LOS ANGELES, Calif. (NEA) — Pete Rotello once gave me the "best line" on Frank Ryan. "He's the only player I know," said the National Football League commissioner, "with an IQ as high as Jill St. John's."

Jill is a red-headed cupcake whose convolutions of the Frug and the Watusi match her 162 genius level. Ryan has gray-speckled hair and quarterback's the Cleveland Browns. It took him seven years, concurrent with his study for a Ph. D. in geometric functions, to figure out what pro football is all about.

You have to throw over a defender and yet make sure it's not over the end zone. We were on the 18-yard line. When the safety picked up Gary as he made his inside cut, the coverage was theoretically perfect, but I was scrambling and Gary decided to break his pattern and come back under the goal posts. He caught them by surprise and I can complete that kind of pass himself."

Asher was held to only one field goal in the first half but scored 20 in the second half.

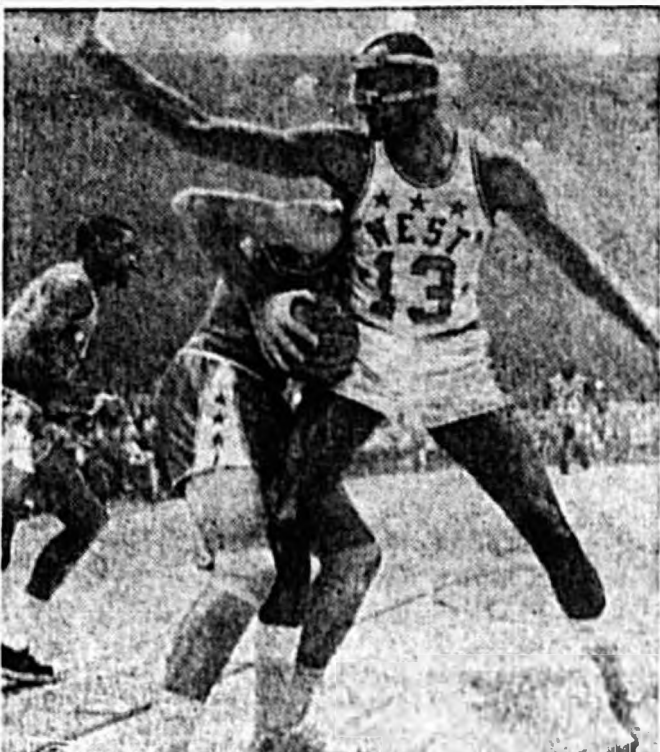

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — Willie Mays, who expects to get in four or five more years of baseball, will collect another \$105,000 this season for playing with the San Francisco Giants.

The famed center fielder came to terms with the club for the same salary that he pulled in last year as baseball's highest-paid active performer.

Mickey Mantle of the New York Yankees is regarded as the only other active player who is in the six figure bracket. The latter is believed to collect \$100,000 annually.

Mays led the National League in home runs last season with 47 and drove in 111 tallies. But a prolunger slump after the All-Star game resulted in a final batting average of .298. It marked the first time in eight years that Willie had dropped out of the .300 class.

