Identifying the particular person holding it but also as a perpetual reference book, as each employer writes in the book his experience with the servant, stating whether services were satisfactory, whether honest, reason for leaving and any other information pertinent to employee's character or ability that would guide future employers.

Before a domestic is referred to a job, her references are carefully checked and none is sent out whose character is doubtful, who appears unsteady, or envious for the place. All of this is done to the end that those employers who avail themselves of the service will obtain a satisfactory employee. Anyone needing such a servant may phone Mrs. Rawlin at 778.

The National Re-employment

Service discourages migration of labor. The problem of transient labor is met with the regulation of first preference on any work opportunity being given bona-fide residents. There are approximately 2,016 persons registered as seeking employment through the local office. Their qualifications cover practically every classification of work that might be done in Seminole County and with an active application list of this nature, help, either skilled or unskilled, can be furnished for any job on short notice.

No step is more important, according to Mr. Dodge, than that of assisting men and women to find permanent employment and anything that facilitates the joining up of an unemployed person with private employment naturally tends to lessen the necessity for public relief.

The aim and purpose of the National Re-employment office, Mr. Dodge stated, is the placing of unemployed men and women in private employment and the employees of Seminole County are urged to make full and free use of its services.

up for industry. They look on such insurance as a duty on industry. It was not learned, however, whether such a step was contemplated in the supplanting of the NRA.

Johnson has been in New York for several days, consulting with various persons on the change. It was emphasized that he has taken the lead in the reformation. Persons close to the recovery administrator said he has drawn on his own experiences in industry for some phases of the proposed supplanting and also has used ideas advanced in the past by others.

This was taken to mean that Johnson has been in consultation with Gerard Swope, president of the General Electric company, who three years ago advanced a program for stabilization of industry through stabilizing employment and co-ordinating production, all under self-government.

It was held certain that any final plan, under which the government would turn over to industry the right to price itself, would contain some form of a guarantee continuing the NRA collective bargaining powers.
