

STATE TO CARRY ON IN FIGHT TO GET TAX REPEAL

Speakers of Legislature Are to Urge States of Country Not to Commit Themselves To Repeal Inheritance Plan

JACKSONVILLE, March 10.—The country has not heard the first of the movement to effect repeal of the Federal inheritance tax, in reality the fight is just beginning according to the Florida State Chamber of Commerce, and the next few months probably will witness a determined move to have the courts pass upon its constitutionality.

A committee of speakers of state legislatures meeting in Washington Saturday issued a report urging legislatures throughout the country not to take steps that would permanently commit them to the joint inheritance levy plan under the Federal inheritance tax.

Speaker Hugh D. Merrill, of the Alabama legislature, has declared he will ask a special session of the Alabama legislature to authorize steps to test the constitutionality of the law.

In the meantime Florida is not idle. Directors of the State Chamber in quarterly session at Gainesville Saturday instructed its Legislative Committee to investigate the feasibility of a test suit and to report on the manner in which it should be instituted. Col. Peter O. Knight, of Tampa, whose opposition to the inheritance tax and his campaign for its repeal has attracted the attention of the entire country, is chairman of this committee and it is regarded as certain a test suit will be one of the principal topics to be discussed at the All Florida Congress on Palm Beach April 10-11.

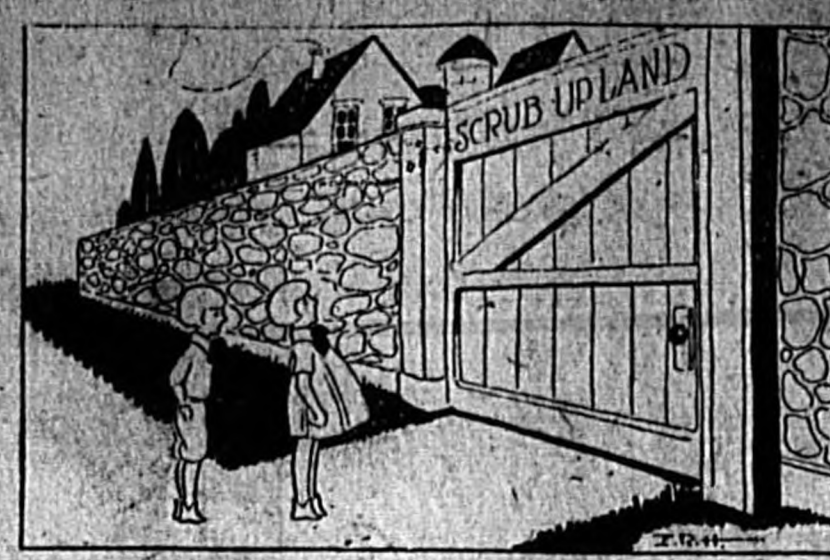

Ringling Planting Many Citrus Trees In West Florida

MILFORD, Fla., 10.—As another step in the development of thousands of acres of agricultural lands in eastern Santa Rosa and Duval counties, the Ringling & White Company has set out 92,000 satsuma orange trees on a 900-acre tract of two miles. Other planting under way includes 100,000 grape vines, 100,000 in another 900-acre tract, the Spanish Trail for a distance of two miles. Other planting under way includes eighty acres of grapes, thirty acres of paper shell pecans and thirty acres of blueberries while sixty-five acres are being devoted to Irish potatoes.

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FLORIDA SCHOOL SWIM CONTESTS SCHEDULED MAY 1

Annual Meet To Be Held In Rollins College Course At Lake Virginia, Winter Park; Many Entries Are Expected

WINTER PARK, Fla., Mar. 11.—(AP)—Ray Greene, Florida Amateur Athletic Union Commissioner and organizer of the Florida state interscholastic swimming championships, who directs the meet annually at Winter Park, has announced that the meet this year will be held on May 1 next on the Rollins College course on Lake Virginia.

