





A Great Naval Victory

Good news comes today from the Pacific as thousands of miles away on the other side of the world, American forces continue hammering relentlessly away at Axis forces in Algiers and Tunisia. Rommel's defeat in Egypt and the American landing in Prench North Africa were good news indeed, but reports of an American naval victory far sur-passing any previous success in this war are real cause for celebration.

for celebration. In a three day (or rather, night) battle in the Solo-mons American and Japanese warships slugged it out at close range in a knockdown dragout fight that dispels all doubt as to aggressiveness of American admirals and the courage of American seamen, or the ability of the American Navy to dish it out, as well as to take it. When the Japs withdrew—what was left of them—they not only knew they had been in a fight, they knew they had been licked. The Japs had sent a convoy of some 80 ships to the Solomons for the purpose of reinforcing their positions around Guadalcanal. Included were 40 transports loaded with about 40,000 soldiers and a number of battle raged for the better part of three nights and when the American guns ceased firing, after the Japs had become so confused they were blazing away at each other, at least 23 Jap ships had been sunk and an undetermined number of others dam-aged.

The Americans lost two light cruisers and six destroy-ers. In the words of Admiral Nimitz, "All of the enemy forces were destroyed or driven back and a major victory was obtained."
