Lawmakers keep the heat on drug trade

Seminole County Sheriff Don Eslinger was among law enforcement officers from seven Central Florida counties recently as U.S. Senator Bob Graham and U.S. Representative John Mica launched a new effort against drug trafficking with the primary target being the increase in drug activities in Central Florida.

growing Central Florida drug problem. "For the past several years," he said, "our community and our kids have fallen victim to drug traffickers. As a result we have seen record numbers of our children dying from heroin overdoses."

Orange and Osceola counties led the state in heroin deaths per capita in 1996.

"Law enforcement personnel in Central Florida have repeatedly told me that they are being overwhelmed by the explosion of drug trafficking in the I-4 corridor," said Graham. "We should not underestimate the threat. Drug pushers have an extensive communications network, almost unlimited funds with which to pursue illegal activities, and use high-tech equipment to avoid detection. Only by combining our efforts do we have any hope of stopping them in their tracks."

Last November, Congress approved \$4 million to fund a Central Florida High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA). Graham and Mica, the leading advocates of this important measure, said the new HIDTA would be a major boost to anti-drug efforts along Florida's so-called "I-4 Corridor," an area that stretches from Daytona Beach on the Atlantic Coast to the Tampa/St. Petersburg area on the gulf.

The Central Florida HIDTA will include Seminole, Volusia, Orange, Osceola, Polk, Hillsborough and Pinellas counties.

Mica said the move is a good first step in fighting the

rest of the nation, and Orlando has earned the unfortunate honor of having the second highest number of cocaine and heroin deaths in Florida." He

New exhibits showcased at Geneva Museum event

GENEVA - It's a small building but it holds the history of a community that dates back to the Second Seminole War.

On Sunday, March 29, from 2 until 4 p.m., the Geneva Historical Society will open the doors to the Geneva Museum for a special open house, showcasing new exhibits in the building that first opened in 1966.

According to information contained in the museum, early settlers of Harney Cove, later named Geneva, date back to before 1862, during the War Between the States. Some were soldiers from the Indian wars who returned to build homes.

Fort Lane, established in 1837, was built on the west shore of Lake Harney, to fight the Seminoles who were camped on the opposite shore. The lake was named for Lt. Col. William S. Harney, who found the area on an expedition out of Fort Mellon (Sanford).

Harney reported to Gen. Thomas Jesup, on Nov. 10, 1837, "There is a considerable Indian town on the east side of the lake. Landed and saw fresh tracks and a large trail leading easterly from the village..."

A map of Harney's journey is in the National Archives in Washington, D.C. A copy of the map is mounted and hung in the Geneva Museum.

Harney sent Lt. Davis back to Jesup with a full report and the map. Davis' report contained the following information: "A landing was made with 20 men at the Indian town on the east shore of Lake Harney, where 20 or 30 Indian huts were situated in a place strikingly beautiful. Cooking utensils and other Indian furniture were found in and about the huts. No doubt he entertained from various signs that Indians were there the day before. Six or seven acres have been cultivated in corn and pumpkins. From head of Lake Harney easterly, the eye stretches over great extents of low savannas and appearances indicate the presence of another large lake

not far distant, or the beginning of the everglades..."

The town that Harney discovered was the camp of Seminole leader Osceola. The town that grew up around Fort Lane, north of Geneva, was named for the Seminole.

"It's a wonderful, wonderful story," said Pat Vincent, a member of the historical society who has volunteered her time to do typing for exhibits to be seen at the open house. The displays tell the story of the growth of the town from the 1860s to present day.

The major industries of the area, cattle, citrus and fishing are all represented in the museum. Donations from prominent residents who have ventured outside of Central Florida add a flavor of worldly events to the displays, and relate Geneva to its place in modern history.

The Geneva Historical and Genealogical Society was organized in 1952. One of the first projects of the group was to build a museum, which became possible when two charter members donated a lot on

First Street, next to the community building, in 1965. The building was built with funds donated for that purpose, and dedicated in 1966.

The museum is open every Sunday from October to May, with arrangements being made

for schools and other organizations that want to tour the facility. The March 29 event is a special occasion which will also include a living history native village set up by Geneva resident and living history

"The success and strength of our partnerships are measured not only by the recognition we have attained in building our attractive community, but more importantly in the manner in which we respond to the challenges we face. continued. "With this HIDTA designation, we will now be able to bring increased law enforcement pressure to bear against illegal drug traffickers."

In some areas, anti-drug crackdowns are already producing results. Polk County reported over 700 police seizures of dangerous methamphetamines in the first five months of 1997.