According to the announcement high school boys and girls, followers of the aquatic sport, throughout the state, have already begun their training for the event and many inquiries have already been received by the commissioner regarding the championships.

Great rivalry is displayed each year and the championship has always been determined by the last events. Last year the boys from St. Petersburg won in their class with 31 points to their credit, J. Hall of this team being the individual high scorer. Hillsborough high boys of Tampa took second place with 17 points and Duval high of Jacksonville and Miami high tied for third place with 15 points.

In the girls class Orlando high carried off first honors with 48 points with Virginia Lawrence making the high individual score of 15 points; St. Petersburg was second with 23 points and Hillsborough high was third with 19 points.

Several new records were established in the championships here last year and Commissioner Greene is expecting that further new marks will be set in this sphere of interscholastic sports.

The course at Rollins College is considered one of the best in South. It affords excellent facilities for this state-wide meet. In fostering this annual carnival, Rollins College is giving the aquatic water athletes of the high schools of the state a chance to gain recognition of their ability in this field.

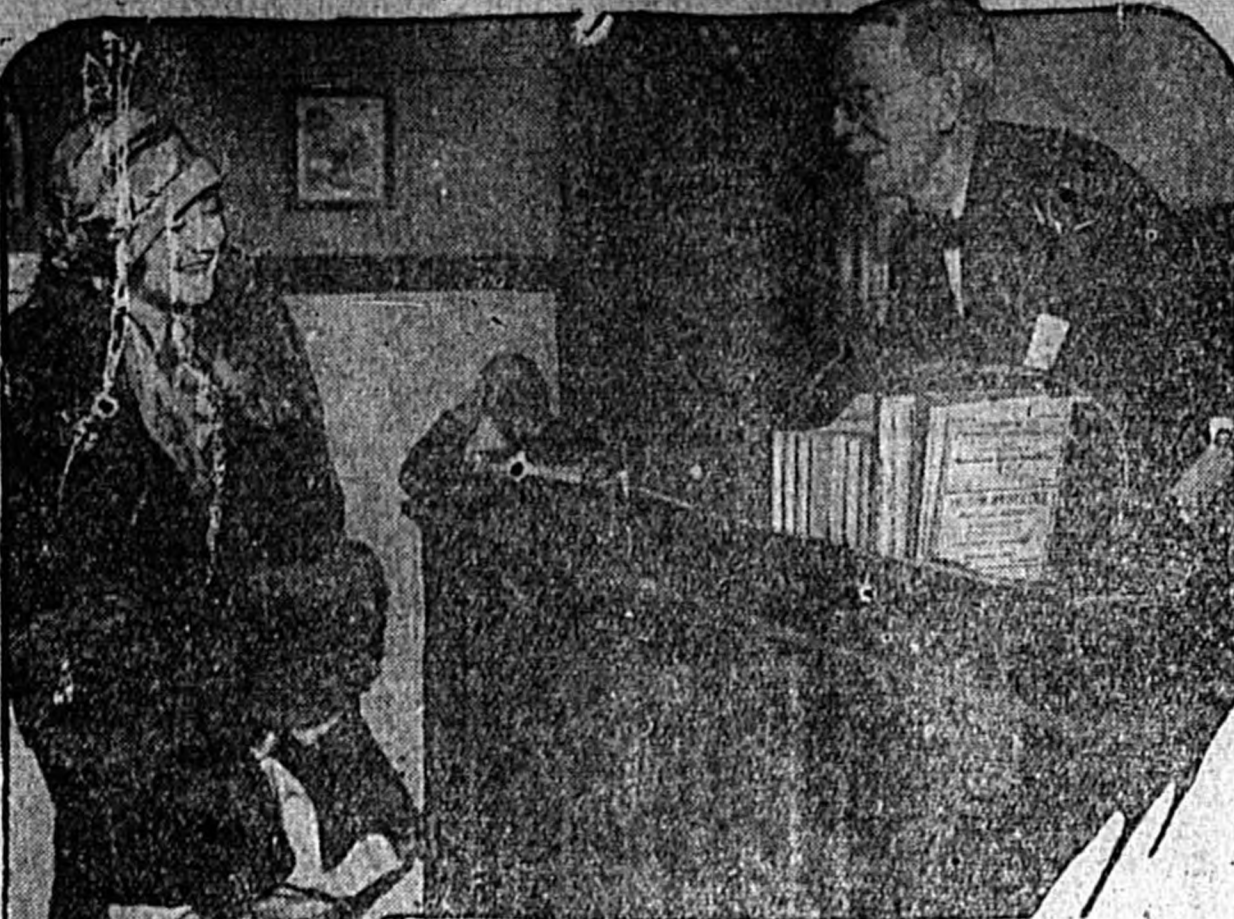

State Chamber Is Using Bank Talley To Offset Knocks

JACKSONVILLE, March 11.—Business men in the north who were busily engaged in knocking Florida a few months ago because of the millions of dollars pouring into the state, have begun to realize that a large part of each of those dollars has been sent back to that part of the country from whence it came, says the Florida State Chamber of Commerce. One thing which caused them to pause and think a little was the article on The Florida Dollar, written by Mercer P. Massey, vice-president of the American Exchange Pacific National Bank of New York, which has been published in pamphlet form by numerous Florida organizations and distributed by the thousands in every part of the country.

Now, says the State Chamber, a survey conducted in Miami has clinched the argument. One hundred sixty-nine business concerns in Miami are sending \$43,822,359 annually north of the Mason and Dixon line in exchange for commodities needed in that city. Dry goods and clothing houses, spend \$9,285,000, which the Miami Chamber of Commerce declares is twenty percent underestimated. There is expended for builders' supplies the sum of \$8,099,600; wholesalers' supplies \$7,000,000; retail establishments other than dry goods houses \$6,752,656; automobile equipment \$3,388,000; manufacturers \$3,558,000 and hotels \$1,820,000.

