## Negotiations turn nasty Police union team tears up **By Liane Edixon** cost of living offer from city SANFORD - The Sanford Police Department's union labor team ripped up the 2 percent cost of living offer

increase have been going on for the last few months for both the Sanford Police and Fire departments.

They may have reached an impasse Tuesday after the city countered the union's latest offer of a six percent cost of living increase, with a 2 percent Increase

Labor union reps for the police

Negotiations for a cost of living department said that two percent doesn't come close to the 3.6 percent cost of living increase given by the state to law enforcement officers. The urban index is 2.9 percent and the CPI index for the Southeastern United States is a 3.9 percent increase.

In addition to that, the union gave the labor attorney evidence of the need for such a large increase to the wage

scale. By their numbers, 63 officers have left the department since the year 2000 as of June 2005. That number indicates the city of Sanford is losing approximately 11 to 12 officers a year.

Union President Sgt. Ned Golden said that although some of those officers were lost due to retirement, most left to go to other agencies

Another article the union argued was that the officers are overworked, because Sanford has the most and worst crime in the county.

For example, the Sanford Police


port an Orlando woman's claim of abduction and rape in Lake Mary, investigators have inactivated the case, which included inconsistent accounts in other incidents in Orange County and Altamonte Springs.

Lake Mary police investigated two crimes claimed by the woman.

On May 5, she reported that someone impersonating an officer had pulled her over on Interstate 4 and written down information from her driver's license. The suspect threw her license back at her when she questioned whether he was really a law enforcement officer, she told police.

Five days later, the woman said the same man

# Need for Recovery House larger than ever before

SANFORD - When counselor John Hagen brought home a few men from his work to help them with their drug and alcohol addiction when he worked at The Grove Counseling Center, he never imagined it was the start of something so big. Now, the founder and pres-

ident of Recovery House of Central Florida, Inc. has been helping adult men recover from alcohol and drug abuse for more than 15 years.

The Christian-based, 12step therapeutic community, is a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization providing a structured living environment for adult males.

They currently have 40 men in their recovery house and they say there is a heightened need in the area for more beds.

The group is fully self-supportive, with different industries defraying the costs of the day to day operations of the facility. One of those industries is a thrift store on Oak Ave and 3rd Street in downtown Sanford. They also have a mobile car wash to generate funds for the organization.


"We're looking to become more visible at this time," Hagen said. "More community friendly."

Hagen said that most of the men come from referrals by local judges, and some walk in off the streets after hearing about the house.

The men live on the main campus in Sanford and have to meet program requirements such as being at least 18 years or older, physically able to work, minimum one-year commitment, and all personal business and medical needs must be handled prior to entering the program. The men also cannot be convicted of a violent crime or sex offense, and need to disclose all legal, medical, and financial responsibilities during the interview process.

During the first 90 days, the men are in orientation. They work enclave during that 90 days, and then they can go out and get a job. The work enclave includes skilled and



kidnapped her at gunpoint in Sanford and raped her in her SUV outside the postal distribution center on Rinehart Road. Police began an investigation and even released a composite sketch of the alleged perpetrator.

From there, the investigation turned up inconsistencies in the stories and found a pattern of lies from previous incidents.

The woman's name was redacted from the Lake Mary investigation report, but the references an report Altamonte Springs case involving a Marrissa Suzan McCormick from Orlando. Orange County property records list a Sue and Robert McCormick living at same address from the Altamonte report: 1404 N. Hart Blvd., in Orlando.

"It is my conclusion and concurrence that (redacted) is not credible and that both cases were fabricated to get attention," wrote a Lake Mary sergeant when the case was inactivated in late June.

In the rape case, police found the woman's clothes outside her white Mitsubishi Montero off Rinehart Road. There was an indication that the assailant tied her up.

The woman was taken to South Seminole Hospital for a гаре ехат.

"It should be noted that after an exhaustive search of the entire area by two K9s, one of which being a blood hound, a helicopter and multiple patrol officers and detectives both on foot and vehicle all around the patrolling area, to include I-4, no person was found remotely matching the description given by the victim," wrote Lake Mary **Delective Michael Conneely** in his investigation report.

