scale committee to Washington today to decide on the procedure for terminating the hard coal contract covering 76,000 Pennsylvania miners. This too, is due to expire if Lewis wants to end it, one month after the bituminous agreement.

Only Two Local Races In Coming Primary Election

There are only two local contests in the coming election on May 7; that of M. B. (T. Bone) Smith versus Dr. Luther T. Doss as state representative candidates in Group No. 1, and C. R. Clontz of Orlando, incumbent for county commission in Group 4 who is opposed by B. C. Dodd of Goldenrod, who in the last election ran for sheriff.

Unopposed candidates include: Bradley C. Adams as state representative in Group 3; H. B. Pope to complete his appointment to fill the unexpired term of O. J. Pope (two years) as county commissioner in District 1, and J. P. McClelland as county commissioner in District 2, for a four year term.
