Helen Bowen, Marie Pezold Set Scoring Pace For Locals

Miss Jesse Durden's high scoring Celery Fed girls basketball squad extended their string of victories to four yesterday afternoon at the high school auditorium when they completely dominated the Leesburg High girls with a display of shooting accuracy that gathered them a 39 to 9 victory.

Helen Bowen continued her high scoring pace during the tilt when she recorded 12 points from six field goals. Marie Pezold, who went in the tilt in the second half, was second in scoring honors with four field goals and two free shots for ten points.

Legion Auxiliary Head Fears Garden Will Be Neglected

CHARLOTTE, N. C. — Mrs. Walter G. Craven, newly elected national president of the American Legion Auxiliary, brings to her new post a wealth of experience in legion work.

Unopposed choice for president of the Auxiliary at its convention in Chicago, Mrs. Craven can look back over 25 years of legion service—five of those years in the national hierarchy of the Auxiliary.

Modest but not retiring, she credits her selection to lead the Auxiliary's 700,000 members to "hard work." And she should know. She has been hard at it now for longer than she wants folks to know.

At the time of Pearl Harbor Mrs. Craven was North Carolina department president of the Auxiliary. When she completed her term in 1942, she became area chairwoman—chairman responsible for 13 states and Panama. In addition she served as national executive committee woman.

Her next step up in the Auxiliary was the vice-presidency of the Southern division, a position she held at the same time she was serving as assistant North Carolina director of Civilian Defense.

After that came her appointment as national child welfare chairman. "That is really my field," Mrs. Craven says of this Auxiliary responsibility. With experience as executive secretary of the Mecklenburg County chapter of the American Red Cross, child welfare work was right down her alley.

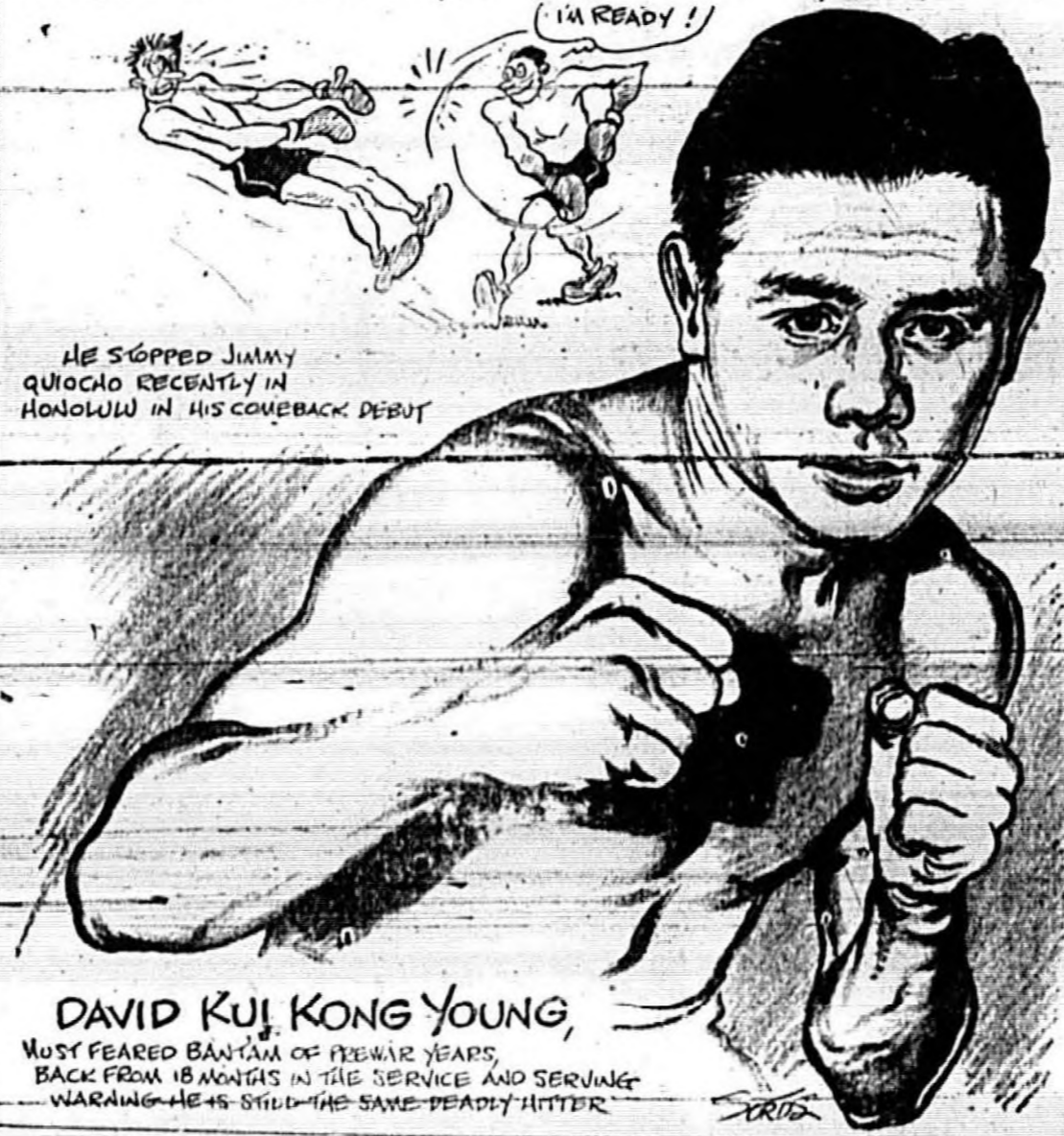
The national child welfare post came at the American Legion Auxiliary convention in the Fall of 1944. In the ensuing months she travelled the length and breadth of the continent, attending on one tour conferences in San Francisco, St. Louis, New Orleans, Philadelphia and Boston.