At the hospital, Conneely talked with Robert McCormick and an emergency room nurse, who said the woman had reported injuries to her left wrist and shoulder. A doctor said her injuries did not appear to be self-inflicted, but that the injury to her wrist was probably not caused by tying or binding.

told investigators the woman's left hand had been tightly bound, but her right hand seemed. The paramedic also said it appeared the woman's wrists had been tied to her ankles between her legs

A nurse who conducted the rape exam said there was no evidence of semen and that abrasions could have been caused by intercourse as far back as four or five days. The woman told the nurse she had sex with her husband three or four days before the incident.

"At no time did the nurse indicate that the examination results were consistent with a forced violent rape, Conneely wrote.

Conneely also wrote that in two interviews with the woman, her stories were "very inconsistent". She was taken to the Orange County Sheriff's Office, however, to meet with a sketch artist. Conneely also noted inconsistencies - In Robert McCormick's story.

The woman agreed to take a lie detector examination, which showed evidence of deception, according to Conneely.

"I concluded the ... interview when (redacted) became violently opposed to me confronting her on all of her inconsistencies and lack of evidence to support her claims," Connecty reported.

The investigation found that the woman had emailed relatives about being careful not to pull over for unmarked police cars, as she had reported on May 5. Conneely said the emails sounded a lot like news reports of the first incident.

Two days before the alleged rape, the woman's email included this sentence: "If he gets you out of the car he

beats and then rapes you." A relative contacted Conneely about this and said she didn't think anything happened to the woman. Detectives found out about an incident that took place at The Body Shop at the Altamonte where McCormick Mall worked in 2002. In that incident on May 9,

been beaten and robbed by a black man with a woman accomplice. According to an Altamonte Springs police report, \$500 was taken. Police set up a perimeter, but no suspects were located. No one in the mall in the area of the store saw the incident or the suspects.

Conneely said McCormick refused a lie detector test in the Altamonte Incident. McCormick's relative also told police about another incident at Seminole Towne Center that she didn't believe happened.

On May 20, Orange County deputies contacted Lake Mary police about a home invasion at the woman's home in Orlando. A child had called 911 to report that his mother was tied up in the garage. Deputies found her on a workout bench in the garage with her feet and wrists duck taped with an orange cord loosely around her.

The woman appeared to have passed out, but deputies said her face was red as if she was holding her breath. She told police it was the same guy from Lake Mary that tied her up.

A roll of duct tape was found on a shelf about 20 feet from the woman.

"In conclusion at the scene, it appeared as though the whole thing had been staged," Conneely wrote in his report. She later said she did not know what had happened in the garage because she had been hit in the head, but the hospital found no evidence of any head injury caused by blunt trauma. The son, who was 5, later admitted he had duct taped his mother's wrists and ankles.

In a subsequent interview on June 16 at the Lake Mary Police Department, the woman told police if they wanted, they could close out the case and she would be OK with that.

Conneely told The Herald that the woman could not be arrested for false information because she hasn't admitted to anything. Could she face any charges?

"Not without a confession from her, which we don't have,' Connecly said Tuesday.

unskilled labor for a variety of light construction, home improvements, and contract labor jobs. Recovery House specializes in screen rooms and pool enclosures (installation and repair), painting and handyman services, fencing installation and repair, household furniture moving, landscaping and lawn maintenance, janitorial and construction clean up, debris clean up and hauling.

After the men in the program get a job, they are responsible for paying a \$130 a week program fee, and Recovery House sets them up with a student trust to help them manage their money. Hagen said they help them

understand what it takes to manage their money, so they can become responsible when they are back on their own. Hagen said a prevalent

drug of choice for incoming men is crack cocaine, although in the younger men there is a growing addiction of methamphetamine (crystal meth).

Most men that Hagen sees are late stage chronic users. He said there is usually a family history, and they look at the addiction as an illness similar to diabetes.

People who have alcoholism, for example he said, cannot drink alcohol, it's toxic to them. Similarly, people who have diabetes can't have sugar. He said you wouldn't judge a diabetic, so in comparison, alcoholism is a disease.

The group is doing an outcome study right now, but says no matter what the outcome, the organization is

worth continuing on.

If they work with 100 men, he said, and 10 are successful, then that is a big impact. Hagen said just one impacted man can change his family history and impact more than just themselves.

**Recovery House teaches** the men accountability and family values, such as being a good father, and paying child support, if that's the situation they are in. He said they also try to give the men some type of reconciliation with their family, or their estranged wives, if that's the case.

