

Severely Pressed Fletcher Five Ekes Out Victory Over Fed Cagers

"We gave them a real ball game. The boys played one of their best games, fighting all the way." Coach L. L. (Whitey) McLucas said this morning following the Northeast Conference Tournament engagement with the top-seeded Fletcher five of Jacksonville in which the Senators barely eked a 25 to 22 decision over the Feds last night in Daytona.

Jack "Butterball" Herring got two of his forward post and ratcheted up 12 points to lead the Gators, who never were more than three points behind the fast Jack Jacksonville team. Behind 11 to 8 at the half, the Feds turned on the heat and pulled up into a 22-22 deadlock with their opponents shortly before the game ended. However, Sanford had a technical foul called, and Forward Huff of Fletcher, who sank six of seven free throws, dropped the bill through the hoop for the margin of victory.

Coch McLucas predicted the team that wins the tournament will have to beat the speedy Leon five of Tallahassee.

The other first round games, second seeded Daytona Beach, with Ted Pollitz shooting 13 points, downed Columbia of Lake City, 49-30, in tilt which saw 41 personal fouls called; Palatka shaded Ketterlinus of St. Augustine, 33-30, and fourth seeded Leon of Tallahassee turned back Eustis, 35-20.

In defeating Eustis, Leon avenged the defeat it suffered at the hands of the Panthers in the finals of the 1941 tournament. W. Lamb of Eustis led both teams with 11 points. Wooley and Stoutamire paced the Lions with

Tokyo Discloses Attack By U. S. On Wake Isle Invaders

(By Associated Press)
Tokyo disclosed an attack on Wake Island by a naval squadron, presumably American. The Japanese said the raid occurred Feb. 24, and claimed damage to one cruiser, a destroyer and the destruction of five planes.

Speaking in the Batan peninsula, a daubed patrol skirrilled the War Department announced today, reporting that General Douglas MacArthur's little Army had retained the positions wrested from the Japanese in this week's surprise advance. The communiqué said the invaders still held their main battle positions, the American and Filipino advance having stalled back only the forward lines of the enemy.

Reinforced Filipinos were reported massing for a new assault on Rangoon. The British say the situation is serious. The loss of 2,000 men in an effort to take the British stronghold, it was revealed, the greatest advance made by Gen. MacArthur's forces was on the key highway junction at Pilar, on the east coast of Batan, 17 miles north of Corregidor Fortress.

Reference to Pilar was the first specific mention of positions in weeks. It emphasized the startling fact that the Japanese, despite their tremendous superiority in numbers, gained only 12 miles in six weeks of fighting.

35 Crew Members Missing As 10,227-Ton Vessel Sinks

(By Associated Press)
The tanker W. D. Anderson was torpedoed by an enemy submarine. The Navy announced yesterday and only one survivor from a crew of 35 reached safety on shore, ending near San Francisco.

The lone survivor was a wiper, Frank Leonardi Terry, 23, Lane Corp., Pa.

When his ship was torpedoed, he jumped into the water, escaped spilling oil fire, but could not swim more than 10 feet and had to remain float another hour before he was rescued. He thought that any of his companions had capsized.

The Anderson was a 10,227-ton tanker. Others torpedoed were identified by the Coast Guard Service. Empire of New York, the Republic of Houston, and the Pan Massachusetts, of New York, whose survivors went to port at Jacksonville.

Thus the score on seas of four tankers whose survivors were brought to California ports within a week stood like this:

W. D. Anderson, 35 dead, one survived.

Cities Service Empire, 11 dead, 29 survived.

Republic, five dead, 24 survivors.

Pan Massachusetts, five dead, 14 survived.

Japanese Attack Christmas Island In Indian Ocean

Brisk Patrol Action Is Reported Along Fronts In Burma; British Lines Hold

(By Associated Press) The Japanese launched their first attack on Christmas Island in the Indian Ocean, it was reported today.

The British reported brisk patrol activity along the Sittang River front in Burma, today indicating the decided lines are holding firm. In some sections of the 100-mile battle zone,

The All-India radio broadcast: "Rangoon army and air communiques announcing intensified enemy activity along the tottering front west of the Sittang River, indicating that the shattering blows struck by American volunteer and Imperial airmen had sharply reduced Japanese aerial bombardment."

On every hand in London the flight of the British Empire defenders of Rangoon was reported. Many officers, even it appeared unlikely that most of the men waging the last stand would be able to escape from southern Burma.

Latest reports to London reflect a massive hull downing the western areas as the Japanese rushed up reinforcements and the Imperialists dug in behind the Sittang River for staunch defense of the capital.

A dispatch said the Japanese had mustered a powerful fifth column in Burma, some of the armed Burmese forces even marching in with the Japanese, multiplying the difficulties of the imperial defense forces.

An American-Philippines guerrilla force, operating from a mountain station in northern Laos, has joined and driven Japanese out of a section of the War Department and Bradley Bridge, while another column descended the military value of the mountains as of little consequence, they did participate that day in the invasion, carrying on by natives and troops outside Bataan peninsula where General MacArthur's main army is making its stand.

The same communiques announced this action carried a pronouncement of President Manuel L. Quezon to his people assuring them "we are still qualified" remained unanswered.

This spirit, manifested in the northern Luzon action and in Quezon's proclamation, had been noted in previous Philippine communiques. In one, Gen. MacArthur, who had established resistance to the invaders, was growing in intensity, reported the formation of a secret society of fighters for freedom and said that many native informants for the enemy had disappeared in mysterious fashion.

Brilliant reports of the guerrilla operations in the mountains in the Abra valley, extending from the towns of Corcuera to Banquet, a distance of more than 100 miles. This is about 150 miles north of the Bataan front and not far from where the Japanese made one of their initial landings.

The Bataan front itself continued quiet, as much as the War Department commented: "A period of positional warfare seems indicated." Gen. MacArthur's troops held in the advanced positions they attained last week, to the north of Corcuera, had not moved the entire month.

Japanese paratroopers attacked Port Moresby, New Guinea, yesterday afternoon, securing some of the Australian air bases there.
