Whereas, the system of hard surfaced roads in the County of Seminole is incomplete, and,
Whereas, it would be to the best interest of the people of Seminole County to have built and constructed a thorough and complete system of hard surfaced highways, radiating throughout the County of Seminole, and

Seminole County, Florida, shall not be sold, negotiated or used for any other purpose whatsoever, other than for the purpose of refunding, redeeming and taking up the present outstanding issue of bonds of Special Road and Bridge District No. 1 of Seminole County, Florida.

Interest at the rate of 5 1/2 per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually, the principal of said bonds to mature thirty years after the date of the issuance thereof, shall be issued by the County of Seminole, for the purpose as heretofore set forth.

Whereas, resolution has been duly adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of Seminole County, Florida, of even date, herewith, that it would be expedient and to the best interest of Seminole County, Florida, to issue County Bonds of the County of Seminole, for the purpose of refunding, redeeming and taking up the present outstanding issue of bonds, in the sum of \$200,000.00 issued by Special Road and Bridge District No. 1 of Seminole County, Florida, and for the further purpose of constructing, paving and hard surfacing certain highways in the County of Seminole, and also for the purpose of constructing, paving and hard surfacing the following highways and roads of the County of Seminole and State of Florida, to-wit:
