NATIONAL REPORT: Rescue teams today searched for the last of three young children swept up in swirling floodwaters in eastern Arizona. Two of the three, all from the same family, were found drowned. A flash-flood warning was issued for Idaho's Ada County, the most populous area in the state, following a downpour of more than 2 inches of rain in less than two hours late Wednesday, flooding streets and canals in Boise. No injuries were reported. Streets were flooded in Roosevelt and Vernal in northeastern Utah during heavy thunderstorms, but no damage was reported. Nine cities in the Deep South has record heat. Meridian, Miss., hit a record 101, its fourth consecutive day of temperatures at or above 100 degrees.

Police say Norma Jean Hennigan, 39, of 702 Wildfire Drive, Casselberry, died at 6:45 p.m. Tuesday when she was struck in the right side with a load of 00 buckshot.

Her husband, Tom, 36, a three-year veteran of the Oviedo police force, told police he was loading a 12-gauge double-barrel break shotgun when he caught the skin between his index finger and thumb in the breach.

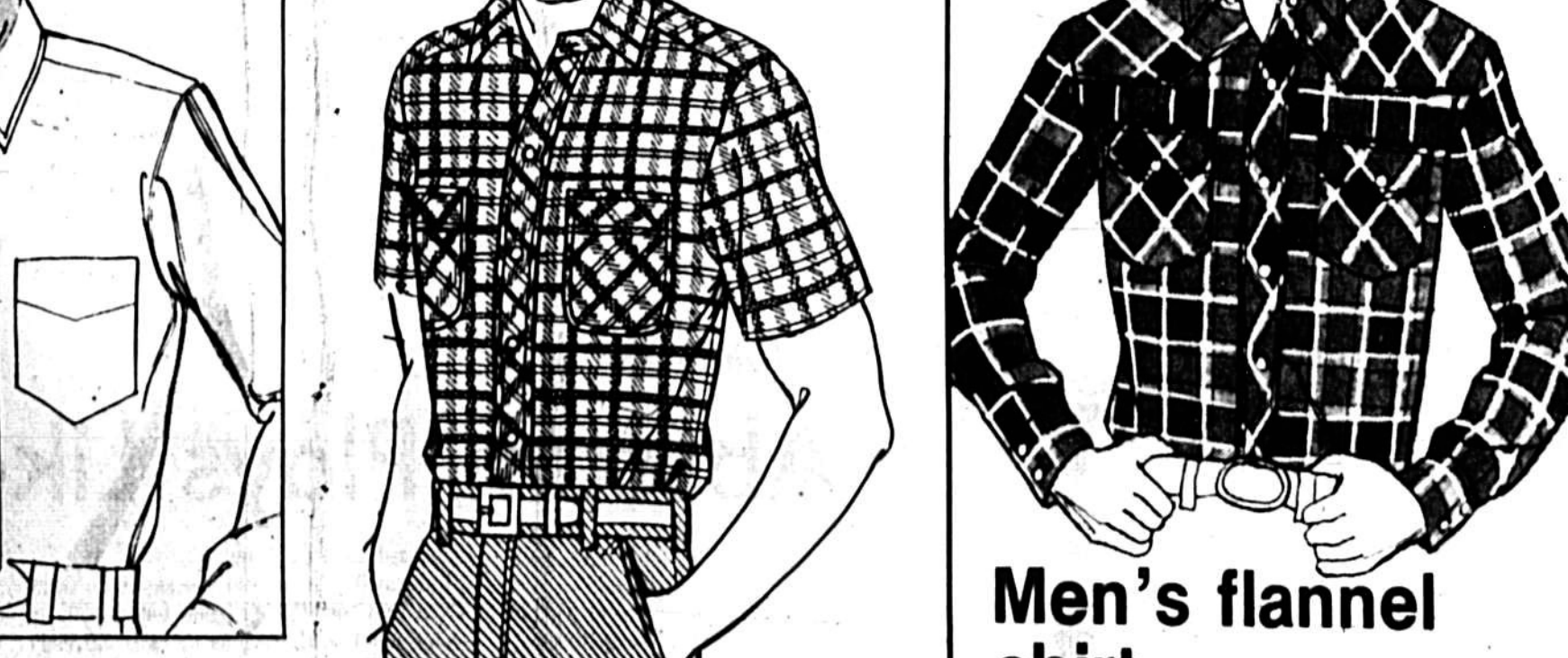
