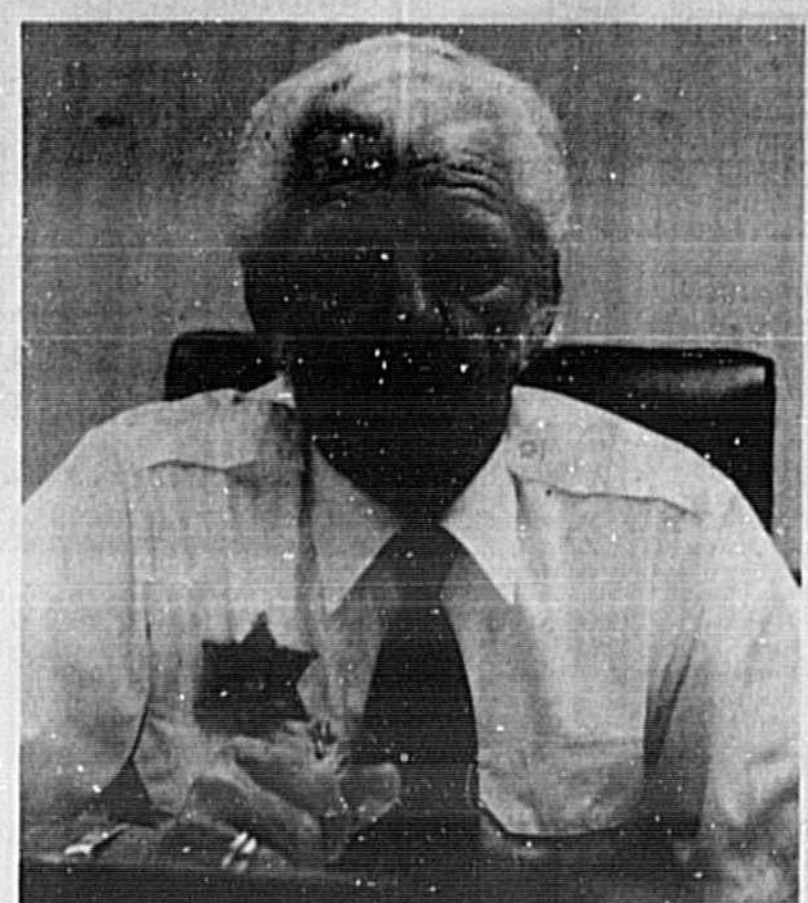

PUD Zoning: Catch-All For Multi-Family Apartments?

Planned Unit Development (PUD) as a concept of diversified land use, was introduced in Florida a little more than five years ago, but today some 17,000 acres of Seminole County property carries the zoning designation.

A former city attorney warned the elected officials of Winter Springs last year that the city would have difficulty defending its zoning, if taken to court.

County Attorney Tom Freeman, then legal advisor to the Winter Springs City Council, said too much of the city's PUD zoning property was being used for multi-family apartment complexes rather than being developed under the true PUD concept of diversified uses.

The July issue of Florida Trend magazine includes a special report entitled "Fragile, Often Abused, The PUD Matures in Florida."

The article notes Carl Feiss, architect-educator and director of the Urban and Regional Land Institute at the University of Florida, originated the concept of diversified land use in a village outside Cleveland, Ohio, in 1966.

Feiss is quoted in the article as saying the hamlet was in jeopardy of having its master land use plan self-destructing unless changes could be made to permit long range developments incorporating more than just high grade residential homes on large estates with formal gardens.

The Florida Trend continues that the PUD had no let-up in zoning protections, just flexibility for other uses.

PUDs in the county range from the smallest in Altamonte Springs, little more than six acres — The Villages — to the largest in Winter Springs, 3,500 acres, Tuscawilla.

Only one incorporated community in Seminole County, Langwood, has no land zoned PUD.

An ordinance was adopted three years ago, adding the PUD classification to its zoning categories. But its single effort to rezone a large parcel to PUD was met with an outpouring of disapproval from nearby property owners.

In Lake Mary, although 70 acres were rezoned PUD, an attempt to develop the tract was also met with rejection by the community's residents.

In Winter Springs in recent weeks, a request by a land developer to extend the 12-month time limit on his plan for development of 190 acres was refused.

Currently Sanford has 1,818.32 acres of land zoned PUD including the Hidden Lake Stray Dogs

project 786.61 acres; Sanora 140 acres and Carriage Cove 363.719.

