

A review of the official record of the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce, for the 12-month period ending last Oct. 1, reveals that Clifford Mckibbin Sr. more than earned

The list of accomplishments is long, and impressive, Mc-Kibbin, reporting on his stewardship at the annual Chamber benquet, gave one of the shortest summations on record. His summation was so short that it did not, on its face,

sound as if much had been accomplished. Examined carefully, however, the record shows that the October-to-October period was one of the most progressive in the history of the Chamber.

Although Mckibbin endeared bimself to the audience, Which was expeciling a long review, he did himself an injustice in "boiling to the bone" his report.

In The Herald's opinion, a Chamber of Commerce should furnish leadership for community business, McKibbin exhibited that quality. When the reins of the Chamber were passed along to Mack Cleveland Jr., this continued leadership was assured.






