### Honoring our troops: Price's unit joins coalition forces

**LONGWOOD** — Marine Corps Lance Cpl. James F. Price, son of Shirley W. and James F. Price of Longwood, is currently deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. He is assigned to the 26th Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU), based in Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Elements of Price's unit recently joined coalition forces in the vicinity of Mosul, Iraq, to promote stability in the region and eliminate any pockets of Iraqi resistance.

Price is one of more than 4,000 Pacific Fleet Sailors and Marines who deployed aboard the ships of the USS Iwo Jima Amphibious Ready Group.

Price's unit is an expeditionary intervention force with the ability to rapidly organize for combat operations in virtually any environment. MEUs are composed of more than 2,000 personnel and are divided into an infantry battalion, aircraft squadron, support group and command element. With this combination, Price's unit supplies and sustains itself for either quick mission accomplishment or clearing the way for follow-on forces.

Price is a 1984 graduate of Lake Mary High School in Lake Mary. He joined the Marine Corps in November 1988.

**LAKE MARY** — Coach Joe Donoughe is taking his Odyssey team to the world finals in Iowa, and Padre the Mexican thumb wrestler is going with them.

Last month, Padre helped the Lake Mary High School Odyssey of the Mind team win the state regionals. An imaginary character, he was created by the students for the problem-solving competition.

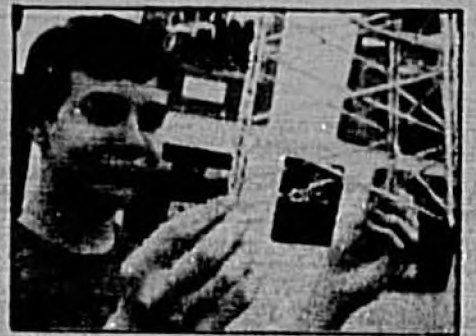
"The students needed to come up with a skit as part of their presentation," Donoughe said. "They came up with a very comical

and entertaining skit. Padre wrestles various characters, and at the end, he prevails."

The Odyssey of the Mind School Program's goal is to foster creative thinking and problem-solving skills among participating kindergarten through college students. It features an annual competition at the regional level and culminates with the world finals. Students solve problems in a variety of divisions and areas, from building

mechanical devices to giving their own interpretation of literary classics.

This year, The Lake Mary team chose Problem No. 4, Odd Pod Structure, as its challenge. During a six-month period, team members needed to design and build a structure made of balsa wood and glue that would rest on an odd number of team-made

## McLain traveling to Orlando in environmental style

### Chairman plans to unveil new hybrid car Monday

Chairman Daryl G. McLain of the Seminole County Board of County Commission will unveil the county's first hybrid vehicle Monday at Loch Haven Park in Orlando during a kickoff event for Clean Air Month.

The county purchased its hybrid vehicle, a Toyota Prius, in March at a cost of \$19,900. The Prius is powered by both a gas engine and an electric motor, hence the name hybrid.

The car uses its breaks to generate power, eliminating the need for the car to be "plugged in" to re-power. The hybrid car will be available for use by all Seminole County staff members beginning Tuesday when it joins the fleet of 75 standard company vehicles.

"We are using this vehicle as a test vehicle to see how the technology works for us," said Ruth Alfonso, fleet manager of Seminole County. "We need to make sure that everybody uses it and it is well accepted."

"I've already had people ask when they can take it out," she added. "So far, there is a lot of interest in it."

In preparation for Monday's 11 a.m. event, which is designed to inform elected officials and the general public about preventing air pollution in Central Florida, McLain received training on the specifics of driving the hybrid car.

Other than minor differences in placement of certain items, including the shifter, the car is similar to a regular "gas guzzling" vehicle. It

can reach 110 mph and has substantial legroom for a compact car.

The advantages of owning a hybrid vehicle are two fold — better fuel efficiency and less emissions that lead to ground-level ozone or smog.

In fact, the Prius is so clean-burning that it has been certified as a Super Ultra Low Emission Vehicle, which means it runs nearly 90 percent cleaner for smog-forming emissions than the standard for Ultra Low Emission Vehicles.

For this reason, individuals and organizations alike are realizing the benefits of this vehicle on

## Commissioner learning about city's past while looking ahead to future

**SANFORD** — Kevin Hipes, Sanford's new city commissioner, has added a string of lunch meetings to his already busy schedule as Florida's regional director for Kimco, a commercial realty corporation. In the last month and a half, he has met with some of Sanford's oldest residents to learn more about the city.

