





Eye On Cuba

The republic of Venezuela holds a key to the future of Premier Fidel Castro and Communist Cuba. What Venezuela decides to do could largely determine Castro's international position in the years to come.

Venezuela is one of the world's leading producers of petroleum, a commodity that Communist Cuba needs in order to be able to

Sole supplier of oil to Cuba for the last decade has been the Soviet Union. It is estimated that Russia sends Cuba 60,000 barrels daily to keep the island's economy functioning. This requires a major effort on the part of Russia, whose Baku oilfields are a third of the world

Castro has long coveted Venezuelan oil which is less than a thousand miles away. Castro knows that if he can obtain oil from Venezuela his dependence on the Soviet Union would be lessened. On at least one occasion, Moscow has curtailed fuel shipments to Cuba in order to force Castro to bow to its edicts

The potential strategic importance of Venezuela to Cuba was pointed out a decade ago. in a speech made in 1963 by a top Cuban Communist, Blas Roca. "When the people of Venezuela achieve victory, when they gain full independence from imperialism, when they become the owners of their fabulous wealth . when they entirely rule their country, then all America will be inflamed . . . all America will be freed once and for all from the ominous yoke of Yankee imperialism . . .," said Roca, 64 now and active in party affairs for over four decades. "Then we shall no longer be a solitary island in the Caribbean confronting the Yankee im-

perialists, but rather we shall have a land of

support on the mainland."

Virtually synonymous with Ireland is the name of Eamon de Valera, scholar, patriot and elder statesman, who has stepped down as president of the country he helped to nationhood. His 50-year career was controversial, particularly during Ireland's neutrality during World War II, yet his stature was larger than any single issue and his country grew with it.

He was truly a man in the tradition of the fierce and independent breed who nevertheless seek unity and peace for a country. If Mr. De Valera did not achieve all of his aspirations in bringing north and south together, he leaves both Irelands his example of selfless and dedicated striving toward worthy ideals.



domination of a market by a single buyer, has become just as distasteful a word. But this time it's the aerospace and defense industries, not the Justice Department, which want to get rid of the system which fosters monopsony.

The Aerospace Industries Association, which represents major producers of the nation's aircraft, spacecraft, missiles and rockets, has called on Congress to establish a board to monitor and limit government's nonopsony power just as the Justice Department's Antitrust Division controls the use of industry's monopoly power.

The AIA's suggestion was based on a study by the Orkand Corp. exploring the monopsonistic character of the government as a buyer of goods The study, commissioned by

AIA, warns that the problems created by a single customer no longer are restricted to defense and aerospace suppliers. Other government agencies besides the Pentagon and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration are assuming increasingly active roles in such areas as mass transit, points out

Consider 3 M.P.H. Speed Limits Copley News Service

Gordon Bradford says he has a plan that will stop traffic Bradford, vice president for corporate development at American Safety Equipment Corp. in Encino, Calif., says if a mandatory speed limit of three miles per hour were enforced strictly, traffic fatalities would be wiped out. "That's walking speed," he says, "and I have never heard of any walker being killed when he crashed into another

Bradford estimates that speed costs the United States 50,000 deaths and 5 million injuries a year. While the three m.p.h. speed limit might not be too practical in today's fast-moving society, Bradford feels lawmakers can do something to cut down on the tremendous

number of fatalities and injuries on the nation's highways What Bradford is pushing for more than anything are laws that demand the use of seat belts.

Bills now are pending in several state legislatures that will do just that. It looks as if it will be either Wisconsin, where the governor is pushing for the legislation, or New York, where it has passed the lower house and is now in the state Senate, where the law will pass first.

Bradford would like to see the United States in the same situation as Australia and New Zealand, countries which

have passed mandatory seat belt use laws. He says surveys ran three months before the mandatory laws went into effect and another survey the day before showed only 25 per cent of the drivers using belts. However, the day after the law went into effect more than 85 per cent of the drivers were buckling up. After more than two years in the state of Victoria (Melbourne) and nearly 18 months in New South Wales (Sydney), about 70 per cent of the drivers are using their seat belts.

More important, however, is the cut down in deaths and injuries. Statistics show that in those two states, automobile driver and passenger deaths have been cut by 20 per cent and injuries are down even more.

