

Cocoa To Meet Leesburg In Deland Tomorrow At 3:30 In Deciding Game Of Year

The Cocoa Indians will meet the Leesburg Islanders at Conrad Field in Deland tomorrow afternoon at 3:30 o'clock to decide the championship of the second half of the Central Florida Baseball League season.

This decision was reached at Cocoa this morning where a reluctant board of directors, feeling that they deserved the championship by forfeit when Leesburg refused to play yesterday afternoon, bowed to League President Francis Whitehair's appeal that the championship be decided on the field of play, and at Deland to-morrow.

The game is being played in Deland by agreement between the two managers, and either Kenneth Douglass and Ernest Lopez of Deland will umpire, also by agreement, or two other umpires will be secured for this all important contest.

It is believed that the management of the Deland club made a decision at a special meeting in President Whitehair's office last night which had a direct bearing on the Cocoa decision today.

In reply to the statement that Deland had been leaning toward Leesburg all year, Bill Page, president of the Deland club told Manager John Culbreth of Cocoa that if Cocoa did not play Leesburg tomorrow, Deland would not play Leesburg or any other club the Deland club would be disbanded, and he would personally stand a several hundred dollar loss.

In addition, President Whitehair, believing that the fans of central Florida want to see the two teams meet and decide the issue fairly and not under a cloud, has personally guaranteed the Cocoa club \$150 to play tomorrow.

Under league rules, the two teams are to split the net gate receipts of the deciding game of this special series.

Attempting to effect an equitable settlement of the unfortunate outcome of the all important deciding game which was to have been played here yesterday, President Whitehair last night ruled that Cocoa should play Leesburg in Deland at 3:30 o'clock tomorrow.

"I realize that in making this decision I am probably going to be criticized by many people," he stated, "but I am willing to bear that in the interests of the baseball fans who I sincerely believe want to see this game played. The ruling is a costly one for Deland because it will miss out on the gate receipts of the first post-season game, scheduled to have been played in Deland tomorrow. However, I appear to you men to agree to this plan."

It developed last night that the difficulty at Sanford where the Leesburg team withdrew from the field a few minutes after its manager had agreed upon Umpires Chapman and Lopez had its basis in a misunderstanding relating to the umpire assignment for the game which might have decided the winner of the second half.

The Leesburg club had understood, following an agreement with Cocoa Thursday afternoon, that Umpires Douglass and Lopez would be assigned to the Sanford game.

However, Umpire Douglass was not available and Leesburg tried, to Sanford unadvised. Leesburg had positively stated that it would not play if certain umpires were permitted to officiate.

The Cocoa team, upon being advised before game time as to the situation, agreed to the use of any umpires and an agreement was reached in which Manager Emil Yde of Leesburg okayed the selection of one Sanford man to team with Lopez.

However, before play could be given Yde was ordered by Harry Herlong of Leesburg, said to be the financial backer of the Leesburg club, not to take the field under any condition if a Sanford man officiated. The order was carried out and the team left the field as the season's largest crowd milled around wondering what had happened.

Mr. Herlong, after being advised as to the situation as it related to Umpire Douglass who had refused to come to Sanford for the game, changed his decision after about an hour of debate but by the time he had reached Yde and told him to use his own judgment, the Leesburg players had dressed and Yde considered it advisable to tell them back.

Meanwhile, the crowd began fil-