"I've only lived here 12 years, and I want to know what they think," Hipes said. "They've been a wealth of knowledge."

But that's just the beginning for the new District 4 commissioner. Besides an appreciation for Sanford's past, Hipes also has a vision for the city's future. He's

begun meeting with city department managers and other officials to better learn how the city works.

"I see nothing but potential," he said.

Before winning the commission seat in an unopposed election, Hipes served on the Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission for four and a half years.

Sanford's biggest issues, according to Hipes, involve the redevelopment of the downtown and lakefront area, as well as the regional mall, and the city's growing retail base. He wants to put businesses in without destroying Sanford's historic character.

"I love the city, so I'm not going

The boxes are filled mostly with snacks, candy, toiletries, and stationery, but some students decided to make cards and personal letters to the soldiers.

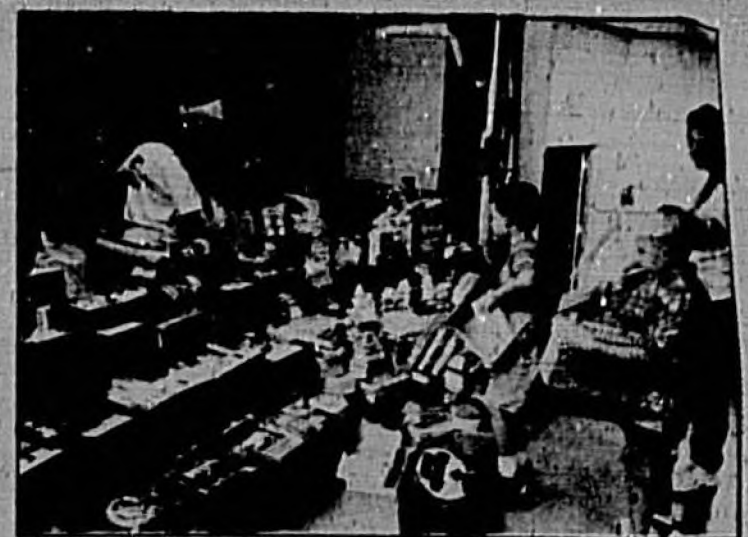
"Kids come up with the best things," said Kim Bridges, the project's sponsor. "They are so sweet and innocent."

## Sanford Historic Trust celebrates city's 125th anniversary with 'Voices'

**SANFORD** — In celebration of Sanford's 125th anniversary, the Sanford Historic Trust presents "Sanford Voices" Thursday at Helen Stairs Theatre in Sanford.

The play portrays the history of early Sanford and takes patrons through a journey ending at present day. It was originally written by Winter Garden resident Jim Howard as part of the 1999 Governor's Summer Program, a summer intensive workshop between the Orlando Theatre Project and Seminole Community College's film program.

The Sanford Historic Trust discovered the play a year ago and approached Howard for the rights

to produce it as part of the city's yearlong anniversary celebration. The Trust received a grant from the Seminole County Arts Council to help defray the cost of the production.

"We want to do something to promote the history of Sanford and give people a little more reason to be Sanford proud," said Tony Daniels, past-vice president

and current member of the Sanford Historic Trust.

In order to accurately depict the city, Howard researched several published accounts, newspaper reports and interviews with the people of Sanford's history. He wrote the play almost entirely in the words of others in a matter of

### Food source deadline May 9

The Sanford and Metro (Oviedo) Churches of Christ are working with a program called Food Source to help the churches and community. This program offers various foods each month at a discounted rate from grocery stores.

Food source is actually a buying program in which high volume purchases enables the company to buy in bulk and distribute at considerable savings. The food will be shipped to the churches on the last Saturday of each month.

The next shipment must be paid by May 9, at a cost of \$25. The suggested menu for May is rib-eye steaks, chicken thighs, hot dogs, meatballs, eggs, tea bags, spaghetti noodles, Romano cheese spaghetti sauce, Velveeta shells and cheese, blueberry nut cereal, cookies, pineapple pie, sweet potato casserole, summer squash casserole, peaches, Vidalia onions, potatoes and bananas.

A meat package may also be purchased for an additional \$20, but may not be purchased without a food package. The meat package for May is sirloin steaks, Black Forest sliced ham, Philly cheese steak meat, hot dogs, ground beef, chicken breasts, chicken thighs and ham and cheese pockets.

