Monday is Labor Day. Between this afternoon and Tuesday morning, millions of Americans, mostly working-men, will take to the nation's highways from the heat and turmoil of the cities for a day or two's respite among the cool refreshing breezes of mountain or seaside resorts.

The New York Safety Council estimates that of this number more than 400 will be killed and at least 14,000 injured in highway accidents. This does not include drownings and other accidents which will swell the total to among the highest casualties for any similar period of the

year.




