# Eradication Program Reduces Measles Cases

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — Measles cases this year are only 5 per cent of the number reported in 1969 as a result of a massive eradication program, officials reported today.

The Communicable Disease Center said the number of ordinary "red measles" were reported across the nation during the first six weeks this year compared with 24,000 in the same period in 1969.

Furthermore, the cases reported in 1970 were estimated to be only one-fourth the actual

number, a spokesman said. The impressive reduction was attributed to an extensive eradication program which was based on inoculating selected groups across the country.

Part of that program was crash immunization in the midst of epidemics—such as is now under way in Chicago, a spokesman said.

"We try to surround an epidemic with vaccination," he said, "and strike measles whenever it raises its ugly head."

"We're just not having mass

ive outbreaks of measles any more, by-and-by everyone has done such a terrific job around the country. But where an outbreak does occur, we're capable of eradicating it and handling it."

In Chicago, where 32 doctors and advisers began mass immunizations Thursday, officials reported 20 measles cases during the first 45 days of the year. The CDC said 667 cases have been reported in Chicago since October 1967.

Officials in Chicago said they recorded 46 cases in all last year.

As a result, he said, the number of cases during the first six weeks this year was 11,000 per cent from last year—down to 3,000 in 1969.

The measles virus was first discovered in 1952.

Dissatisfied with those teachers who struck, some parents are discussing the possibility of having their children "walk-out" if when the news is set, they stress a teacher who was one of those who struck, and then returned to school, "I don't want my children taught by a striking teacher," one mother telephoned.

Seminole County schools are closed today and Wednesday for a pupil holiday. However, teachers are working during the two-day holiday.

Mason Wharton, chairman of the Seminole County School Board, announced the decision to close county schools at the board's meeting with teachers and the Seminole-Orange legislative delegation last night in the Civic Center.

"The board is unhappy about what has happened, Wharton said.

"There will be a two-day lock-out to give the board time to see what is happening."

The board instructed its attorney, Douglas Stremont, to negotiate the strike's suit against the FEA.

"Our school board wants to join in that suit if it helps to bring the teachers back into the classroom," Stremont said.

The school board met yesterday to decide what could be done to bring the teachers back into the classrooms. These conclusions were reached:

The school board could enter suit against the individual teachers. Resignations that were turned into the Seminole County School Board that they would not be effective until the next regular meeting of the school board.

"This is an act of civil disobedience and a poor example for the children," said A. L. Keeth, school board member. Keeth was referring to breaking teaching contracts and ignoring the current court orders.