"The economic loss to the country because of traffic accidents is estimated at between \$17 and \$36 billion a year, depending on how much you value life," Bradford says. "Therefore, this has to be considered a public disaster. "Where there's a public disaster, the government has the

Tourists everywhere also like to sample the native food. If the tourist you meet has a yellow skin and


parlor. But if he says "I gotta cousin in Brooklyn - I spikka da English hokay," take him to a good Chinese

EDITORIAL Presidents flop By DON OAKLEY

Shortly before the Watergate revelations cast doubt on whether he would serve out his constitutionally and electorally alloted "four more years," President Nixon suggested to Congress that it might favorably consider an amendment limiting future presidents to a single term of six years. There is at least one group still actively campaigning for repeal of the 22nd Amendment, which limits a president to two four-year terms (or one term if he served more than

two years of the term of some other person who had been It has been charged that the 22nd Amendment was passed by a Republican Congress in 1947 as a sort of postmortem revenge on Franklin D. Roosevelt, the only man to have

been elected president more than twice.

In the light of history since then, it may not be unreasonable to suggest that FDR's successors, both Democratic and Republican, as well as the nation itself, might have been better served had Congress seen fit to limit each president to just one tour of duty - either the four years to which he was elected in his own right or, if he succeeded from the vice-presidency, to the remaining term of his predecessor.

With the exception of John F. Kennedy, who did not live to run for re-election, every president since FDR scored his greatest successes in his first term, whether it was of shorter or longer length, only to see his second term blighted in

First was Harry S. Truman, who between 1945 and 1948 presided over the conclusion of World War II, the rebuilding of Europe through the Marshall Plan and the thwarting of Communist takeover in Greece. Then came the Berlin Blockade, Russia's explosion of an atom bomb, influence peddling scandals in Washington and allegations of high-level treason, the dismal war in Korea and its accompanying inflation.

The second term of the immensely popular Dwight D. Eisenhower was pretty much four blah years, and when he retired to make way for his successor, it was after a campaign in which the Democrats hammered on the theme that the country had fallen behind in everything from missiles to space exploration to education to racial progress to econom-

Both Lyndon B. Johnson and Richard M. Nixon achieved historic accomplishments in their early presidential years, the one on the domestic front, the other in international affairs. The woes that later befell both are too fresh in memory to need recapitulation.

The really interesting thing is that Truman, Eisenhower, Johnson and Nixon were all either elected or re-elected by impressive margins and that, in fact, the greater their electoral victories, the more precipitious their subsequent fall from popularity and effectiveness.

'Alice' Ends Drought Before Death Song

MIAMI (AP) - The life of Hurricane Alice, the first tropical storm of the year, was expected to end in the open Atlantic today after a friendly flirtation with Bermuda. Forecasters at the National Hurricane Center in Miami said winds in Alice would probably drop below hurricane velocity- 75 miles per hour-as the storm churned across the North Atlantic.

Besides knocking down a few trees and forcing tourists to stay in their rooms, Alice ended a three-month drought on Bermuda by dumping two inches of rain on the British crown colony. The island depends on cisterns for its water supply. At 10:30 p.m. Wednesday, Alice was located about 200 miles north of Bermuda near latitude 35.4 north and longitude 65.0 west and was moving north at about 10 m.p.h. with winds just at 75 m.p.h.

SAIGON (AP) - South Vietnamese officials today opened sealed bids from international oil companies seeking to obtain government contracts for offshore exploration. The government declined to disclose how many companies put in bids or to identify them. Twenty-seven were invited,

but at least nine declined Informants said the companies included the Sunningdale group of Canada, American Shell, Gulf, Esso Exploration and Hunt International.

For years, government and business officials have been speculating on the possibility that an enormously rich supply of oil lies beneath South Vietnam's coastal waters.

WELLINGTON, New Zealand (AP) -- Prime Minister Norman Kirk said today that the United States and Great Britain are going to have less influence on New Zealand's

"From now on," be said, "when we have to deal with a new situation, we shall not say, 'What do the British think or what would the Americans want us to do.' Our starting point will be what do we think about it."

His remarks were in a foreword to the Foreign Ministry's annual report to Parliament. However, Kirk added that New Zealand's relations with the United States "remain of prime importance.

Tax Hikes Seen

PARIS (AP) - Tax hikes might become necessary to deal with inflation in the United States, a report issued by the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development -OECD - said today.