**Slick move.** Catch some of the names applying for the Sanford city manager's job? Former Seminole County managers **Gary Kaiser** and **Ron Rabun** submitted their applications. So did current interim city manager **Roger Dixon**, as well as Sanford's community development director **Andrew Van Gaale**.

The curvball of the group, however, was city Planning Director **Jay Marder**. Marder was on no one's list of potential candidates for the job, and those close to him say he hadn't mentioned it until submitting his application.

So what's the deal? Those in the know think Marder pulled off a brilliant defensive play.

**Word Around The Clock** is that Marder's days are — or at were — numbered. Several high-profile mis-

There was speculation about whether Dixon would — or could — actually drop the hammer, but that's history at this point. With Dixon and Marder both applying for the city manager's job, Dixon can't very well fire Marder. Wouldn't look good for a contender for the same job you're applying for.

In effect, Marder may have bought himself a few more months or longer by applying for the city's top spot.

**Six of one, half dozen of another:** There are two theories floating around about who Sanford should choose for its next city manager.

One theory says that Sanford is a unique city — small town charm, with big city issues. Proponents of this theory say Sanford needs someone who is familiar not only with these issues, but has the experience to leverage local and state resources to get the job done. Van Gaale, Marder, Dixon, Kaiser and the other local boys would assumedly have the inside track.

The second theory says that while Sanford is unique, its problems aren't radically different than other cities celebrating 125 years of existence. Those who support this line of thought say Sanford needs someone from outside the region who can bring fresh ideas and, more importantly, isn't already entangled with one of the notorious Sanford cliques.

Which one is the best? Heck if I know. I have trouble deciding between paper or plastic. Ideally, it would be nice if there was a candidate who was familiar with Sanford yet enough of an outsider to bring fresh insight to the issues facing the city.

In the end, the decision must be made on the man — or woman — not the theory.

**On the hot seat:** They'll probably show me for printing this, but here it is — public record.

Those sitting on the committees to narrow the field of 85 city manager candidates down to 10 include planning and zoning chairman **Ross Robert**, former mayor **Betty D. Smith**, businessman **John Williams**, planning and zoning member **Michael Skat**, former city commissioner **Lon Howell**, Lance Abney, **Lindsey Oyewale**, former school board member **Larry Strickler**, *Seminole Herald* correspondent **Marva Hawkins**, and former community development director **Charles A. Rowe**. **Dr. Thomas Kelly**, is the Range Rider, the consultant hired by the city to assist with the process.

If you feel strongly about what qualities you want in your next city manager, let those folks know. The city commission will make the final selection from the list of 10 this committee decided on, so as always, give your commissioner a ring, too.

And just for the record, I have no influence over long-time *Herald* writer Marva Hawkins' decision in this matter. My business card may read editor/publisher, but Marva's The Boss.

### Two officers took time to be kind and compassionate

To the editor:

My husband and I have just completed a long, arduous journey. We just buried my mother who lived 10 years with Alzheimer's disease. Mother spent six years with us in our home. Last August, we moved her into an apartment on Lake Monroe, where she lived with her full-time caregiver.

Each day after teaching, I would go and visit with momma. I would sing to her,

read to her, and pray with her. As her death approached, my emotions became very strong. Many a night after leaving the town and Lake Apartments, I would find myself driving up Park Avenue with tears streaming down my face. Not once, but twice, I was stopped by the Sanford Police.

The first time, I did not come to a complete stop at the stop sign on the corner of Park Avenue and Ninth Street. After checking my license and registration, the officer was concerned enough to ask me if I was going to be OK. I told him of my momma's approaching death and was extremely con-

forted when he replied, "I am very sorry about your mother and I am sorry for the suffering you are experiencing."

The second incident also occurred on Park Avenue. This time, I was pulled over for driving too slowly and for weaving the car. I was in a daze and sorrow after visiting momma has caused this carelessness. Again, after showing my license and registration, I was asked if I would be OK. Again, this police officer also offered his condolences and genuinely showed that he cared about our family sorrow.

I write to praise especially these two officers and the entire

Sanford Police Department. Certainly, these officers are trained that giving tickets is not their only duty. These dedicated public officials displayed professionalism and also compassion. Too many of us are quick to condemn the officers who write us a ticket. I am here to say that I met two young officers who carried out their duty efficiently, but they also did not forget that I was a human being who was suffering the approaching death of my mother. These two officers took the time to be compassionate and kind. I am very impressed.