From fiscal year 1996 to 1997, Volusia County saw a 20 percent increase in narcotic-related arrests, and a 500

percent increase in the amount of crack cocaine and currency seized.

On another matter, Graham has announced the Department of Justice's decision to award a \$900,000 grant to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to fund the forensic DNA laboratory improvement program.

The program is to increase both the capabilities and capacity of state and local forensic laboratories to conduct state-of-the-art DNA testing in support of the investigation and adjudication of violent crime.

Raines should be a lock to make Baseball Hall-of-Fame

SANFORD - When you think of potential Hall-of-Famers heading for Cooperstown, you have a few that immediately come to mind.

In the next few years, George Brett, Robin Yount, Nolan Ryan and Eddie Murray are among the locks.

Then, you have active players who won't be around much longer but are shoe-ins like Tony Gwynn, Paul Molitor, Ricky Henderson and Cal Ripken.

Isn't someone missing from that list? Someone who has had an awesome career but isn't talked about when these kinds of discussions come around?

There's one but he isn't looked at as one of baseball's immortals unless you live in Sanford.

Tim Raines should be a Hall-of-Fame lock. Guaranteed.

Look back on his career. He is a former National League batting champion. He's also an all-star game Most Valuable Player.

He earned a world series ring two years ago with the New York Yankees and is solidly entrenched in third place for the most stolen bases in the long history of the game and also leads in all-time stolen base percentage.

If he stays healthy, he could become the most unheralded player in baseball history to achieve 3,000 hits. He has 2,439 right now and has an outside shot at 3,000 if Yankee owner George Steinbrenner can get over his fixation with Darryl Strawberry who The Boss is convinced is still the greatest Yankee since Babe Ruth.

Of course it would help if he could lift his career batting average - currently sitting at .298 - to an even .300 but, if he can possibly stay healthy, he's hitting the ball as well as ever.

Rock might not be a first-year lock; he'll always have the sanctimonious writers who vote for these things harping on the drug scandals of 1986. Then again, those are the same writers who refuse to vote for Joe Jackson and Pete Rose even if they are declared eligible for the Hall.

(By the way, two players in the Hall - Ty Cobb and Tris Speaker - were basically forced to retire by then-commissioner Judge Kenesaw Mountain Landis for having thrown insignificant games at the end of the 1927 regular season).

Except for that one slip, Rock has always handled himself with dignity and class and there are few professional athletes who give more of themselves back to their hometown than Rock has given to Sanford.

Every year, he is a fixture at Seminole High's homecoming football games. You can always see him in the stands at local basketball games or playing in the Alumni Baseball Game and he always has a moment for the children of his hometown.

That's something that's lacking in athletes today, but Rock has never assaulted his coach, never been in trouble around Sanford and has given something back the entire time.

That's a rare quality when you can combine class, dignity, loyalty and 2,439 hits

The squad will be coached by Seminole's Bob Trainsa who won the Seminole Athletic Conference title this season. Oviedo's Ed Kerahner and Lake Howell's Steve Kohn.

It will mark the first time in several years that Seminole County players participated in any sort of all-star competition.

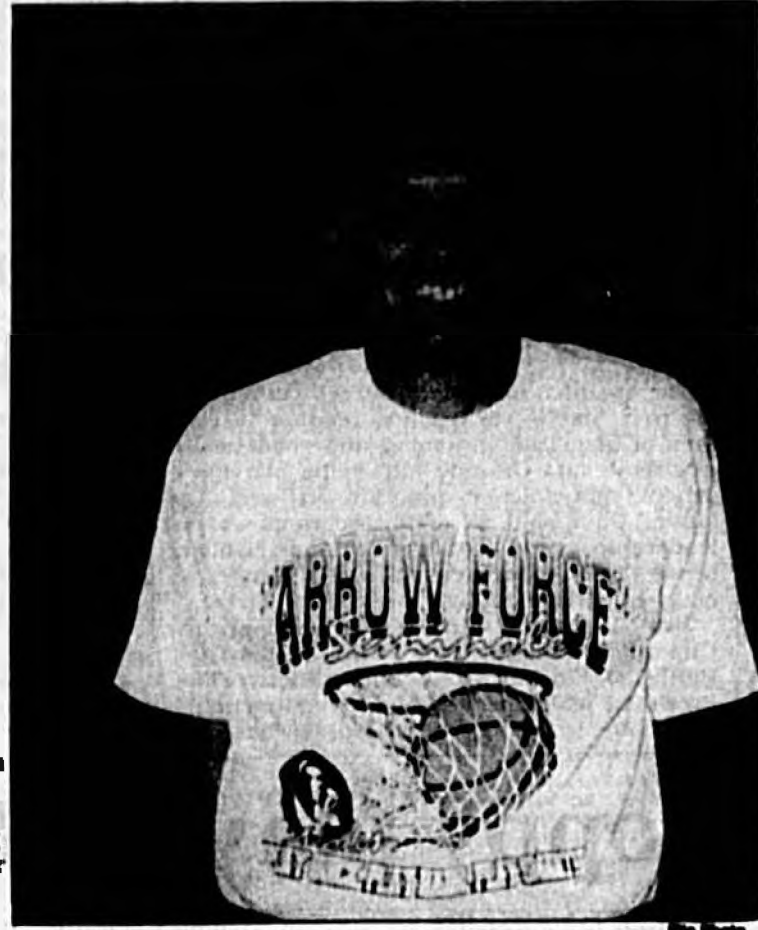
"We came up with the idea to have the top 10 seniors from each county so we could feature the top 40 players from Central Florida for a two-day basketball extravaganza," said Packer.