The figure does not include private building enterprises or improvements nor does it include funds being expended in the development of realty projects.

of the most dangerous submerged ledges on the entire coast line. The last visit of a tender is weeks back. Overhead the signal light flashes and blinks in unceasing rhythm. It is the season of gales and out of the bleak north sweep unleashed winds that scourge the Atlantic and froth its surface in foam. Spray turns to ice and coats the glass protection around the flashing light with sleet. The observation loft whistles in the gale.

The keeper's "trick" is up and he is relieved by an assistant. He now retires to his room. He turns a knob on his radio set. The scene shifts and forms a new picture. The wind subsides and waves no longer pound. It is a peaceful night and strains of Beethoven's "Moonlight Sonata" fill the room. Soon the leader of the philharmonic orchestra in New York or Philadelphia surrenders his baton to a "jazz" outfit in Pittsburgh or Chicago. As for the news of the day, in fact of the hour, he needs but turn his dial to another station and instantly he is listening to dispatches that under ordinary circumstances he would not have known for weeks.

In all there are about 120 lights scattered along the Bay State coast. Of these, sixty are "watched" lights and some seventy-five keepers are employed to see that their beacons are kept burning. Most of them are illuminated by gas lanterns as lighthouse officials believe it to be even more dependable than electricity for their need.

Almost without exception these stations house one or more radio sets which the keepers themselves have purchased. Lights are equipped with radio sets. On board the lightships the change is even more pronounced and fascinating. There are seven-teen of these vessels bobbing at anchor at points of greatest hidden danger. Life on board them is more isolated than that of the light-houses. One hundred and two miles off the coast is stationed the Nantucket Shoals ship the furthest from land lightship in the world. Fifteen men comprise its crew and it is often months at a time that they never see land.

Other ships are anchored along the foggy fishing banks to guide and warn by light and horn the coast vessels that so easily lose their way in the thick haze that makes familiar waters seem strange.

