

Greetings that teach thrift, thoughtfulness or the significance of the first Christmas may also be found in the expanding collection of juvenile greetings.

There's a variety of "piggy bank" cards and coin-holding greetings. The coin cards, designed in the shape of Christmas ornaments of sleigh trimmings, hold ten shiny dimes. Youngsters are usually more delighted with silver than with paper currency.

### County Given Unwanted Title


WASHINGTON (UPI) - Tunica County, Miss., holds the unenviable distinction of being the most poverty stricken area of the nation.







Mrs. Hale was a woman's magazine editor - the nation's first- in the mid-Nineteenth century who involved herself in a number of burning issues, in addition to Thanksgiving Day, whose effects are still being felt, no matter if Mrs. Hale berself ranks near the top of the Forgotten Great Americans list.







### Community Fete At Christmas Is Old Custom



### Some Safety Tips Christmas

Christmas couldn't be Christmas without a tree . . . but don't forget that brightly-lit trees can be a hazard! Here are some tips from the National Safety Council for holding fire hazards to a minimum:

Choose a tree with springy rather than dry brittle branches. When you get the tree home. keep it standing in snow or water to retain its freshness until you are ready to take it indoors.

Before setting up your tree, saw off the trunk at least one inch from the original cut, and at an angle. Place tree in a sturdy, waterfilled stand away from heat. Be sure the fresh cut is always under water. Remove the tree before its needles begin to drop.

When trimming your tree, use only electric lighting sets bearing the Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc. label. Check old sets for frayed or bare wires. Always unplug the lights before going to bed or leaving the house. Never have them on unless adults will be near the tree.

Keep all combustible decorations such as paper, tree boughs, or ribbons, away from lights, candles and fireplaces. Do not place electric trains under the tree.