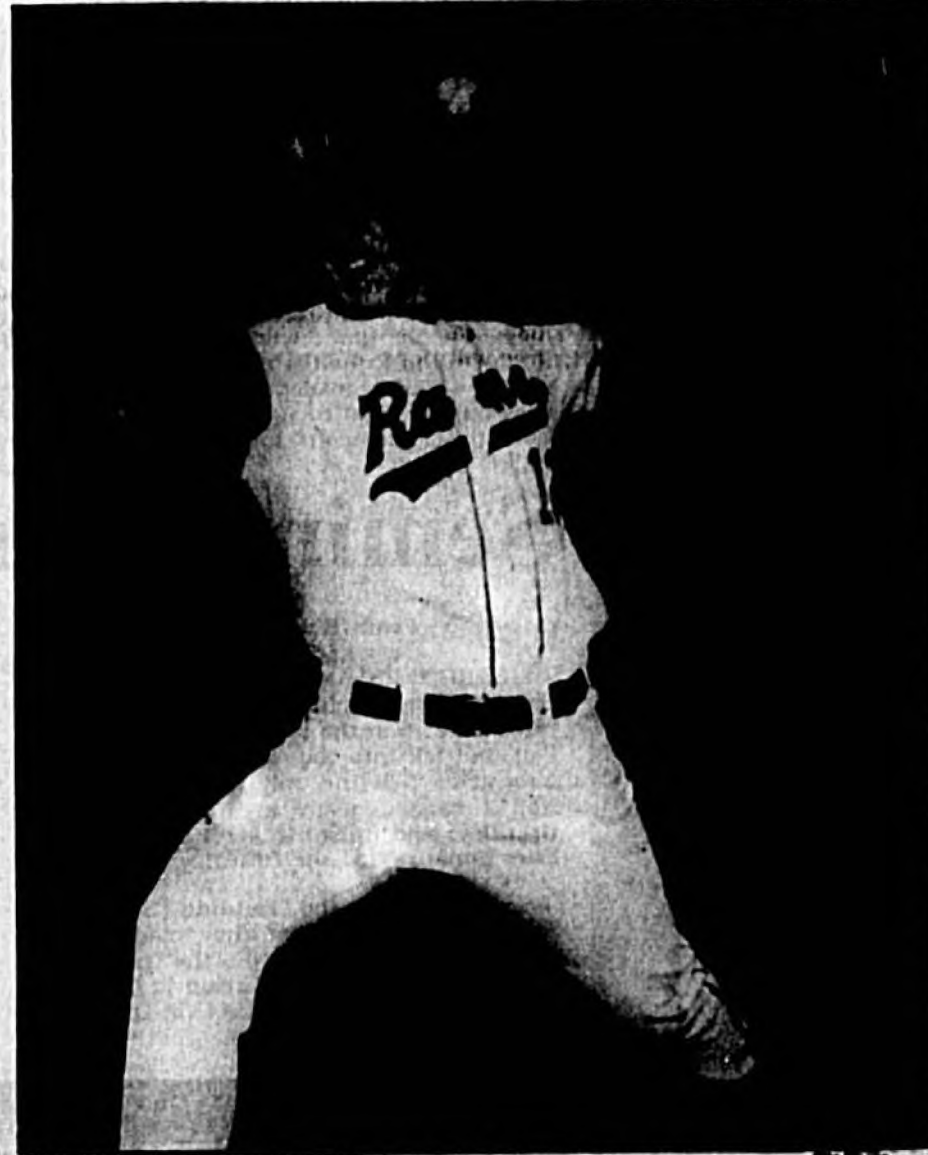
LONGWOOD - It almost seems as if a team can go from first to last place in the Class 6A-District 3 baseball standings these days in only one game.

