



#### Iranians Demand Apology, Money In Hostage Crisis

By United Press International
Militant Iranians holding the American hostages said today they will not release their captives unless the United States apologizes and returns the wealth of the shah. They also denounced Iranian "moderates"

who oppose the holding of the Americans. The militants accused President Abolhassan Bani-Sadr of lacking the "courage" to fight the United States and Iran's socalled "hanging judge" also joined the growing criticism of Bani-Sadr.

Kumwait Radio quoted Radio Tehran as reporting the militants who seized the Americans Nov. 4 said they will not release them before the U.S. returns the wealth of the late shah and apologizes for its past "behavior" and intervention in Iran's domestic af-

#### Clark Cites Attitude Shift

NEW YORK (UPI) - Former Attorney General Ramsey Clark, who was threatened with prison and denounced as a traitor for traveling to Iran for an anti-American conference, says Americans gradually are beginning to realize the extent of the "crimes" the shah committed against that country.

Clark said he has detected the shift in American attitudes since he returned from Iran in mid-June. "Overwhelmingly, the concern has been for the hostages. But increasingly people are questioning what's caused this outburst on the part of the Iranians. There's been a much greater level of awareness of the crimes of the shah and this country's role in supporting that," said Clark, who has been speaking to liberal groups and appearing on television talk shows to discuss his visit to Iran.

#### Court: God Not A Person

VANCOUVER, British Columbia (UPI) - God is not a person and a prayer is not a private conversation between two parties, a Canadian appeals court says. The British Columbia Court of Appeals ruled Wednesday a man who was heard by a policeman to say "Oh, God, let me get away with it just this once," must stand trial again for inciting arson. The ruling reversed a lower court decision which aquitted the man on the grounds of prayer being inadmissible

In its 2-1 majority decision, the province's court of God is not a person, defined in the law as "a human being having rights or duties recognized by law."





Thus it may spell the end of the stormy political career of this conservative, but controversial public figure.



## Small Pox Inoculation Outdated?

ATLANTA (UPI) - The national Center for Disease Control, which normally promotes immunization against disease, is trying to stop one type of vaccination — the inoculation

for smallpox. The last natural case of smallpox occurred disease eliminated from the world. Still, smallpox vaccinations continue to be given

Dr. Jason Weisfeld, the CDC physician who treated and cured Ali Maow Maalin, a hospital cook in Merku, Somalia, the world's last case of endemic smallpox, says seven countries insist on smallpox vaccination proof, down from 12 in April. They are Benin, Chad, Kampuchea (Cambodia), Djibouti, Lesotho, Madagascar and Mali. "In five of those countries - Benin

Djibouti, Lesotho, Madagascar and Mali administrative problems probably are the reason smallpox vaccingtion requirements a other two - Kampuchea and Chad -Weisfeld said civil unrest makes it impossible to predict when the smallpox vaccination will no longer be required.

"We really don't expect any change in policies in those two countries," he said. Although the smallpox vaccine was extremely effective in eradicating the disease, the immunization shot can produce adverse side effects. For this reason WHO and CDC are seeking to halt its use in all but laboratory

"The risk does outweight the benefit," he said, "and the Advisory Committee on Immustatement on smallpox vaccination," The commission helps set national policy on

physicians to issue a letter of contraindication (the vaccine should not be given) to persons traveling to countries where the smallpox

He said there have been widespread reports of dermatologists and general practitioners using the smallpox vaccine to treat other disease, principally skin ailments caused by

The CDC is trying to stop this practice. Weisfeld said the vaccine is not licensed for any medical treatment.

The smallpox program of the CDC and WHO will continue for at least the next five years, carrying out a variety of tasks, one of Weisfeld said monkeypox is similar to smallpox and 48 cases of the disease in humans have been detected in Africa since 1970. But he said monkeypox "does not

drive back and forth from work every day. The drive, about six miles from our Northern; Virginia neighborhood to downtown; Washington, takes about 20 minutes and costs: about half the \$2 daily that commuting by bus and subway takes. The bus-subway combination normally consumes 42 minutes. Our car pool started pretty much by accident 42 years ago, when we kept meeting day after day at the bus stop. One day Ellen or Melinda — I can't recall which — suggested organizing a car pool. It didn't take long. Admittedly, we have two special advanages. We drive in a bus lane to which only cars with four or more riders are admitted, and we travel slightly after peak-hours, both morning and evening.