Just how many of these lightships have radio is not a matter of record, but Capt. Eaton is now engaged in finding out. The task, however, will be a slow one as the information is being gathered by

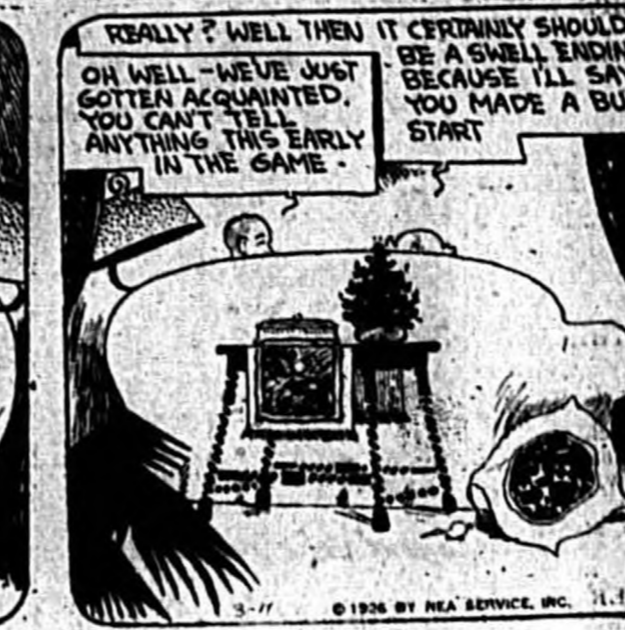

Railroad Man Forecasts Still Greater Expansion And Growth Of Their State

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Mar. 11.—Florida has had a greater expansion and development and enjoyed greater prosperity during the past two years than has ever been experienced by any other similar area in the United States in the same length of time, says M. J. Gormley, chairman of the car service division of the American Railway Association, in a statement made public here to the Florida division of the Southeastern Railway Board.

There are no composite figures available to show the exact extent of this growth but it is a plain fact that the tremendous estate and building development has attracted thousands of people as tourists or as permanent residents with a correspondingly large flow of freight traffic by rail and by water to sustain or to anticipate the building programs of the state, the statement points out.

Gormley, in a statement to several of the large cities have had large growth in banking, building permits, postal receipts, public improvements and per capita wealth and adds that the railroads cannot build locomotives, lay track, and expand their machinery as fast as in the same proportion to match the growth as made by these cities. "It is impossible to say, for a railroad to increase its capacity and its personnel with enough rapidity as to meet the demand of a man deciding to build a house today and the manufacturer ordering the material this afternoon. Three years ago, however, he says, the railroads started an expansion program and improved facilities and additional lines have been built to the state, present facilities have been expanded and improved and in one case an entire railroad is laying a second main line and reconstructing practically all of its physical facilities. The completion of such programs, it is explained, necessarily depends upon the receipt of material and the sufficient supply of labor supply. Much of this railroad construction has taken place at the peak of the building and real estate expansion of the state.

It is acknowledged that carriers have delayed traffic, but necessarily so, switching service has not been normal but it is also true that unloading has been delayed by the receivers," says Mr. Gormley. "People have established business houses in Florida during the past year, who never dreamed of this possibility, hence the number of receivers in the state has increased many times. Shippers have sent goods to Florida unaccompanied with no idea at the time where they were going or who the ultimate purchaser would be. LIQUOR SOLD IN CAPITOL, SAYS COLE L. BLEASE

South Carolina Solon Makes Charge And Is Willing To Prove It, He Declares In Statement To Press Today

Rum Sellers Make Daily Calls, He Says

Wayne B. Wheeler Delivers Strong Criticism Against Newspaper Poll On Dry Law

WASHINGTON, Mar. 12.—(AP)—Liquor is sold daily "under the very dome of the Capitol," and "at least one of the men who voted for prohibition stopped drinking liquor," Cole L. Blease, Democrat of South Carolina, makes that charge in a statement to the press today.

"Prohibition a joke," he told the Washington Police Association last night, adding that it would remain to until the men who voted for prohibition stopped drinking liquor.

