Florida citrus growers are . always troubled to a greater or less extent by fruit thieves who help themselves to the products of remote groves, sometimes to sell in the market, but more often for their own consumption. This is just another one of the pests, which takes its place alongside of freezes, marketing problems, and

forth, which the citrus grower has to put up with.

The especiation of two persons in the court of crimes in Dade county for stealing a small quantity of fruit from one of the groves on the lower East Coast should go a long way toward eliminating this nuisance in that locality. A few arrests and convictions elsewhere throughout the state would serve a noble purpose in putting an end to at least one of the great problems of the grower.

As a result of the recent freeze, the consequent scarcity of oranges and the higher prices for them, it is exover. 