We park in a downtown garage that no one of us could afford, but which five of us can afford easily. All our offices are within a hree-block radius of the garage. We coordinate our comings and goings so that if one or two of us aren't coming home one evening, we can dig up another rider. We have a complete

of semi-regulars who are delighted to fill in. We split costs, and if one of the car poolers is unable to drive, that person reinburses the person who does the extra driving. My colleagues occasionally comment on "your four ladies," but my wife, who holds down a! full-time job nearer our home, thinks the arrangement is great. It's enabled us to do with one subcompact car.

Robert Redmond, a planner in the Department of Transportation's ride-sharing branch, says my car pool is "working just the way it's supposed to." He also says: -20 percent of the nation's work force that goes to work in cars "uses some form of riding sharing." Actually, the proportion probably is higher now because that figure's based on a 1975 Census Bureau Survey. But more than 50 million commuters drive alone. -There are at least 150 local or state wide

programs aimed at promoting ride sharing, and DOT funds are available to organize these programs. Over the last six years DOT has spent \$75 million for this purpose, \$41.5; -A van pool of eight to 15 persons tends to

be more efficient if the distance you travel to work is more than 12 to 15 miles. But that means acquiring a van. # The Struggle Is Over For Stone

OAKLAND - For a guy who's prided himself on being able to get by with his brain, Steve Stone took an inordinately long time learning how to become a winning pitcher. The ability was always there, tracing back to 1971 when he first came up to the major leagues with the San Francisco Giants. He could hum the ball; he could generally put it where

But he struggled along for nine seasons, shuffling between the White Sox and the Cubs for six years and losing as often as

In fact, when he finished last season with the Baltimore Orioles, with whom he had signed as a free agent, his major league tally showed 78 wins, 79 losses. Hardly the stuff that makes a Cy Young Award candidate.

But look at him now. Stone has been the outstanding pitcher in the major leagues this summer, passing the 20-win mark earlier than any flinger in modern Oriole history (previously, he had never won more than 15 games in one season). At the advanced pitching age of 33, he has sampled his first

The reason? If you listen to Earl Weaver, the feisty, crusty manager of the Orioles, it's because it simply took Steve this long to discover the curve ball was the best delivery in his pitching

"He throws the curve ball now when he gets behind on a hitter," analyzes Weaver. "He's not using as many changeups as he used to. He'll rarely throw his fork ball, maybe a couple of times a game. He used to throw too many different types of pitches. Now he'll throw as many as 70 curves a game." As a kid, stocky Steve used to try to wing the ball by hitters with a 95 mph fast ball. Now he has an 85 mph fast ball — about average for the AL - And spotting it judiciously, mixing it around his curve, he has become a confident, commanding

Steve offers a different reason for his success. "I'm with a team that enables me to win," he claims. "If you come down to seventh and eighth inning, they're not going to blow it. There is also a mature approach and natural intensity to his work that jelled at the right time. "The truth is," he says, "I go through extensive mental preparation before I pitch. I could always throw. The mental and the physical came together at

Then why did it take so long for the distinguished scholar from Kent State University to find the proper mix? "Einstein didn't develop his theory of relativity overnight,

Steve is one of the more worthwhile people to talk to in sport not noted for its cerebral conversationalists. He loguacious and curious, and his interests extend beyond the confines of a baseball field.

Stone is a gourmet and a wine connoisseur (and is in the process of opening a fine eating establiahment in Scottsdale, Ariz.) He still lives in Chicago between seasons, in a 46-th-floor apartment. He wanted to put in a wine cellar, he says archly, but the guy on the 45th floor complained.

"Then," he remembers, "I lost a tough game to the Mets, and (manager) Charlie Fox told me, 'From now on you no longer call the pitches.' Well, the catcher we had then was no mental giant. I went from 4-2 to 5-9." A year later, Stone was dealt to the White Sox, and he began

his long streak of mediocrity as a pitcher.

In 1976, with the Cubs, his career was imperilled when he tore the rotator cuff in his right shoulder, a grave injury for a man who makes his living lifting a ball over his head and then whipping it forward 90 feet. Other pitchers have come from similar damage, after surgical repair - among them Wayne Carland of the Cleveland Indians and Doug Rau of the Los Angeles Dodgers - but have never been quite the same. Stone refused to submit to surgery and recovered full motion in his arm to win 15 games for the White Sox the next summer. When Stone went the free agent route after '78, the Orioles

signed him to a four-year contract worth \$800,000 - a rather startling investment considering the results to that point. "We had reason," says skipper Weaver of the Orioles knowingly, "for giving him a good amount of money." The reason shows up when Weaver hands him the ball every

"I got a letter from a fan earlier in the season," said Weaver, who was ejected in the second inning and responded by burying home plate under a mound of dirt. "He suggested that I hit the pitcher in the second spot. That


