Parents demand action from schools

SANFORD — Everyday, Jean Marchese worries about sending her son, Joseph, to

The Oviedo mother is concerned her 14year-old may lose consciousness at school while suffering from low blood sugar levels, and no one in the building will be able

Schools do not have trained staff to give glucagon shots to diabetic students

So Marchese, and more than a dozen parents and children, approached the Seminole County School Board Tuesday to discuss their concerns about the school system's policy for students with diabetes.

Currently, many Seminole schools do not have staff trained to give glucagon shots to students suffering from diabetic episodes. If a student goes into a diabetic episode, the only procedure is to call 911. "Glucagon is a life-saving medicine," said Patti Barone, a mother whose 5-year-

School officials have said since no school is more than two miles from a fire-rescue station, calling 911 is the best way to get students immediate emergency help. And, a number of schools do have trained nurses on staff to supervise students who need

Seminole County man wins national bulldozer competition

GENEVA -- The nickname of the place is "Mount Osceola." It's 150 feet high and has flies, buzzards, sea gulls, rats and snakes.

Gary Heath has worked on the mount for 23 years.

He says he has seven years until he

is the Team Leader for the

Heath has a bird's-eye view of the buzzards and seegulis that flock to the dumrp. couple of days, you get used to the smell," Heath said.

What makes Heath's job satisfying is he is on a buildozer or other heavy equipment each work day. The late Curtis Heath put Gary on a front-end loader when he was seven years old.

Not only has Heath become the county's Landfill boss, he's the top bulldozer in the country for the second time in eight years. After winning a fifth Florida bull-dozing championship, Heath won the nationals in St. Paul, M:nn. in August. Heavy equipment operators

around the country competed over an obstacle course tha ed 15 minutes to navigate. With the experi-ence he's gained on top of the Mount

Osceola landfill, Heath needed but six minutes.

"They place barrels or traffic cones exactly 14 feet and four inches apart." Heath said. "The foot of the blade on the bulldozer is 14 feet. That allows two inches on each side to get through the

SHUPE'S SCOOP

Snook are notorlous for being very finicky. One way to create a feeding frenzy is to use small battfish for live chum, and toss handfuls above holding snook and let them drift down. Once the snook begin hitting the chum, simply toss a hooked baitfish into the feeding area.


The Seminole High School girls volleyball team did somewhat the same thing Monday night after reaching a season-low in falling to a less-talented Mainland squad in three games at home.

Nevertheless, parents and students told the school board Tuesday the district isn't doing enough for students with diabetes

"I want Seminole County do its homework and realize how serious this disease is," Joseph

Marchese said. Diabetes is a disease in which the body does not produce or properly use insulin, a hormone that is needed to convert sugar, starches and other food into energy needed for daily life. The cause of diabetes is a mystery, although both genetics and environmental factors such as obesity and lack of exercise appear to play roles.

According to the American Diabetes Association, there are 15.7 million people (5.9 percent of the population) in the United States who have diabetes. People with diabetes can suffer from hypoglycemia, or low bloodsugar levels, which if severe can lead to unconsciousness, seizures, heart failure and death.

That's why parents in Seminole County want trained personnel at schools to give glucagon shots.

"Can anyone just watch a child have a seizure and do nothing but pick up a phone?" said Patricia Smart, who has a 4-yearold with diabetes.

Following Thursday's meeting School Board Member Larry Furlong said he agrees with the parents' concerns.

"We need to get people trained to give the shots," Furlong said. "We've got to start there.

"We've got to take a look at this and get it fixed," he said. "I've sent the same message to the superintendent and the Board's attorney."

Seminole County Superintendent Paul Hagerty said Tuesday he would not comment on the matter since a complaint has been filed by parents with the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights.

However, after listening to Thursday's comments, School Board Attorney Ned Julian said he would continue looking into

the matter.
"I've listened to the comments and have taken them down," Julian said. "I assure the Board and parents the issues I've heard tonight will be communicated along the appropriate path."



healthy voter skepticism. Watching Gore this week, for example, I noted a dangerous disconnect in how he invested his a dangerous disconnect in how he invested his
California time. Like the legendary Zorro of
Spanish colonial times, his daylight hours produced a pageant of populism. With the TV cameras zooming for close-ups, he shared medical worries in Sepulveda and rallied for higher minimum wages in Sunnyvale.

By night, our gay caballero carves a different message. At a Beverly Hills dinner that raised 34 million, Joe Lieberman told folks not to worry about those FTC probes of dirty advertising to kids. He and Gore were just going to "nudge" them a little.

At daybreak Tuesday, Gore was back to his populist line, railing at a community center against companies who market patients' medical records. He told of a young woman who bought a take-home pregnancy test only to confront, just days later, a sample case of baby formula plopped on her front porch for all the neighbors to see.

"That is why I'm running for president."

