

United Fund Facing Possible Death Soon

The future of the United Fund in Seminole County appears very much in doubt.

It appears certain the United Fund officials, in the near Tuture, will vote to disband this charity organization unless the public give assurances that it wants the UF.

In its second year the UF fell some \$14,000 short of its goal. Interest and enthusiasm did not participate in the drive. Neither did many citizens. At a meeting to divide the \$22,000 in cash and pledges. UF officials made it plain that they don't intend to knock themselves out for something the public apparently doesn't want.

UP leaders were disappointed at the response to their appeals. They gave their time in an effort to collect funds for the Red Cross, Boy and Girl Scouts, Salvation Army, USO, Mental Health and Children's Home Society. UF workers had the finest sales talk possible; the work of the agencies which would use the funds. Yet, Seminole County said "no" to the appeal.

Howard McNulty, campaign chairman, and Harold Kastner, UF president, both expressed doubt that Seminole County wants a United Fund. Clifford McKibbin pointed out that the total collected was more than the seven agencies could have collected in separate drives. This, he said, represents progress.

Does the public wish to revert to the "drive-a-month" plan? This seems unlikely. What, then, is the trouble? The chief problem appears to be that, in reality, it is not a United Fund. 