## The great debate over the American empire

The first decade of the 21st century, like the first decade of the 20th, is an age of empire. A hundred years ago, however, there were many empires. They included both the overseas empires of the national states of Western Europe — particularly those of Britain, France, Portugal and the Netherlands — and the overland empires of the multinational states ruled by the Hapsburg, Romanov and Ottoman dynasties. Today, there is only one empire — the global empire of the United States.

So begins the first article, by professor James Kyrth of Swarthmore College, in the current (and important) issue of *The National Interest*, the self-proclaimed "realist" journal. That means former Secretary of State Henry Kissinger is the co-chairman of the editorial board and former Secretary of Defense James Schlesinger is the publisher.

There are a half-dozen other articles on American empire in this Spring 2003 issue. Next to it on some newsstands is Harper's, with the coverline: "The Economics of Empire: How the White House, the

World Bank and the IMF impoverish the World on America's Behalf," by William Finnegan. In last Sunday's *New York Times Magazine*, the British "neo-imperialist" author Niall Ferguson writes provocatively under the headline: "The Empire Slinks Back. Why Americans don't really have what it takes to rule the world."

The daily conversation here in the empire's war capital has retocused on domestic matters, taxes, health care, budget cuts and all that. Iraq, intellectually at least, is over, but the critical debate on the meaning and consequences of our first announced "pre-emptive" war is just beginning. That discussion begins with the fact that the war demonstrated that the United States now has military supremacy and reach unmatched in history. In another section of *The New York Times* last Sunday, Gregg Easterbrook of *The Atlantic Monthly* wrote: "The global arms race is over. Other nations are not even trying to match American armed force, because they are so far behind they have no chance of catching up."

Among the demonstrators of the weapons gap cited by Easterbrook is the fact that in the Balkan and Iraq wars, neither the Serbs nor the Iraqis sent a single warplane into the air. They knew the outdated jets would be shot out of the sky by the Americans before they got their wheels up. That's the good news. The bad news, possibly, he says, is that North Korea has shown that the only way to hold off the Americans may be to have nuclear weapons. Next to do that, his guess is Iran.

Beginning there, Ferguson argues that winning is American, staying is not. The United States, he says, has the power but not the stamina. "It's just that the young (American) elites have no desire whatsoever to spend their lives running a screwed-up, sun-scorched sandpit like Iraq. America's brightest and best aspire not to govern Mesopotamia, but to manage MTV." He notes that 3.8 million Americans do live abroad, but almost all of them are in Canada, Mexico, Europe and Israel — and most of the rest are usually short-termers.

Finnegan, too, makes the point that U.S. hegemony is not about controlling land or nations — at least not in the meaning of "conquest." It's the economy, stupid. He writes:

The... of... American commercial supremacy is being done in the name of freedom.

"Imperial temptations" is the title of a *National Interest* essay by Jack Snyder, professor of international relations at Columbia University. His conclusion is a warning for President Bush and his strategists.

"Speaking in New York this past October, (National Security Adviser Condoleezza Rice) said that the aim of the Bush strategy is to dissuade any potential adversary from pursuing a military buildup in the hope of surpassing, or equaling, the power of the United States and our allies." Today, no combination of adversaries can hope to equal America's power under any circumstances. However, if they fear the unbridled use of America's power, they may perceive overwhelming incentives to wield weapons of terror and mass destruction to deter America's offensive tactics of self-defense. Indeed the history of... empire suggests that a general strategy of preventive war is likely to bring about precisely the outcome that President Bush and Rice wish to avoid."