Gore called for "tough penalties" on those e-merchants who exploit a person's most intimate health concerns. "That ought to be against the law." That evening, among the hi-tech barons of Atherton, Gore may have forgotten his daytime call to arms. Crediting his well-heeled audience with being "public-spirited" enough to forgo Bush's tax cuts for the rich, he said nothing about exploitive e-traders.

Bush faces a different day-and-night danger. Like Bill Clinton he now "triangulates" between Gore on the left and the Newt Gingrichtrained brigades of the right who still control Congress. "I do not believe government is the enemy, but I do not believe it is always the answer.

But who will be the young Bush's allies once in office? Those mainstream types who cast the decisive votes this November 7, or those hard ideologues who call the shots on Capitol Hill and on Supreme Court appointments?

Who will be Gore's true friends? Those who cheer his and Joe Lieberman's assault on Hollywood violence by day, or the paying guest at their Beverly Hills fund-raiser who made a profane joke of Christianity while Al and Joe sat without objection? "Like Bush, I too



They may live in a tree for a year or hold candle-light vigils where ever some particularly loathsome murderer is executed, or try to block access to public buildings where serious meetbuildings where serious meet-ings are being held, but under the skin their aims are identi-cal: to disrupt and befoul what they have no chance of controlling.



Hamilton Happenings

Hamilton Elementary is a "Cluster Magnet School for Communications through Advanced Technology"; therefore, we emphasize the use of technology in teaching and in learning. Technology is very simply a toul, which allows us to explore and communicate; it is not an end unto itself. Hamilton strives to create an environment where students are motivated to communicate and are taught how to communicate and are taught how to communicate through technology.

Every classroom at Hamilton is equipped with at least five computers, including a Gateway presentation system. While most of the computers are used for student projects, research and skill practice, the Gateway is used for teacher and student presentations. All computers are connected to the Internet and to the school network. In addition to computers, each classroom also has a state-ofthe art digital camera and camcorder. Students are taught how to operate this equipment, as well as how to create meaningful documents and presentations. While much of this instruction and practice occurs in the "homeroom" or regular classroom, students also learn technology skills through their technology class during Specials. (During Specials, stu-dents rotate on a weekly schedule through environmental science, life skills, music, physical educa-tion, and technology/media.)

Sometimes during the technology Specials class the students are working on the 25 computers

(fully linked to the school network and to the Internet). Mrs. Robin Jonas, the technology Specials teacher, teaches the students the parts of the computer, computer and Internet etiquette, how to conduct research, and how to use various software programs (for example, Kid Pix, PowerPoint, and Publisher). Students write stories and reports with illustrations created with paint programs, imported from Internet sites, and/or inserted from their own digital camera shots.

At other times, during Specials and even during the homeroom class, the students are in the Techno-Plaza, an "investigation station" for hands-on learning about everything from weather to machines. (A weather station is perched on top of Hamilton's noftop and records wind direction and force, temperature, rainfall, etc.) Students make and test hypotheses using the Scientific Method. Recently, fifth graders created simple machines.

Another way Hamilton uses technology in instruction is with its CCC (Computer Curriculum Corporation) instruction. All

classes, first through fifth, have scheduled times in the CCC lab, and there are CCC computers in every third, fourth and lifth grade classroom. Through CCC, students are able to work at their own levels and improve specific academic skills. The goal is for every student to demonstrate one year's growth in either math or reading, but many students gain as much as two years' growth. Mr. Buck Whigham, former fourth grade teacher, is the CCC lab teacher. His day is extremely busy with classes rotating in and out of his lab every 25 minutes. He works one on one with students to help them understand the concepts being taught and reviewed on the CCC program. He also works to develop motivational incentives for each student to encourage 100% effort. The reports that track a student's progress are among the critical aspects of the CCC program. Mr. Whigham generates at least one report for every class each week. By using these reports, teachers can determine which students need extra help on specific skills. Then through the use of review sheets (generated by the CCC

program), individualized instruction, and extra practice, the students can progress at their optimal rates.

Four or five laptops with the CCC software installed are available to our Hamilton families. We will continue this year to encourage our families to take advantage of this wonderful opportunity provided by Seminole County's Title One Program


Title One Program. Another area of technology dear to our students' hearts is the WHAM television studio. With state-of-the-art equipment, Hamilton produces a live news show everyday except Wednesdays. Students serve as directors, camera operators, lighting and sound specialists, meteorologists, and anchors. These are highly sought-after positions, and students apply for and then rotate through the jobs. Students also write daily scripts for the news anchors and meteorologists. According to fifth grader, Mitchell Ruth, "I love learning about technology. I hope to grow up and work on a television show on the audio mixer." Mitchell's mother, Mrs. Patti Ruth, adds, "He loves coming to school. I used to bug

him about getting involved in television production at his old school, but here he really enjoys working behind the scenes. He is doing what his sister is doing in middle school."