In its annual review of the U.S. economy, the OECD said economic policy will be put to a crucial test over the next 12 to 18 months. The big problem is expected to come from holding down demand so excess demand conditions can be avoided. The danger would come from runaway prices if demand got too high. The report said "some form of tax action may become nec-

essary, particularly if federal expenditures were to rise faster than suggested in the fiscal year 1974 federal budget presented last January.

Crippling Strike

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP) - Union officials at the huge El Teniente copper mine said striking workers may return to their jobs today or Tuesday ending the 74-day-old walkout which has crippled Chile's economy.

The strike for higher wages has cost the government more than \$60 million and has been a focal point of discontent with President Salvador Allende.

Word of a near settlement came just two days after Allende put down a rebellion by a disgruntled army unit which had tried to storm the Defense Ministry building and fired on nearby Government House. The government said that 22 persons were killed and more than 30 wounded in the three-hour

Employe Cutback

WASHINGTON (AP) - The nationwide network of offices in the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will have up to 3,000 fewer employes reporting for work this week under a cutback ordered by the Agriculture Depart-

The cutback, called a reduction-in-force by the government, is linked directly to the elimination of the Rural Environmental Assistance Program. The program, which provided assistance to farmers for carrying out approved conservation projects, was canceled last winter.

Thread Count Is Important To Purchaser

Q. Do you have any suggestions for making panty hose last

A. Some suggestions that might help you get more out of your hosiery budget include: treat hosiery carefully when putting them on and taking them off and especially when washing. Buy a less expensive brand for every day and save the more expensive brands for special occasions. Experiment with several brands so you can compare the difference in quality, price and wearability. Look for specials which are often run on hose.

Q. What does the term "pre-cooked" mean on a package of

A. "Pre-cooked" on the label identifies a rice that cooks in a very short time. The rice has actually been cooked and then dehydrated. You can cook it quickly because all you have to do is replace the moisture that was removed. The precooking process may be used with regular milled white rice, parboiled rice, or brown rice. Some brands of pre-cooked rice are prepared by simply adding boiling water, while other brands may require a short simmering time. Follow the package directions for best results.

Q. What are "meat tenderizers" made of? If they tenderize meat, won't they harm the stomach?

A. The "tenderizer" most commonly used is a natural plant enzyme called papain. Papain is obtained from the Papaya Fruit. It is generally recognized as safe for use on foods which are subsequently cooked. Papain is readily destroyed by the heat required to cook meat. In the unlikely event that some of the tenderizer were not completely destroyed by heat, it would be destroyed by the gastric juices

Q. I read an advertisement for shade trees available from a mail order nursery, and I am wondering if the firm is legitimate. Does Consumer Services have any information

A. We checked with the Division of Plant Industry and were told that there are a number of legitimate mail order nurseries in the United States, and these nurseries provide valuable information on trees and other nursery plants. However, some mail order firms have made false claims regarding growth and performance of certain plants. Sometimes the ads proclaim "amazing, descovery" or "fantastic value" when actually the plant is very ordinary. You should resist the temptation to order trees or plants that are not native or adaptable to our Florida climate even though the pictures are hard to resist. Some fly-by-night operators may create exotic names for whatever they are selling, and of course they choose something that will catch your eye and make you want to buy it. The Federal Trade Commission requires that when a product has a generally recognized and well established common name this alone may appear in the ad, or in conjunction with the correct betanical name. If the advertiser coins a new name for a product, the complete botanical name or common name must also appear in the ad. Your best assurance of quality when buying plants is to deal with local nurseries which have established reputations for satisfactory dealings. Select someone who will be in business next year if you need advice on landscaping your yard, planting a garden or growing a

Q. What is the difference between percale and muslin?

A. Price and thread count primarily. Fabrics with a thread count of 128 to 140 are muslin; thread counts of 180-200 are percale. Thread count is the number of threads in both directions in an inch of fabric. Muslin is heavier than percale, feels coarser and is woven with fewer threads per inch. Most people prefer precale because it is a finer cloth and is less coarse than muslin.

Q. I noticed the other day when I was buying sheets that not all the packages said the amount of shrinkage. Does this make a difference?

A. Yes. Most sheets on the market are blends of cotton and polyester, and therefore, shrinkage is less of a problem than it was in Grandmother's day when the sheets were 100 percent cotton. Less than one or two percent is acceptable and will not interfere with fit. Fitted sheets are usually preshrunk; look for this on the label.

The slices get good and hot through and through as well as crusty brown on top. - SUG