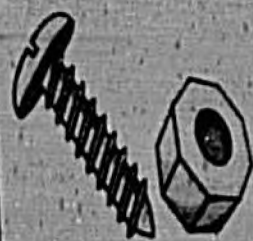

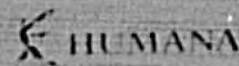

 to overdevelop it," Hipes said.  
 But he reminds business owners opposed to redevelopment that "in every redevelopment, there's medicine before the cure," meaning that a drop in business due to construction is sometimes a necessary evil.  
 Mayor Brady Lessard has worked with Hipes at two city commission meetings so far. He said Hipes' background in finance and real estate will be a huge asset to the city commission.  
 "The economy is in uncertain times - he can help us in determining how we spend money and save money and also how to better develop the tax base," Lessard said.  
 Whitey Eckstein, the former District 4 commissioner, retired for health reasons after almost 17 years in office. Eckstein said Hipes and the city commission will work well together.  
 "The whole commission is full of vision," Eckstein said. "It's a young commission. In a lot of ways, I was a little bit old-fashioned."  
 Kevin [Hipes] is very bright and he has a lot of experience with leases and utilities and infrastructure. You couldn't ask for anybody better for Sanford."  
 Hipes said he moved to Central Florida from New Jersey because he wanted a better place to raise his three children. His family attends the Metro Church of Christ in Oviedo where Hipes preaches on occasion. He said his faith in Christ motivates him to be honest in all of his business transactions.  
 Hipes describes himself as a people person who wants to learn from differences of opinion. He said he hopes his driving personality will spread throughout Sanford's city government.  
 "But I can't dictate how to operate," he said. "I want to let people use their strengths."  
 In helping to develop Sanford, Hipes said he plans to follow a motto a former boss at Kinco taught him: "Think it through, and treat it like it's your own."

### GymTime for Kids playground with a purpose

**G**ymTime for Kids is a "playground with a purpose" for both children and parents alike.

The concept of GymTime for Kids, an indoor playground that focuses on child development, began in 1997 with the opening of its Casselberry location. As the enrollment demands grew, so did GymTime, opening a

playroom in Lake Mary in 2001.

GymTime for Kids offers 45-minute or one-hour classes for children 4 months to 8 years old. Each class is geared toward the child's age group and abilities. During the structured "playtime," children are exposed to several different types of activities to build their listening skills, head control, motor skills and development and the art of taking turns.

## Curves helps women stay in shape one station at a time

The sign hanging outside the storefront says "Grand Opening Curves." The facade of a store holds a gym, Curves for Women, where Lois Fenner and her daughter, Lori Wojciehoski run the business of helping women get into shape.

"We wanted to do something we enjoyed," said Fenner. "We were in real estate at the time and didn't like it. Now we enjoy coming to work."

This particular gym opened in the middle of February and has seen great progress from its patrons. Since opening, members have lost a total of 100 inches and that is thanks to the particular system Curves uses.

Curves uses a system called Quick Fit, which combines a cardiovascular strength training, fat burning and muscle building workout in 30 minutes. Members rotate the stations they work in and have a stretch period after each one to ensure they will not be sore later. The heart rate is also measured every seven to eight minutes to make sure members do not over exert themselves.

"The time goes by quickly," said Fenner. "They [members] talk and visit with each other."

Each person has a figure analysis done where measurements are taken and goals are set for the planned weight and body fat loss. Results should show in about a month and that is when the staff takes measurements again to see the progress. Little purple balloons are placed on the wall so that everyone can see how well they are doing.

After Fenner saw the progress her sister was making going to Curves, the mother and daughter team decided to open a branch themselves.

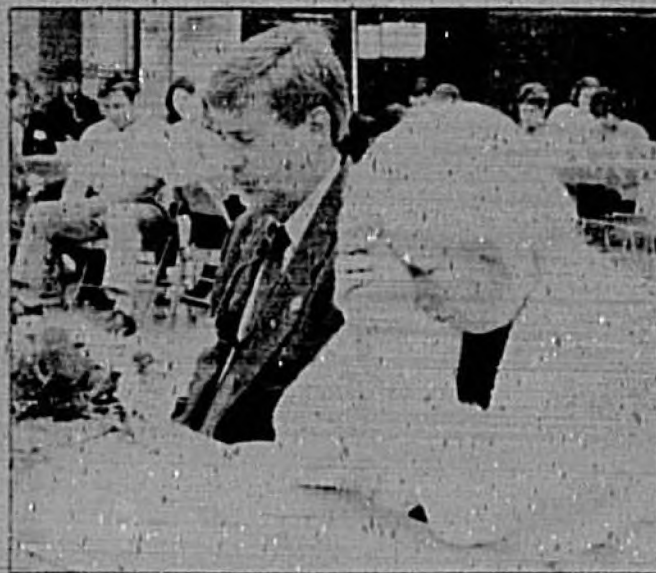

# Spring season going well for Lake Mary athletes

**LAKE MARY** — The Spring Sports Season has proved to be a good one for the Lake Mary High School Athletic Program as well as individual athletes on the collegiate level.

The Lake Mary softball team has been ranked in the Top Five in the Class AA State Polls all season and carried a 24-3 record and the No. 1 seed into this week's AA-District 2 Tournament at Seminole High School.

