Industry Must Provide Work, Says Roosevelt

President's Message Business Given Dedication Older Dam Today

UNDER CITY, Nev., (AP)—On the site of the Hoover Dam, built here in 1933, President Roosevelt today urged private industry to take over more of the financing of jobs for the unemployed. In his message to Congress, the president said that the huge power plant and irrigation dam on the turbulent Colorado River should be considered as an example of the kind of work that federal projects should do. "Through such work," he said, "it is a fact that government is already beginning to show signs of its effective spending, that the people are working for the good, that other people through private employment that in two years and more have come to the point where private industry must bear the responsibility of the processes of government moving forward with speed."

Responsibility With Children

Cut In Deficit Is Forecast By The President

Roosevelt Says There Will Be No New Tax If Processing Levy Revenues Are Kept

WASHINGTON, Sept. 29.—(AP)—Improved economic conditions have led to the government's financial position that there will be no new taxes and a deep cut will be made in the deficit for the fiscal year, President Roosevelt told the press of the nation last night. He said he was confident that the government's present program of spending and the bill now being prepared with a view to sharply decreasing the deficit would result in a surplus.

Florida Dirt Farming Made Big Gain In Last Five Years, Census Reports

Dirt farming in Florida has increased during the last five years, according to the Bureau of Census of the United States Department of Commerce in a report released yesterday. The report shows that the number of dirt farms in Florida increased from 1,021,789 in 1929 to 1,212,789 in 1934. The report also shows that the value of dirt farming products in Florida increased from \$17,322,000 in 1929 to \$27,322,000 in 1934.

Umpire Dick Williams of DeLand, who was slated to be a first base umpire, announced last night that he had resigned for the season.

All series games will be held at 2:30 o'clock and a feature of the morning's game will be the presentation by League President Francis P. McKeown of the DeLand trophy to the winner of DeLand as the league champion.

President McKeown will toss out the first ball. The season's opening game will be held at 2:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at Central Field in DeLand. The game will be broadcast on radio by WFLA.

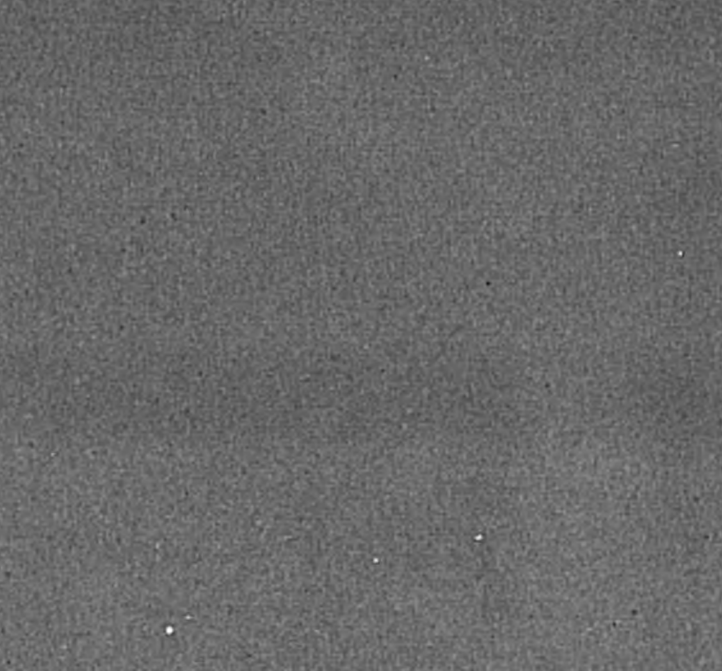