In Altamonte Springs 843.23 acres are zoned PUD including Oak Harbor with 35 acres under construction; The Villages 6.13 completed construction, Riverview with 100 acres under construction; Country Creek, 399.1 acres under construction and North Lake, 223 acres partially under construction.

In Oviedo Stron Properties' in the extreme south end of the city was annexed and zoned for PUD nearly a year ago. Only a few weeks remain for Stron Properties to begin construction, according to a plan approved by the city, calling for — among other things — recreation facilities and a full scale sewer system.

In Seminole County, the unincorporated areas have total of nine PUD zoned parcels totaling 10,100 acres and including: Headrow 1,287 acres; Greenwood Lakes 1,450 acres; Sabal Point 3,050 acres; Sweetwater Oaks 612 acres; The Springs 380 acres; Wekiva Hunt Club 1,022 acres; Sand Lake 150 acres; Sterling Park 1,000 acres and Appaloosa Village 301 acres.

Casselberry has two PUD areas zoned with total acreage of about 50 while Lake Mary has its 70 acres.

Winter Springs, however, with 4,343.41 acres zoned for four PUD areas, has slightly less than 25 per cent of the entire county's PUD zoned property and almost half as much as the unincorporated areas of Seminole.

Sheehy, with 553.41 acres is partially constructed; Wildwood with 100 acres is partially built; Tuscawilla with 3,500 acres is still building and the 190 acres, formerly known as Crooked Creek, lies fallow.

Memories Of Good Cuisine

Remembrance Of Home Cooking Past

Warm summer days release old-fashioned memories. Particularly in these times of frozen meals, powdered soups and instant food substitutes.

My mother, born in Northern California, was a wonderful cook as well as beautiful. My father, a tall Southerner, had spent much time in France and enjoyed its cuisine. I grew up well fed since food was a part of our family life.

We lived in a large apartment in New York. Mother did most of the cooking. I recall, by Mary Bolinbrook of Ireland. These were what today we would call old-fashioned cooks. They used nothing "instant" or "ready-to-eat," with the exception of Blue Point oysters served raw on the half shell.

These would be ordered in the morning and just before dinner the man from the fish store would arrive with a large shallow tin pan filled with shaved ice topped with the oysters opened and ready to serve. All they needed was lemon juice and a touch of salt.

Father would disappear just before the rabbit was ready to serve, carrying a tall stone crock with a light-fitting top. At Keenan's they would fill it with draft beer and he would hurry back with it. That was known as "mashing the growler."

Every year we had a special spring dinner. It included shad roe, boiled new potatoes with parsley butter, fresh asparagus and strawberry shortcake — Mother often served Lobster Newburg on toast triangles. But she never could bring herself to plunge the live lobsters into a bucket of boiling water. So the fish man had to come over and do it for her.

Sometimes she gave a Welsh rabbit party. Father insisted only the finest Cheshire cheese and ale instead of beer. But they drank draft beer from Keenan's Bar two blocks away.

How About Colorful Ice Cream?

Whether you handpick your own strawberries at a nearby farm or buy them at the supermarket, it is a good idea to put in a supply when the time is right and freeze part for later use.

Its cups sugar
1/4 cup corn starch
1/4 teaspoon salt
Two-thirds cup Karo

over medium heat, stirring constantly, until small amount spooned onto surface of custard mounds slightly. Chill. Rinse, stem and crush strawberries; stir into chilled custard. Stir in heavy cream and vanilla. Freeze in 5 or 6 quart electric or hand crank freezer following manufacturer's directions. Makes about 5 quarts.

Picnic Idea That's Cool

What's a picnic without a well-seasoned macaroni-vegetable salad? Make this ahead of time, cover the bowl with plastic wrap or store in a lidded plastic bowl, chill in refrigerator until ready to pack into an ice chest for travel time.

MACARONI-VEGETABLE PICNIC SALAD
2 cups elbow macaroni (8 ounces)
1 tablespoon salt
3 quart boiling water
1 package salt (10 ounces) frozen peas
1-3 cup sliced radishes
1-3 cup sliced celery
1-3 cup salad oil

Gradually add macaroni and 1 tablespoon salt to rapidly boiling water so that water continues to boil. Cook uncovered, stirring occasionally, until tender. Drain in colander. Rinse with cold water; drain. Cook peas according to package directions; drain. Combine macaroni, peas, radishes and celery. Cover and chill. Combine oil, vinegar, salt, marjoram and chervil in 1 pint jar. Shake before serving and pour over macaroni mixture. Toss well. Makes 4 to 5 servings.