Leading the way for the Rams, who were to have played Deland in the district semifinals with the winner advancing to the finals and earning an automatic bid to this week's regionals, have been the pitching trio of Olivia Peterson, Ashley Sharp and Beth Laurence, as well as batters Heron, Leah Kelly, Kristen Patton, Caitlin

Mahoney and Marie Keeney.

The baseball team did not have as good a regular season as it had hoped for, going just 10-12, but the Rams' offense exploded in the final game of the AA-District 2 tournament at Daytona Semoran Memorial Stadium as the No. 3 seeds upset second-seeded Lake Brantley 19-1 (8-8-1) to advance to the Championship Game or possible No. 1 State-ranked Oviedo and an automatic bid to this coming week's Regionals.

Center D.J. Ackley struck out in the victory, completing his record to 9-0 on the season. Senior Christian Robado went 2-for-4 with three RBI, while junior Mitchell Chubb went 3-for-4 with a pair of RBI and junior Brian Richardson drove in a run.

With Lake Mary's record in expected to go well in the district meet at Seminole this past week, led by Regionals' Campbell

and Angie Pressey.

The boys lacrosse team is also in the midst of a super season, having finished second to Oviedo in the Seminole Athletic Conference, but earning the top seed in District 2B with an 11-4 record. In final 2B standings were Lake Brantley (6-8), Winter Springs (4-8), Umatilla (4-12) and Seminole (0-13).

The Rams then won the district tournament by crushing Umatilla 18-0, and edging Lake Brantley 9-8 in an exciting Championship Game.

Lake Mary was to have hosted Winter Park in the Regionals on Wednesday, but the game was postponed due to bad weather.

On the collegiate level, freshmen Ashley Bitar and Catherine Weyer have been the contributors to a Seminole Community College softball team that went 7-12 in the regular season and was to have played in the state tournament this weekend in Kissimmee.

Bitar, a first baseman, catcher, finished second on the team in hitting (.473), hits (54) and RBI (29) and was selected to the Mid-Florida Conference second team in a vote of the conference's coaches.

At the University of Central Florida, three freshmen from Lake Mary, Lake Mary High grads Kyle and Ryan Bono and Bishop Moore's Drew Britner, have emerged as leaders for the Golden Knights.

Kyle, a pitcher, third baseman, has made the biggest impact, going 1-1 with the club's 10-11 record.

The right-hander is 4-2 with two saves and an amazingly low 0.66 earned run average in 29 relief appearances for the 27-20 Knights. In 29 2/3 innings, the right-hander has allowed just 16 hits and three runs, two earned, while striking out 40 and walking only eight. Opponents are hitting a minuscule .160 against him.

For good reason, he has also gone 1-for-3 (.333 average) with a walk in four plate appearances, including one start at third base.

His twin brother, Ryan, a catcher, has also bounced back from a slow start due to an

ankle injury, hitting .278 with seven doubles and a triple, 50 on-base hits and driving in 10 runs.

Ryan's emergence has allowed Bergman to move Britner, also a catcher, to third base, solving a big problem for UCF. Britner, the son of former Major League catcher and Rollins coach Jim's batting .274, including four homers, and has scored 15 runs and driven in 21.

In order to accomplish these and other goals, instructors lead the classes through puppet shows, songs, dances, relays and games.

"It's fun for the kids," said Erika Patel, mother of 9-month-old Shaan Patel.

"They have a great time and can hang out with kids their age."

At each age-level, the classes become progressively more structured, while still maintaining the element of fun.

The older age groups focus on sports and team participation to prepare them for participating in community sports.

"It's not free play, there is a method to our madness," said Jeff Wilson, owner of GymTime for Kids. "The parents and children can walk away from the process having learned something."

"Our first and foremost intent is that we provide development in the program," he added. "We are instructors and provide a place so children can develop."

For Wilson, whose grandfather was a school principal, mother was a teacher and father was a banker, opening a business that caters to children and their parents seemed like a natural progression.

"I've combined the things my family has done into the business," said Wilson, whose wife, Julie, assists with the business. "I have a knack of connecting with kids. I'm playful so I'm able to let them feel a child, even to some and let them and be treated like people, not kids."

The atmosphere at GymTime for Kids is one that supports learning and fun with colorful toys, decorative wall paintings and upbeat music. The atmosphere also gives members an opportunity to play games and with other children while making