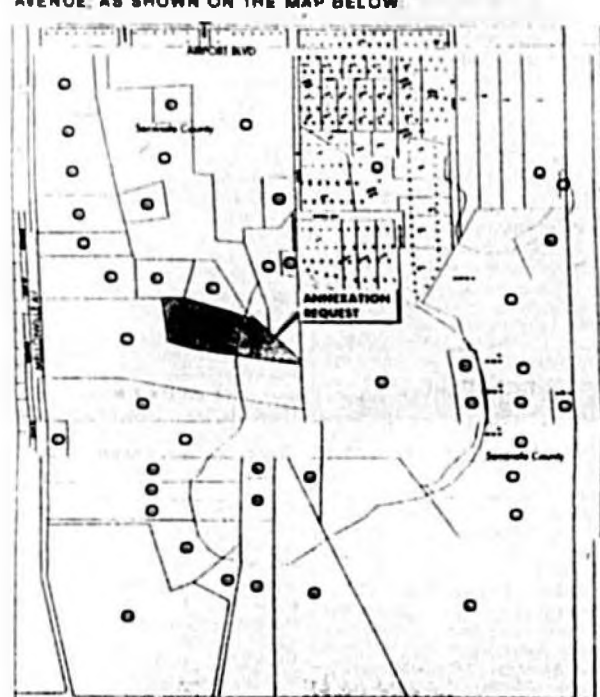

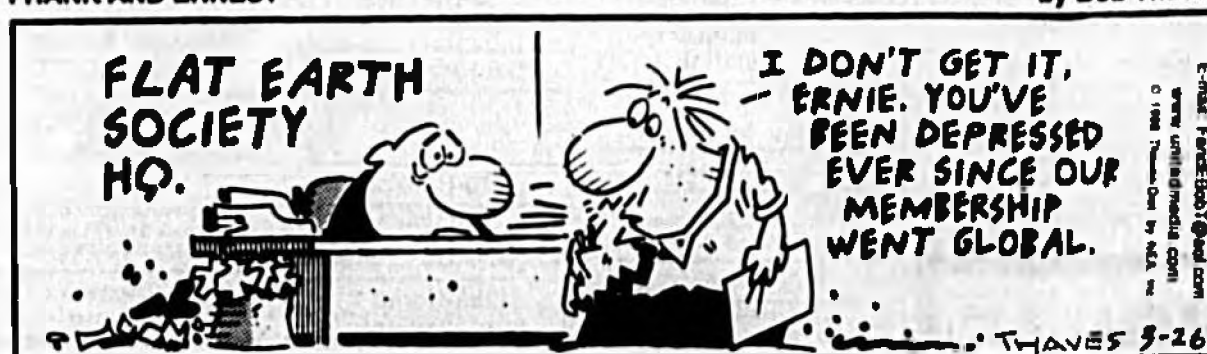

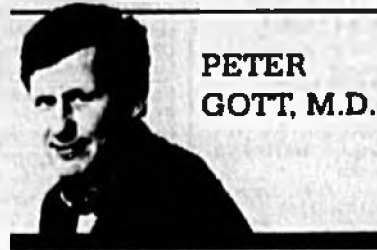

Could embedded needle cause pain?

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: About a year ago, I began having shoulder pain. Medicine didn't help. Eventually, I had an X-ray that showed a broken needle deep in the shoulder muscle. At that point, I recalled having had intramuscular injections several years ago for a serious infection. The radiologist doesn't believe that the needle in my shoulder is the cause of my pain. Should I just accept this or see another doctor?

DEAR READER: While no one can say for sure whether the broken needle in your shoulder is the cause of your pain, I'd certainly be suspicious: two and two usually equals four.

If I were you, I'd check with a surgeon. Foreign bodies are often difficult to find and remove at the time of surgery, but in my opinion, you need a surgical opinion at least. If the specialist agrees to operate, you'll have a tough decision to make: whether to risk tricky surgery or simply leave well enough alone. If I had shoulder pain and an embedded needle, I'd probably choose surgery as the best means of relief.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Ever since I took antibiotics for a lung infection, I've noticed a black coating on my tongue. While this doesn't hurt, it alarms me. In the past, after requiring antibiotics, I've often had a white coating on my tongue, but this is new. My doctor says not to worry about it.