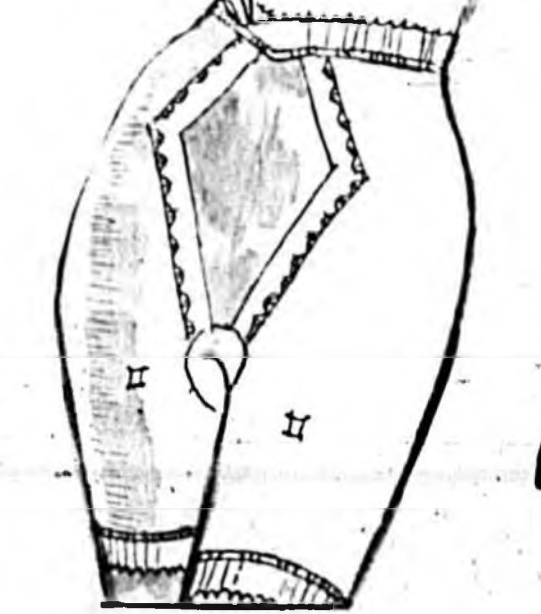

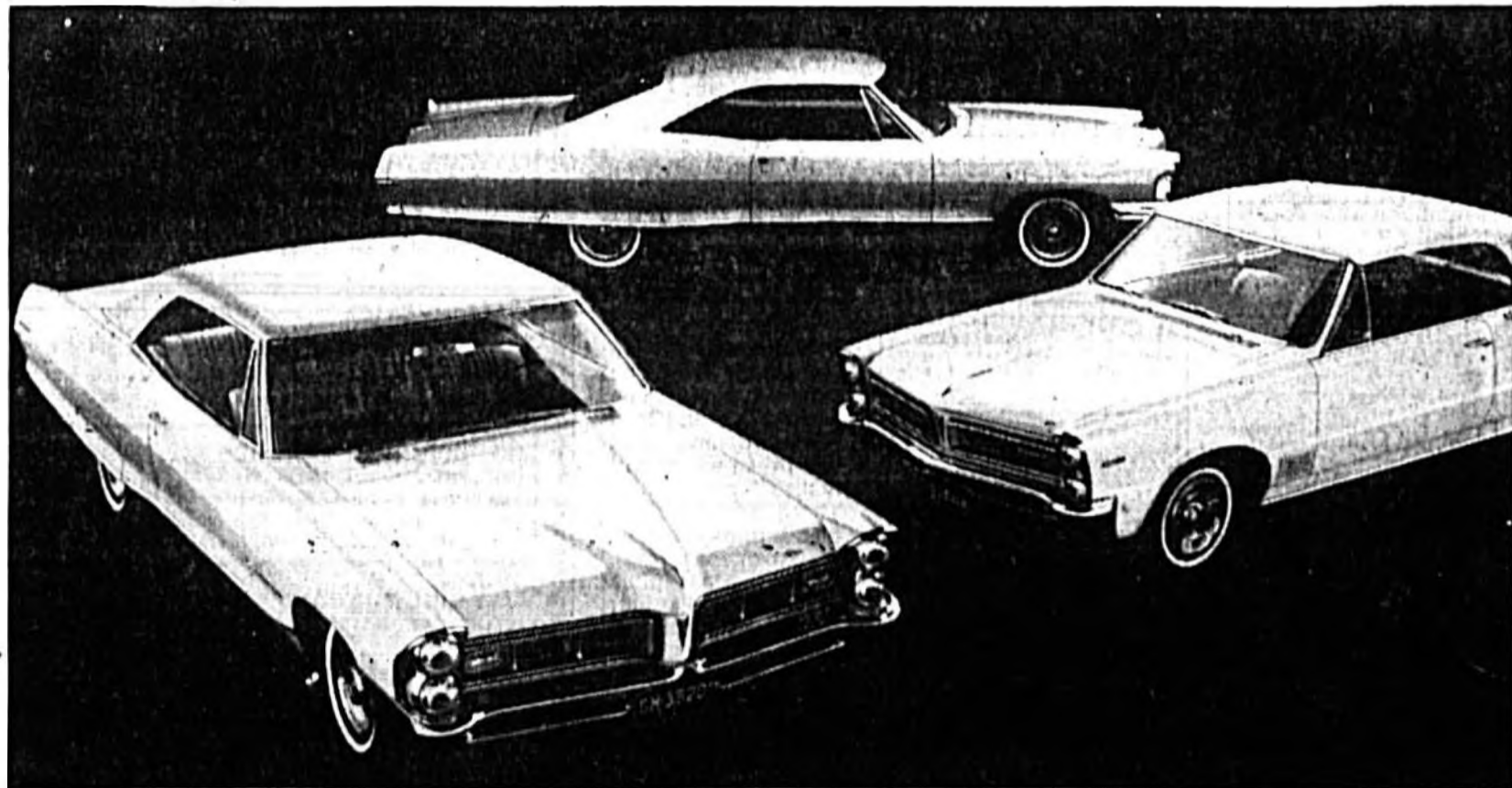
