Report Discloses Sanford Has High Living Standards

NEW YORK, Aug. 3. (Special) A higher standard of living and stronger consumers market prevail in Sanford than in most

communities in the United States, according to Sales Management's 1947 survey of buying power, covering all cities of 10,000 population and over. With retail sales of \$10,494,000 in 1946, a large increase from the \$8,322,000 of the previous year, the city did 49 percent of the state's business with but 5.6

percent of the population of the state. How well the average Sanford family fared is shown by its effective buying power, which amounted, after tax deductions, to \$3,175 in spendable money, compared to the average of \$3,089 received per family in the South Atlantic states and to the \$3,015 net income of Florida families.

Vegetable Garden Grows In Berlin Zoo

AP Newsfeature BERLIN—Thousands of Berliners who visit the zoo these days to see what left of its once-great animal collection remark that the zoological gardens are doing a good job as a vegetable garden. With its animal population down nearly 90 percent due to wartime losses and dispersals and postwar starvation, the big zoo has lots of vacant yards and pens. But enterprising keepers are permitting very little wasted space.

Wolfing the Beans In what were once wolf pens they are raising health-looking crops of cabbage, tomatoes and beans. The former giraffe house has a yardful of corn, beans and beets. Food-conscious adults admit nearby tomato patches while their chattering children cluster about the monkey cages.

"Who harvests it?" said an attendant. "Why, we people who work here get it. We planted it and we guard it against thievery." Despite its decimated population, the zoo is still a popular place, especially on week-ends. Located in the British sector of the city, at the end of once-glistening Kurfuerstendamm, it is visited also by hundreds of occupation troops and their dependents. On a summer Sunday one frequently sees Soviet army officers and their wives and children strolling the zoo paths or sitting listening to a band concert in the open air restaurant.

ANIMALS MANGY Foreigners, and Germans too, find the once grand zoo a pretty tawdry place now. Some of its buildings were bombed and the surrounding panorama visible over its walls is one of bomb-blasted buildings. Most of the remaining animals are scrawny and mangy. The beer and tea served at the restaurant are weak.

In a city where several hundred people are afflicted with "Chinese Beggar disease," attributable to eating certain wild herbs, zoo-goers smile wryly at the signs which remind on cages from former days: "Please don't feed the animals."

But the children still love the zoo, though many go away disappointed because it no longer has an elephant. Huge "slam" the elephant-died last winter, some said of hunger. But he wasn't the only victim of the savage winter. The zoo has only one goat now and a lot fewer birds. Thieves got the others and they landed in the cooking pots.
