





Stricken Japan Is Planning to Build Enormous Stadium

TOKIO, May 3.—The wave of stadium building, which has swept university centers of the United States since the war, has reached Japan. A stadium with a capacity of 80,000, which can be expanded to 100,000, is to be built this spring and summer about half way between Kobe and Osaka, on the line of the Hanshin Electric Railway, which is constructing the park.

Anyway, just as the departments are letting out the other owners of sidewalks and streets were lined with pedestrians and flivvers, Cal decided to shake the shaka out of his legs before dinner on a brief hike.

Instead of following the sidewalk, he emerged from the east gate of the White House grounds on Pennsylvania avenue, to the crosswalk where pedestrians are supposed to cross, Cal struck straight from the curb for the other side.

Brakes squealed and horns blared as drivers averted or jockeyed up to avoid collision. But Cal, flanked right and left by a crest service man, held his course, in the middle of the street, he had pause to let a stream of vehicles pass. 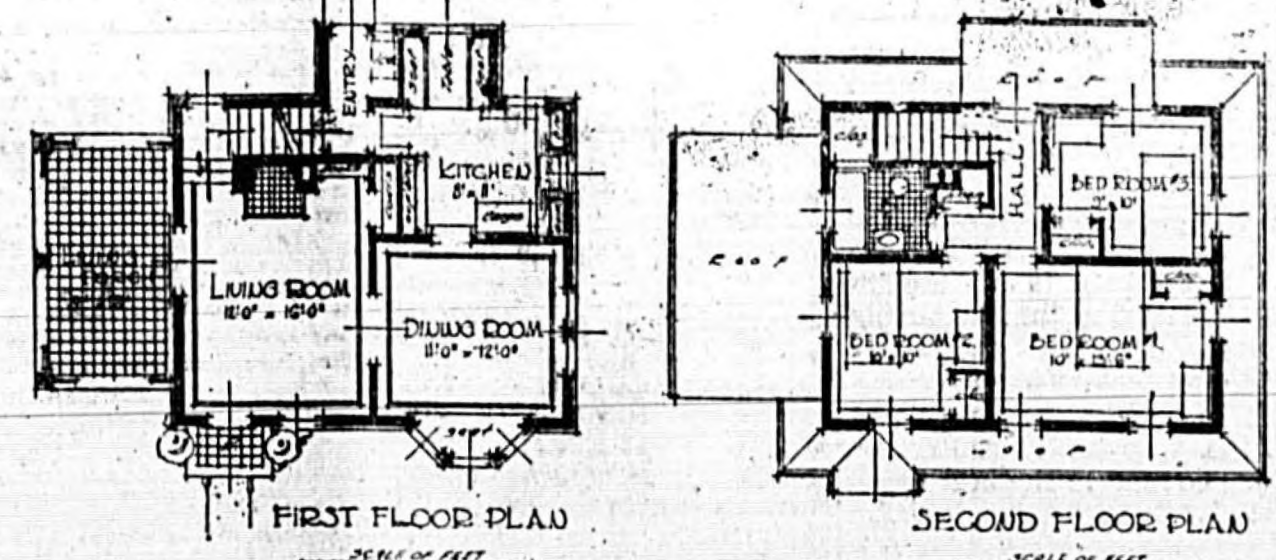
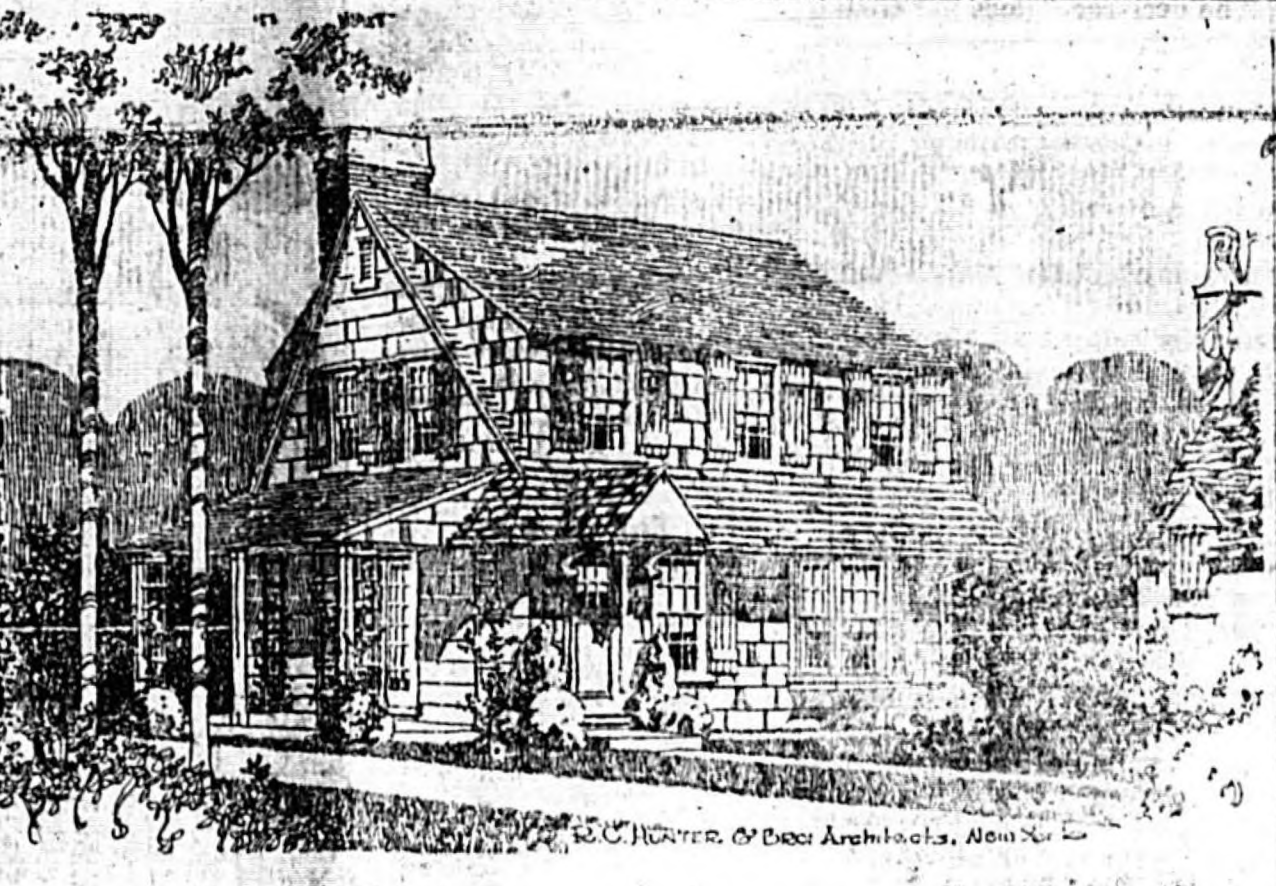

