Last year, in a similar report on retail trade increases, Sanford was shown as making the smallest percentage of gain of any county in Central Florida. The average in\_ crease in retail trade was 80 per cent, the increase in Sanford was 18 per cent. Other cities in Central Florida increased their retail trade from 80 to 167 per cent.