"There's a lot of success stories in our community," Hagen said.

One example is Erik Robinson, who is the assistant to the director for Recovery House. He was in the program for 14 months.

Robinson claimed that when he walked into the Recovery House he had only flip-flops, a pair of shorts and a shirt.

"That's it," he said.

Robinson, who had an addiction to alcohol and drugs, said since being in the program he has taken care of his legal problems, got his driver's license back, got back in touch with his family and overall had a life-changing experience.

"Honestly," he said of what might have been if he hadn't gone to the Recovery House. "I'd be headed toward near dead or dead."

Hagen stressed that men don't need to walt until they've got nothing left.



Department had 122,149 calls for service from June 2004 to June 2005, while Altamonte Springs Police Department had 24,090.

The union also said that their officers are sixth or seventh in Seminole County in starting salaries. Officers in Sanford start out at \$31,384, while Altamonte Springs, Casselberry, Lake Mary, Longwood, and Oviedo Police Departments have salary ranges starting \$32,000 and between \$35,000.

The union will discuss the latest offer with its members, but Hachigian said it's going to get "ugly and nasty" for the city.

The city's labor attorney, Benton Wood, tried to include a step increase in the offer, but union reps said that's already a done deal, and should already be in next fiscal year's budget.



He said that's how good their relationship and trust was with the city of Sanford. He said they have never had a problem with the city until they brought the new labor attorney to the table.



He also served for approximately 26 years as president of Congress Number One, which is affiliated with the\_ 1st South Florida Missionary Baptist Association. Many ministers have been ordained under his leadership.

Many folks will also remember Rev. Evans as being a selfemployed Master Masonry and can find many of his works around the community and the state of Florida. He also worked for Orange County public Works and he worked with and retired from the Sanford Housing Authority.

Rev. Evans was born in Greenville, Florida, to the late Annie Mae Bea-Crews and Ishmael (Peach) Emmanuel Evans. He had two wives to precede him in death. He was the father of five biological children and raised four from his second marriage. Evans exemplified strong character in that he loved his family, church and community. Deacon Anderson McKinzie, Superintendent of Sunday School at Morning Glory Missionary Baptist Church expressed his thoughts on knowing Evans. "I really admired him. I loved him for being just who he was and respected him greatly".

UCP snapped the nation's longest road losing streak of 15 games, winning for the first time on the road since a 48-31 victory at Miami of Ohio on November 23, 2002.



Moffett finished the game completing 15-of-25 attempts for 232 yards with three scores. On the ground, freshman tail-back Kevin Smith carried the ball 25 times for 110 yards. He is the first true freshman tailback to rush for 100 yards in a game since Gerod Davis rushed for 120 yards versus Samford on November 21,

1992. After Louisiana-Lafayette blocked a UCF punt inside the Golden Knights' 30-yard line, the Ragin' Cajuns drive was stopped by senior linebacker James Cook's first career interception to end the scoring threat at the UCF one-yard line. Moffett was 11-of-13 passing for 196 yards and three touchdowns in the first half as UCF led 21-7 at the break. After a missed field goal attempt of 36 yards by Matt

Prater, Louisiana-Lafayette drove 80 yards on 11 plays, capped off by a six-yard touch-

down run by Jerrell Carter to bring the Cajuns to within seven at 21-14 with 5:20 remaining in the third quarter. On UCF's ensuing posses-sion, ULL forced a Molfett fumble inside the UCF 10-yard line and recovered the ball on the Golden Knight seven-yard line. On the next play, Levier scampered seven yards to tie the game at 21.

After the hosts turned the ball over on downs late in the fourth quarter, UCF mounted a four minute, 51-yard drive that led to Brown's field goal. Smith carried the ball eight times on the drive, accounting for 33 yards to set-up Brown's kick. Freshman safety Jason Venson totaled a team-high 12 tackles for UCF. He added two pass breakups. Freshman cornerback Joe Burnett added seven stops.

UCF returns home on Saturday to host Memphis for a Conference USA contest. Kickoff at the Florida Citrus Bowl is slated for 6 p.m. MIDKNIGHT MADNESS SET

In addition to the scrimmages, MidKnight Madness will feature performances by Knight Moves and giveaways and contests for fans. The event is free for UCF stu-

dents with a valid school ID. Admission for the volleyball match is \$4 for adults and \$2 for children.
