He reports that only about 10 per cent of the people are Communist and that they are scared of war and fear it, remembering the horrors of wars. They are also afraid of China and fear invasion. Working in the schools, he

taught some English to elementary classes, where students are taught other languages at an early age. He found the schools good and says illiteracy has almost been abolished. Education is free, although university degrees carry the stipulation of three years of service to the country.

Everything being owned by the Government, the people are paid and cared for by the USSR, with its self-contained monetary system. Housing is cheap but not up to our standards. Transportation is superior, and inexpensive. Medical aid is free to all, even foreigners. Although American money goes further in Russia in many ways, Miller is very glad to be back home in the United


