Tax Hikes Take Prices Up

Many Seminole County residents filled up their tanks Thursday and last night to beat the 7-cent per gallon gas price hike, which went into effect today to meet federal and state government tax cuts.

Ron Kramer, manager of the Highway Oil Co. on French Avenue in Sanford, said he had been "very busy indeed" with most of the rush on Thursday. He said he had not had many complaints about the new tax. "There's not much we can do about it," he added. "I've got to pay the same price as everybody else."

Taxes and gas prices will go up again for many Floridians in September. Congress raised the federal excise tax on gas by a nickel early this year, and the Florida Legislature, in a special session in early March, passed a plan boosting the state tax by 1.7 cents a gallon now and providing for automatic additional increases later.

The state plan also allows counties to collect a local gas tax of up to 4 cents, but not until Sept. 1.

The Wage-Price Control Act on North French Avenue reported business has had been up for three days in anticipation of the increased taxes.

Thursday night service stations and convenience stores in all areas of the county still had lines at the gas pumps as motorists were determined to get at least one more tank full at the old price.

Station operators said that, in implementing the tax changes was no problem for them as they are used to fluctuating prices and changes in taxes.

Money from the federal increase will go for interstate highway construction and repairs and to provide jobs to help ease the country's critical unemployment situation.

The state tax increase is part of a package producing \$238 million a year to reauthorize primary system roads and repair bridges.

Other provisions in the package include a 50-cent increase in license tags that takes effect at the beginning of May.

Seminole, Fla. S. Jobless Rates Drop

Things are looking up for the unemployed in Seminole County and in the rest of the United States.

The U.S. civilian unemployment rate declined slightly to 10.3 percent in March, the Labor Department reported today, with about 11.4 million Americans still out of work.

Seminole County's February unemployment statistics showed a 3.8 percent drop in the number of people out of work. The unemployment rate fell to 6.8 percent from the 7.4 percent jobless in January.

State Employment Service Assistant Sterling Tack said the decline in the Seminole County unemployment rate is partially due to the end of seasonal retail jobs.

Many of the people in those jobs are housewives who work for the holiday and post-holiday sales and then leave the job market for the rest of the year, Tack said.

Seminole County continues to have the lowest unemployment rate in the region. The Orlando Metropolitan area has a 7.8 percent unemployment rate. Orange County has a 7.8 percent and DeSoto County has an 11.9 percent rate.

Seminole County's unemployment rate was 6.8 percent a year ago.

The monthly survey report from the Labor Department's Bureau of Labor Statistics also showed little change in the 1.6 million "discouraged workers" not counted among the unemployed.

Quarterly data on those individuals showed a decline of \$5,000 in the first three months of 1980 after rising for the previous six quarters. The department said about 80 percent of the total, or roughly 1.4 million, were seeking employment because of job market factors.

The number of officially unemployed dropped 100,000 in March to 11,381,200, with the civilian jobless rate of 10.3 percent down 0.1 percentage points from the 10.4 percent level of January and February.

An alternative military-civilian unemployment rate, which includes 1.6 million members of the Armed Forces as part of the labor force, declined from 10.2 percent to 10.1 percent in March.

The March civilian data showed most categories with slight improvement, with the rate for adult men reflecting the greatest drop. That rate declined 0.3 percentage points to 9.6 percent, while the rate for adult women was down 0.1 percentage points to 8.8 percent.

Teen-age joblessness increased, however, by 1.3 percentage points to 23.6 percent, although the normally high rate for black teen-agers declined slightly from 45.4 percent to 45.2 percent.

Overall black unemployment was up slightly, by 0.2 percentage points, to 19.9 percent, and the rate for Hispanic workers increased to 16.3 percent.

Among broad industry groups, the jobless rate for workers in manufacturing declined over the month to 12.8 percent, while construction unemployment was up slightly from 18.1 percent to 20.3 percent.

The Labor Department reported Thursday new claims for jobless benefits dropped by 9,000 to 484,000 in mid-March.

The number of people receiving benefits under all state and federal programs was \$995,300 in early March, a decrease of 116,800.

Doesn't Anyone Wear Easter Bonnets Anymore?

Tradition Seems To Have Become Old Hat

Have Easter bonnets gone the way of buggy whips and bustles?

Come to think of it, have you seen any signs that said, "Ladies, please remove your hats" lately? Look around you at church or any fancy get-together and you'll notice the most conspicuous thing about women's hats is their absence.

Just about every year the designers get designs on lady's head and pocketbook and the fashion magazines proclaim that hats are back, but the girls just aren't buying—at least not in casual clothes such as Florida.

"Most women don't wear hats any more," says Ed Hersmann, manager of the J.C. Penney's store in Sanford. "We carry a few, but it's not all that a big deal any more. We have a few little girls' Easter hats."

Hats are still a good seller at Manuel Jacobson's Department Store in downtown Sanford, according to a store spokesperson. "We're selling a lot of hats" to younger women as well as older ones, she says. "Hats with flowers are popular and we have pretty colors such as orange and purple as well as white and black. Wide brims and derbys are both in style."

She says the store also sells a lot of hats for Mother's Day. However, she points out that frilly hats and white gloves for little girls are a thing of the past. "Our buyers don't even bother ordering them, they're out of style."

That may be true for most little girls, but there will no doubt be at least a few young Central Florida ladies who will be carrying on the tradition. You can picture them all decked out in white gloves and frilly Easter bonnets again this year, thanks to the unflagging persistence of their mothers and grandmothers.