"The trouble with Congress," he continued, "is that they voted dry and then they voted for prohibition."

Routeleggers, he said, sell their wares "every day in the House and Senate office building," and they come around him daily and ask:

"How much do you need today?"

"To a newspaper man who is selling," he said, "the South Carolina later said:

"If you don't think I mean what I say, come up to the Capitol with me and I'll buy you a drink."

About the same time that Senator Blease was addressing the police men, Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel for the Anti-Saloon League, was delivering that organization's second attack within a few hours on the polls being taken by newspapers on the subject of total prohibition as against beer and light wine. He told a radio audience that straw ballots "are as useless as a straw hat in a blizzard."

Only a minority of the people want beer and wine, he said, while the majority has spoken its mind, favoring prohibition not in principle, but in official ballots, and that majority has rejected the wine and beer plan.

Scott A. Williams, president of the league, in session here previously had issued a statement scoffing at the newspaper polls, and declaring that the drys generally did not participate in them. That a number of the situation likely will be discussed with the committee tomorrow.

If the prohibition question ever comes before the Senate again, Senator Blease told the policemen, "I am going to vote dry because the people of my state want me to, but I am also going to tell the Senate when I do that it is their vote and not mine."

The Senator declared it was a shame for police to brag about how many arrests are made for drunkenness. He remarked that he knew of one case where judge sentenced a man for being drunk when the judge himself "had liquor on his breath."

Coolidge's Father Weaker From Long Illness Last Year

PLYMOUTH, Vt., Mar. 12.—(AP)—Col. John C. Coolidge, father of the President, was weaker this morning than at any time since his serious illness last November. After a decided relapse yesterday, his physician, Dr. Albert W. Cram, of Bridgewater, said that the Col. had continued to lose ground during the night but was resting as comfortably as could be expected this morning.

Dr. Cram admitted that the 80-year-old father of the President was in a serious condition. The physician expected to spend most of the day at the bedside of the sufferer, unless a marked change for the better was apparent. Last night he kept a three-hour vigil.

The White House was informed of developments and what plans were being made at Plymouth, Vt., in communication with Jas. P. Coupal, physician to the President. Maj. Coupal came here last November when severe attacks of heart blocks made Col. Coolidge's condition alarming.

President Ready To Go

WASHINGTON, Mar. 12.—(AP)—President Coolidge was holding himself in readiness today to speed his return to Plymouth, Vt., where his father is seriously ill, but there was no indication when he would leave Washington.

In effect touch by telephone with developments at Plymouth, Vt., Mr. Coolidge has received the messages himself and what plans he has made based on this information have not been disclosed.

Leopold Schepp, Who Gave Away Millions, Claimed By Death After Brief Illness

NEW YORK, March 12.—(AP)—Leopold Schepp, who gave away millions in philanthropies and then appeared in vain to the world for a decision on how to give away more for the betterment of humanity, is dead.

The end came last night, after a brief illness at his home on Central Park West. He was in his eighty-fifth year.

His philanthropies, many of them quietly carried out that they are reported, represented a total of \$7,000,000, it is estimated. At the time of his death he still was active head of his coconut importing firm.

Among his philanthropies were a \$1,250,000 endowment fund, known as the Leopold Schepp foundation, for the aid of boys, and a similar fund of \$1,000,000 for girls. The public disappointed him in his appeal for suggestions in giving the "unnecessary surplus" of his fortune.

When last year, he sought advice from the public, answers came from all parts of the world. In a short time they reached more than 100,000.

None was satisfactory. Not more than five per cent were anything but appeals for individual assistance. Mr. Schepp was born in New York. When he was 10 years old he invested his capital—18 cents—in palm leaf fans and sold them at a profit of 100 per cent to his visitors on horse cars. Soon he had three or four other boys working for him and an income of \$15 or \$20 a week.

When he was 17 he bought a horse and wagon and began to peddle groceries. Three years later he opened a shop of his own. He soon began to specialize in importing.

