Campaign Rolling Along

TACOMA, Wash. (AP) - When George Nalley wheels his congressional campaign into high gear, chances are good that he is talking about having his wheelchair pushed a little faster. The Republican member of the Tacoma City Council is battling five-term incumbent Floyd V. Hicks for the state's 6th Congressional District seat Crippled in a surfing accident while serving in the Marines during World War II, Nalley, 51, is meeting the issue of his handicap head-on - and is attempting to turn it into a plus. Nalley's brochures are filled with photos of him in his wheelchair. One brochure says, "George Nalley sits in a wheelchair. So what makes him think he can be elected to Congress?" It lists his qualifications and ideas on top issues as an answer to his own question.

No Mexican Oil Bargain

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. (AP) - The United States won't get bargains in Mexican oil, President Ford has been told at his first foreign summit. Ford got that message from Mexican President Luis Echeverria on Monday night before returning to the Republican hustings today in an effort to bolster his party's candidates in Oklahoma and Ohio. Ford arrived here late Monday from Tucson, Ariz., where he wound up a series of conferences on both sides of the border with the Mexican leader. At his Mexican-American summit, Ford received a pledge of access to oil produced south of the border, but was told he will have to pay Arab prices for it.

FBI Reports Criticized

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. attorneys are complaining that the prosecution of criminal defendants is endangere which may be used to discredit prosecution witnesses. The FBI has rejected suggestions that certain information helpful to defense lawyers should be left out of the reports. But FBI officials have promised to consider other ways of making the reports more valuable to

Workers Can Campaign

WASHINGTON (AP) - Federal restrictions on political activity by state and local government employes have been eased by a little-noted provision of the new campaign financing law. But because of the multiplicity of state and local restrictions that remain in effect, this year's elections may well be over before all of the 5 million or more persons potentially affected know where they stand.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Defense lawyers in the Watergate cover-up trial are about to start trying to repair any damage done to their clients by the testimony of former White House counsel John W. Dean III. Prosecutor James F. Neal has another hour of questioning of Dean today and then defense attorneys will start their crossexamination.

Judge Blocks Custody Move

WASHINGTON (AP) — A federal judge has at least temporarily blocked the White House from carrying out an agreement to give former President Richard M. Nixon custody of his White House papers and tapes. At the same time, U.S. District Judge Charles R. Richey indicated he will tackle the centuries-old question of just who owns presidential papers - the President or the government.

41 Killed In Fighting

LOURENCO MARQUES, Mozambique (AP) - Fortyone persons were reported killed Monday evening i racial battles in Lourenco Marques touched off by an attack by demobilized Portuguese troops on black soldiers of the new government. About 40 of the Portuguese ex-servicemen seized the guns of four black troops of the Mozambique Liberation Front - Frelimo - and half an hour later opened fire with machine guns and hand grenades on Frelimo troops guarding the newspaper Noticias. The black troops returned the fire, killing at least four of the Portuguese. After 30 minutes of firing, the Portuguese scattered, but Africans in the city went on a retaliatory rampage, attacking buses, cars and

'Weather War' Warning

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) - The Soviet government says that mankind could be subjected to such environmental horrors as artificial tidal waves and ultraviolet bombardment through holes in the ozone layer unless "weather war" is headed off. Soviet Ambassado Jacob A. Malik introduced a resolution in the United Nations General Assembly's main political committee fonday to send a Soviet-proposed convention against such warfare to the Geneva Disarmament Committee to be put into final form.

Peace On Arab Agenda

RABAT, Morocco (AP) - Syria called for solidarity "to complete the liberation of territories still occupied" by Israel as foreign ministers assembled in Rabat to draft an agenda for the Arab summit conference opening Satur-day. Syrian Foreign Minister Abdelhalim Khaddam was reported planning to submit a draft proposal rejecting the step-by-step approach to peace advocated by Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, but Arab diplomats said President Anwar Sadat of Egypt would urge acceptance of the Kissinger approach.



Inventors Say Laws Are Unfair

The ability of American inventors and paten owners to capitalize on their creative efforts has been seriously eroded in recent years by government action and court decisions. So claims Intellectual Property Owners, Inc., an organization of patent holders.

The result, it says, is a diminishing value of patents that has left many corporations uncertain whether they want to continue making the heavy investment of brainpower and capital necessary to ensure a continuing flow of new The problem, it seems, has arisen from a

confusion of two different objectives. One is the protection and encouragement intended for nventors by patent law; the other is the opposing thrust of antitrust legislation. Preoccupied with antitrust objectives, the U.S. Justice Department has attacked, or is considering attacking, certain long-accepted patent

icensing arrangements. For example, so-called "tie- in" agreements, whereby a licensed corporation is permitted to produce a patented product provided it uses certain key parts manufactured by the original patent holder, have in virtually all cases been

In cases where the ability of a licensed company to produce a satisfactory product may be wolved, both the public and industry are badly served by antitrust overkill, says the organiza-

The principal purpose of the antitrust laws is to prevent monopolies. But patents are not true monopolies, points out T.L. "Ted" Bowes, executive director of Intellectual Property Owners. They are a grant of exclusive rights to the holder for a limited period of time so that he can capitalize on his investment of time and money in creating a new product or process.

Court Refuses Case

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - The results of four Pinellas County races in the Sept. 10 primary, fought all the way to the Florida Supreme Court, will stand. The court refused to hear the case Monday, a few hours after four defeated candidates filed an appeal to seek a rerun of the election.

The four claimed they were denied equal protection of the law because their names were placed on a separate bottom line on the ballot. Hillsborough County Circuit Judge Laurance Goodrich had agreed and ordered the races rerun. But the 2nd District Court of Appeal overturned that decision last

Gerstein Raps Investigation

MIAMI (AP) - State Atty. Richard Gerstein has charged two white policemen with beating a black undercover agent and strongly criticized the police investigation of the incident.

Saying that pressure within the police department caused witnesses to "color, distort and change their testimony," Gerstein filed assault and battery charges Monday against Charles Outlaw and Dale Thorpe in connection with the beating of Officer Joseph Cook. Gerstein said Outlaw and Thorpe beat Cook during a Sept. 3 drug raid on a motel near downtown Miami. Cook, who was hospitalized after the incident, has said that Outlaw either didn't hear him or ignored him when he identified himself as a policeman.

Anti-Clotting Drug Safe

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) - A team of Baltimore researchers says a new drug made from the venom of a small Southeast Arian snake can prevent blood clotting. Dr. John White, associate professor of surgery at Johns Hopkins University, said Monday that the new drug overcomes problems of standard drugs such as heparin which cannot be used for extended periods because they become increasingly difficult to control. The new drug is "an efficient and relatively safe" anticlotting agent in such cases. White told the American