Occasionally, one comes upon a die-hard hat fancier who would feel naked without one of the creations from her extensive millinery collection perched atop her carefully coiffed head.

One of these is Betty Toole, widow of the late south Seminole banker Jack Toole. She admits to owning "two or three dozen hats" including those bearing the label of designers such as Lilly Dache', some of which are back in vogue again.

"Hats are the crowning touch to an ensemble," she explains. "Years ago, I'd shop for a hat first and then match the outfit to it. A hat frames a woman's face and gives it a softer look. Hats and gloves complete an outfit and I've never stopped wearing them."

"I grew up in the hat era," Mrs. Toole says. "In big cities you didn't go out shopping without a hat."

colorful pieces of headgear shown, she will probably be one of a very few doing so. Wearing hats, it seems, just ain't what it used to be.

They were worn to coffee, tea and lunch. I loved them and still do. To go shopping for a hat would lift up your spirits. Cloches, large picture hats, berets and tams—I love them all. I started wearing hats as a young woman and have never stopped. Years ago, even a teenager, to always be in good taste, would wear a hat and gloves."

"Hats are coming back in vogue again," Mrs. Toole said. "People haven't been wearing them for about 15 years. Some people never liked them and were relieved when they went out of fashion, they will probably never go back to wearing them. The younger generation is yet to learn to wear them."

Easter Sunday traditionally has been a day when people all over America gather to celebrate the arrival of spring and show off their new hats. Most women and little girls in past years wouldn't be caught without a fancy chapeau to wear with their new outfit to church on Easter.

By the 1880s, the "Easter fashion parade," later to be memorialized in song, was well established in

New York City. Toppers, toppers, turbans, sailors, derbies and fedoras blossomed like Easter lilies along Fifth Avenue.

But then, in the 1930s, a blight began to spread across the land—creeping hatlessness.

"It was a dying business," says Lory Roston, executive director of the Headwear Institute of America. "After World War II and all those bell-bottoms, the last thing men wanted to do was wear hats."

"Today," he reports happily, "the hat business is booming."

Copperfield Plays 'Can I Top This?'

If you tune in CBS on Friday, April 8 at 9 p.m. EST, expecting to see "The" you won't see the top-rated. Historian David Copperfield has made the living can disappear.

The 26-year-old has previously done the same thing to a Ferrari, and a Lear jet, and before the hour-long "The Magic of David Copperfield" in December. The 26-year-old will attempt — and it is OK to say he'll succeed — in making the Statue of Liberty disappear. Don't fear. Copperfield is such a nice guy he has made all the aforementioned requests, including "Dallas" and 25-ton Miss Liberty. This is his fifth CBS special and in each he has withstood the pressure of topping his previous achievements.

Originally he thought about doing his "new you see it, now you do it" specialty to the Queen Mary, but after having it recently spent so much time touring, Copperfield felt he

needed to make a statement, while also performing his prestigious premilligations.

"Earning through Savage" was every imagination, some of whom had escaped from behind the Iron Curtain," Copperfield explains. "Then I realized some others can't leave, even if they wanted to, so I decided to spotlight the concept that we don't appreciate freedom of a good."

The Statue of Liberty disappearance, filmed last September, required three nights' work for 300 people.

"Magic must be done in a controlled atmosphere," says Copperfield, who is the special's producer. "Usually it's performed on stage with a proscenium and the audience sitting where we want them.

If we'd had boats all around the statue, it would be like a lake, but we had a stage show."

Inviting an audience on the event was the toughest task of the Statue of Liberty finale. However, the 20 tourists, chosen at random from the Liberty Island crowd, were all convinced that Copperfield had made the statue disappear and reappear.

Television viewers will have the added benefit of watching the act on radar.

When the curtain is raised to cover the statue, a bip is still seen on the screen. Moments later, the bip disappears — as does the statue — only to resume when Miss Liberty reappears.

Protecting Oscar From Terrorists

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — In common with the rest of our society, the people who run the Academy Awards are becoming increasingly terrified of terrorism.

The event — less year it was on Feb. 13 — is the kind of target terrorists love. It's very public, wide open, in fact. It is an affair that attracts global media attention. It is attended by segments of people it frequently has some controversial winners.

Because of all that, the Academy Awards are more and more security conscious. Jerry Moon, the Disney Studio security chief, is heading the Academy Award security forces for the 13th straight year. It is confident that everything is under control.

"Terrorism is my main concern," Moon says. "We've been very fortunate over the years, and have never had a problem. But maybe that's because we take a lot of precautions every year."

They start screening the building where the Oscars are handed out a week before the actual event. Moon says that "everything and everybody" who goes into that building is checked and double-checked and nobody and nothing gets in that isn't supposed to go in. Credentials are looked at closely.

"We make a complete sweep of the building every day for a week," Moon says. "Just before the show begins, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department sweeps it. The representatives of the insurance company are around all week long."

Moon says there are many threats, mostly via the telephone. He says he has experts who evaluate those calls, and he believes that, so far, they have all been either jokes or crank calls.

"The biggest problem isn't terrorism, it actually has the more prosaic and common threat of gun-crackers. Gunners try to enter year. Moon says he believes 99 percent are caught."

"We don't jail them often," he says, "because they generally aren't malicious. We just warn them and kick them out."

Screen go to elaborate lengths to check the big party. They have armed guards in TV sets up with last year's tickets or badges. They come in early pasting no workers and hair in restaurants until the ceremony begins.

"We just keep it tight," says Moon. "The crowd doesn't come out in inclement weather."