Mr. Schepp was a widower. One child, a daughter, survives him.

2 OTHER KILLINGS SANFORD FACING ARE BLAMED ON ILLINOIS WOMAN

State's Attorney Declares Mrs. Elsie Malinsky Made Confession Upon Her Conviction For Third Murder

FLORA, Ill., March 12.—(AP)—Mrs. Elsie Malinsky, 44, under life sentence for the poison murder of her former wife, her third husband, has substantially admitted having committed two other poison murders and a fourth attempted poisoning. State's Attorney Harold S. Williams announced last night.

Her other victims, the state's attorney told the Associated Press, were a husband and the former wife of her first husband. The woman's confession came on the eve of her departure for Joliet prison. Authorities say she broke down under the weight of strong circumstantial evidence but did not make a complete confession of the crimes.

The information made public by Williams, which he says is practically the substance of her confession, is that about 15 years ago she poisoned and killed the wife of her first husband, a man named Havill Bible in order that she might marry him and that about three years ago she fatally poisoned Bible when she became disaffected with him as a husband.

CITY AND A. C. L. League Situation Is Brighter, Statesmen Say After Meeting

Efforts Being Made Toward Final Straightening Out Of Tangle Concerning Opening Of New Seminoles Boulevard

City Refuses To Rescind Ordinance

Condemnation Proceedings May Be Last Method For Completion Of The Project

A conference between officials of the City of Sanford and of the Atlantic Coast Line Railway Company is expected to be held within the next week to definitely settle the tangle relative to the opening of the Seminoles Boulevard through the railroad track on the lake front, just west of Park Avenue, according to a statement made today by Mayor Forrest Lake.

At the last meeting of the City Commissioners, a communication was received to the commissioners in which the company asked that their present trackage within the city limits be legalized, or, in effect, be made immune from future changes which might arise at the will of the city government.

Among other things, this grant, if allowed, would permit the railroad to make use of the northern end of Myrtle Avenue for many tracks as they might see fit to lay and would prohibit the city from enforcing its present rule of allowing the street to be used for anything but a public highway. City officials are said to be unanimous in their determination to carry through the completion of the boulevard without granting a street concession.

A proposal made by the railroad company sometime ago, was flatly refused consideration by the city. The company asked that in return for its permission granting the opening of the boulevard, the city rescind its order authorizing the western portion of Commercial Street and that the city also agree to allow the company to construct a bridge over a tunnel under, or tracks across the boulevard, at any time in the future.

In answer to this proposal, the city stated that it would not consider the proposed opening of Commercial Street. Relative to the granting of permission to cross the boulevard, nothing can be done by the city to prevent the company from having access to its property lying in the lake, the company's riparian rights granting it this privilege without the necessity of a concession from the city or court action to obtain such permission, according to legal authorities.

The conference is expected to result in final action. It is said that the city will grant no concessions to the company. It is also believed that the railroad will consent to the opening of the boulevard through its property without concessions. Court action condemning the property is said to be the last resort of the city, and this is expected to be instituted within a short time, providing the conference accomplishes nothing, Mayor Lake said.

JACKSON, Miss., Mar. 12.—(AP) With Mississippi's anti-evolution law already enacted into law yesterday by the attachment of Governor Whitfield's signature, the education committee of the lower house of the legislature today prepared a measure designed to repeal the new act.

L. W. Kennedy, representative from Adams county, author of the bill to repeal anti-Darwin law, was determined today to "fight to the finish" to have the new legislation stricken from the statute books.

The bill prohibits the teaching in tax supported circles of "theory that man descended from a lower order of animals." Penalty of a fine from \$100 to \$500 for violation of its provision is provided.

Teachers disseminating the theory are subject to having their licenses revoked.

Spirited debate in both houses marked the passage of the measure. The Governor waits until the last day permissible under the ruler before giving it his official sanction.

Palmetto Realty Man Takes His Own Life