DEAR READER: The mouth contains bacteria and yeasts, which normally exist in a healthy competition. The bacteria prevent overgrowth of yeasts, and vice versa.

This delicate balance is often upset by antibiotics. The drugs kill large numbers of bacteria, but do not affect the yeasts a whit. Consequently, antibiotic therapy is commonly associated with yeast infections of the mouth, intestine and reproductive tract.

If you required a prolonged course of antibiotic therapy, your black tongue is probably the result. While many cases of yeast overgrowth respond to nonprescription remedies such as lactobacillus products (containing harmless bacteria), some patients need to use prescription drugs, such as "swish and swallow" Mycostatin.

Your doctor is correct. Given time, your bacteria/yeast balance is sure to return to normal. However, if you are concerned (or have pain and swelling of the tongue), I believe that prescrip-

tion swish-and-swallow is in order. Follow this up with your family doctor.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 60-year-old husband is in good health, except for two glaring problems. He has an ulcer for which he takes Tagamet, and recently his breasts have become somewhat enlarged and very tender. What could cause this?

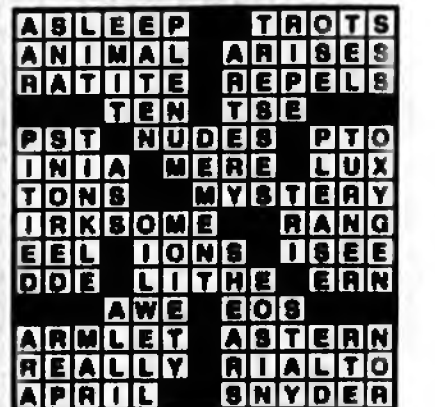
DEAR READER: Breast swelling and sensitivity in men is called gynecomastia. Although the condition is common in adolescents (because of the increased production of sex hormones), it is less frequent in middle- and old-age.

Sometimes, in older men, gynecomastia is caused by growths or tumors. However, in most cases, this unpleasant but harmless situation is a side effect of medications. Tagamet is such a drug.

I suggest that your husband discuss this with his doctor. Perhaps a change in medicine is in order. For example, Zantac — an anti-ulcer drug that, like Tagamet, is available without a prescription — might be a suitable substitute.

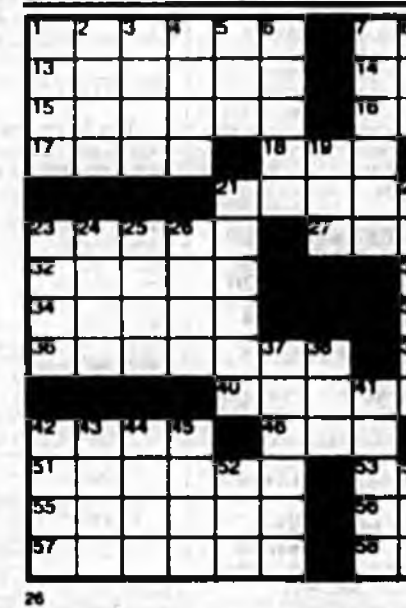

WIN AT BRIDGE

Three bids explained more fully

By Phillip Alder

Last Thursday, I mentioned three bids that are used by (virtually) everyone in the tournament world: the Jacoby transfer bid, the splinter bid and Roman Key Card Blackwood. Over the next three Thursdays, let's look at each of them.

In the United States, the Jacoby transfer bid was devised by David Carter and subsequently developed by Oswald Jacoby. (It was independently conceived by Olle Willner from Stockholm, Sweden.)

In its simplest form, after partner opens one no-trump, a response of two diamonds shows at least five hearts, and a response of two hearts shows at least five spades. The purpose is two-

fold: The stronger hand becomes declarer if the contract is played in the responder's major, and — the more important plus, in my view — it allows the responder to show a two-suiter below the level of three no-trump.

Here is an illustrative deal. South starts with a transfer bid showing spades, then tells North about his second suit. (Playing old-fashioned methods, it would begin 1 NT-3♠-3 NT. The sequence shown is much better.)

Against the brilliantly bid seven diamonds, West leads the heart king.

You are faced with a club loser, which must disappear on the spades. After winning the first trick with dummy's heart ace, draw trumps and play four rounds of spades, discarding a club from dummy on the third and trumping the last. Ruff a heart to return to hand, then discard dummy's last club on the established spade five. Wonderful!