Stewed Tomatoes Better Homemade

DEAR CECILY: We enjoy your recipes in our paper and intend to try your Copy Cat Tomato Relish. In the meantime could you tell me the proportions for making our favorite stewed tomatoes from our own homegrown vegetables? I am enclosing the label from the brand of stewed tomatoes we always use. — HOME CANNER.

DEAR HOME CANNER: After your letter came we bought half a dozen brands of stewed tomatoes, including the one you use. On tasting them, observing their color and texture and measuring the amount of juice to vegetables, we evolved the following recipe.

Our stewed tomatoes are much less sweet than the commercially canned ones because we kept the sugar added low and our tomatoes probably weren't as sweet as those used by commercial canners. The color of our stewed tomatoes corresponded to the color of the fresh tomatoes we used and the pieces stayed whole because they were thickly and uniformly cut as are those of commercial canners; in using home-grown tomatoes, it's a good idea to choose odd sizes for the tomato pieces needed and reserve those of uniform size for the commercial can, when the vegetables were lightly drained, ran from about 1/2 to 2/3rds cup and we tried to maintain this ratio. I hope you approve our efforts. — C.B.

HOME CANNED STEWED TOMATOES
3 pounds ripe tomatoes, about 9 medium
1 cup thick homemade tomato juice, see below
1/2 cup chopped (medium-fine) onion

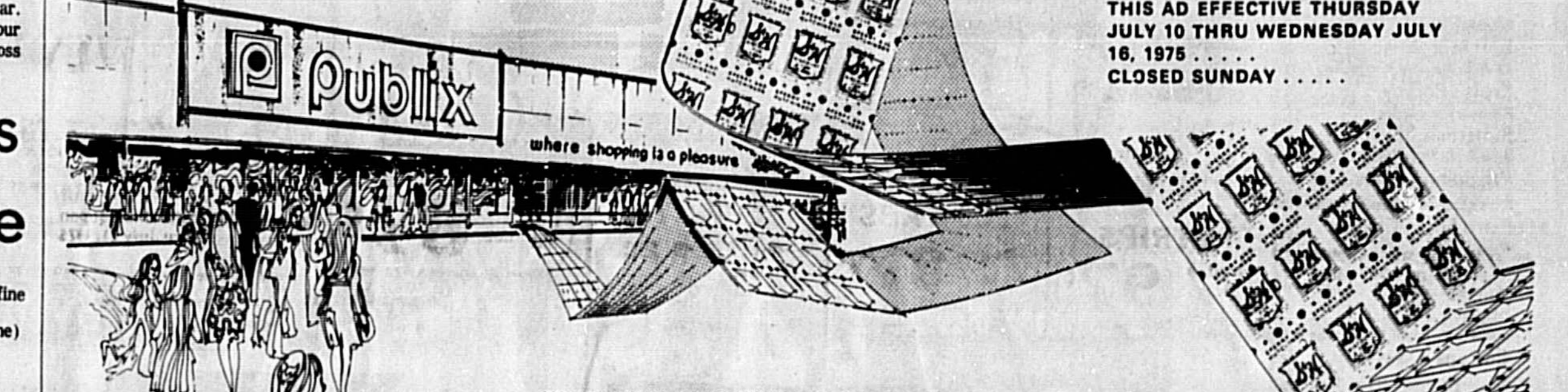
For each pint of tomato juice wanted, use about 3 pounds firm, juicy, ripe tomatoes. Rinse tomatoes; quarter and cut away stem ends. In a large saucet pan over low heat simmer tomatoes, stirring occasionally, until mixture boils; boil gently about 3 minutes. Leaving 1/2-inch headspace and preferably using a wide-mouth funnel, ladle tomatoes into hot, clean, scalded wide-mouth pint jars. Wipe top edge of jars with a damp towel. Add lids and seal according to jar manufacturer's directions. Process in a boiling water bath for 10 minutes after boiling temperature is reached. Remove and cool on a wire rack or folded towel. Label, noting date, and store in a dark cool place. Makes about 4 pints.

TOMATO JUICE
For each pint of tomato juice wanted, use about 3 pounds firm, juicy, ripe tomatoes. Rinse tomatoes; quarter and cut away stem ends. In a large saucet pan over low heat simmer tomatoes, stirring occasionally, until mixture boils; boil gently about 3 minutes.
