Price Support Program Heads for Severe Test

Storage Space Is Scarce For Bumper Corn Crop

Special to Central Press

W/ASIRNOTON-The government's price support program appears to be headed into a period that will test it to the limit -a period that will bring up all manner of problems involving poscible outlays running into the billions.

Supports already are in operation for wheat, potatoes, and in some cases, eggs. It isn't hard to find an expert who thinks that as many as six million bales of cotton may be placed under price-supporting loans. On top of this, the lack of storage space may

bring a rush to market of the whopping corn crop as rapidly as it's harvested. This would tend to depress the corn price and hence call for support price operations for that commedity.

Some of the minor crops are giving the agri-culture boys a headache, too. Fixseed and soybeans are two examples.

Processors withdrew from the flaxseed market in August because, they said, they couldn't pay the support prices and still make a profit. Since then the government has been forced to take all of this commodity offered for sale at \$4 a bushel.