The stairs lead up from the rear of the living room to a center hall on the second floor. The three bedrooms and bath all open onto this hall, which is a very satisfactory arrangement for a second floor, as there is then no necessity for one to pass thru one room to gain access to another.

The bath room is tiled and has a complete set of fixtures. The bedrooms are well lighted, have ample light and generous closet space. A good size linen closet is provided near the bath room.

This house would be very charming when set among the green grass and foliage and shrubs. Cost about \$5400.

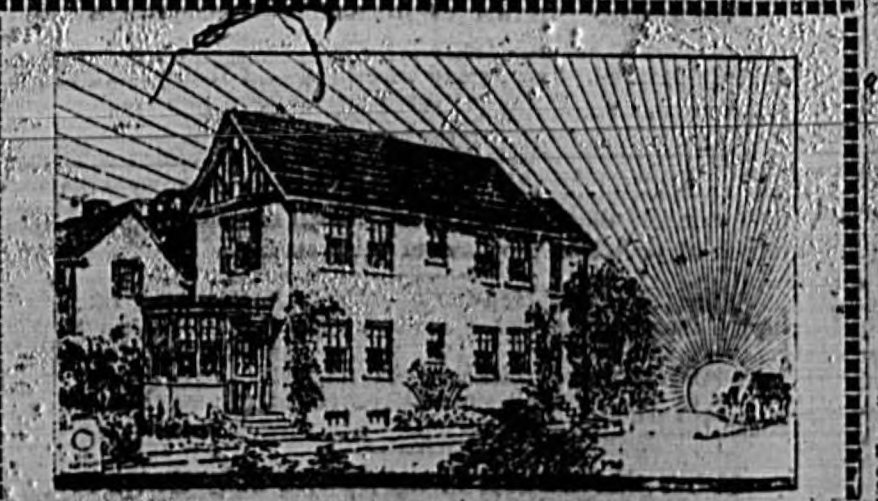
