## Word "Dummy" Is Stricken From Bridge Parlance

**PENALTY CARD OF A DEFENDER** If during the play a defender improperly exposes a card, such card becomes a penalty card. A penalty card must be shown face up on the table until played, and whenever it is the turn of the defender who owns it to play he must play it, unless the play of the penalty card would constitute a revoke.

The law involves a slight change in that heretofore the owner of a penalty card was not required to play it at the first opportunity. Instead, the card remained face up to be called by declarer, unless in the meantime, the owner had a chance to play it. In the new law the new law will make no difference, since the owner of a card has always faced it. The play of the exposed card if it was to his advantage to do so. If he failed to call it the owner would be obliged to play it unless he could show the danger of being forced to play it later under a superior hand.

**INSPECTING A QUITTED TRICK:** If a quit-trick is taken at the end of the hand, its opponents may inspect it in the premium story.

## Florida's Beaches Held As Disappearing

GAINESVILLE, Mar. 25.—Declaring that "in the course of 10 years some of our best beaches will probably be gone forever," and raising the question of "What will happen in Florida if we permit the elements to take away our Jacksonville, Daytona, Palm Beach and Miami beaches?" Prof. W. W. Fluorin, College of Engineering, University of Florida, says the violation of the law is a serious problem, particularly along the East Coast.

Professor Fluorin who is also secretary of the Florida Engineering Society, declared that Florida's beaches and dunes are washing away gradually at the rate of two to three feet per year.

DETROIT, Mar. 24. — Mrs. Anna Hauptmann began a search through police and welfare home records Thursday in an effort to corroborate an unsigned letter which declared Bruno Richard Hauptmann was not guilty of the kidnaping of Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr., and described a "plot" to return the baby to Detroit.

### Showdown Near In Ohio Relief Row

New Jersey officials who examined the letter, received by New York newspaper man, covered the Hauptmann trial and were inclined to believe that Lindbergh was not guilty of the kidnaping.

At Trenton, New Jersey, Fredrick A. Fox, president of the New York newspaper man, received a letter from Hauptmann which contained a copy of the Lindbergh letter, which he regarded as highly important.

Mrs. Hauptmann came to Detroit by plane Wednesday to meet a group of business men for funds for the death sentence. The first meeting was held at the Hotel Windsor, and in the afternoon Mrs. Hauptmann was in the city.

The search started first in the letter said told officials who found that his name was on a list of children who were abandoned.

A check of records of abandoned children showed that "Johnny" was found in a Cadillac sedan at the residence of the Lindberghs on the morning of the kidnaping.