Taller than average, slim and dark haired, the new Auxiliary president observes:

Considering that the national Auxiliary presidency calls for considerable travel—with departments in all 48 states, Panama, Alaska, Puerto Rico and Hawaii—there is a chance Mrs. Craven's travels will be neglected still further.

Bowen also saw action during the quarter and had replaced Cullum on several earlier occasions.

Coach Ed Bruner's engers took advantage of this move and racked up five points in rapid order when Windram and Mahoney sank field goals and Mahoney later sank a free throw. McClelland brought his regulars back in the contest but Leesburg gathered in four more points before they could be stopped. Fifty more Jamaican negro farm laborers arrived Friday evening at the WPA Farm Labor Camp, and this morning, 100 were allotted to eight growers to relieve the labor shortages on celery and vegetable farms of Seminole County. This brings the total of workers at the camp up to 200.

A slight rise in celery prices FOB Sanford was noted at the end of the shipping and size reducing holiday which was well observed throughout the state during the past week, according to Charles D. Sherman, director of the Federal-State News Service at the Sanford State Market. Celery movement from Florida was 200 cars as compared with 550 the week before.

With the exception of Monday, the Sanford-Gvied celery sections had a shipping holiday all week, with rain prevented cutting on Tuesday and Wednesday. Some cutting was reported in the Glades sections on those days. Seminole County shipped 38 cars as compared with 182 the week before. Of this total, Florida supplied 4.8 Golden variety and 3.2 Florida and California the second week in January was 1105 cars - an all time record, according to the Florida Vegetable Committee.

Market Picture Is Exceptionally Good, Says Wilson

Florida Delegation Striving To Ease Strawberry Ceiling

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Jan. 27, (Special)—"The marketing picture for Florida fruits and vegetables is exceptionally good right now, though rainy weather and recent frosts have curtailed offerings in some areas," said William L. Wilson, director of Florida State Farmers Markets, today.

"We are in receipt of week end reports from several markets which emphasize the relatively satisfactory situation as to prices, in most production centers."

"A Florida delegation has been in Washington this last week, pushing the fight for easing of the 26-cent per pound ceiling on strawberries, fixed by the Office of Price Administration. Senator Claude Pepper and Representative J. H. Pritchard of the First District, a congressional district were present with the group, in their conference with Department of Agriculture and OPA officials. The request presented at this time was for an increase of nine cents in the ceiling, the Florida delegation arguing that the current ceiling is too low for the high cost of production of this luxury crop."

Dr. Jack Greenman of the University of Florida presented arguments for a 35-cent per pound ceiling with the support of Senator Pepper and Representative Pritchard. Dr. Greenman stated that a review of the request by the Agricultural officials may bring helpful recommendations to the OPA.

"Heavy rains followed by cool weather have retarded strawberry picking in the Plant City area, states Market Manager R. E. Johnson. The last week's offerings totaled only 11,772 punts, a result, he said, of the loss of some of the berries on low lands in the North Florida production area around Starke. The outlook for a good yield is favorable however, states L. M. White, manager of the Starke Market."

C. R. Tyner Died On Friday Afternoon

Charley Rainford Tyner, 77, a resident of this city for the past 25 years, died at his home on West First Street Friday afternoon at 1:25 o'clock, following a lingering illness.

Mr. Tyner, formerly employed by the Atlantic Coast Line, was a member of the Church of Christ. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Melissa Tyner; three daughters, Mrs. E. W. Dreggors and Mrs. Zella Pietta of Jacksonville, and Mrs. C. H. Murphy of Deland; two sons, J. S. Tyner and C. I. Tyner of Dundee; one brother, Jim Tyner of Orlando; two sisters, Mrs. Daisy Gill of Orlando and Mrs. Janie Johns of Pine Castle; 14 grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

Steel Price Increase Of \$4 Is Studied As Answer To Strike Of Steel Workers

THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD opened hearings in Detroit today on the CIO charge that General Motors has refused to bargain collectively in good faith. A regional attorney for the board, Harold Crawford, announced that government counsel would use the wage settlements made by other automobile producers as evidence, against the corporation.

It was obviously a reference to the increases of 18 cents an hour granted by Ford and Chrysler last week. The best offer made by General Motors was 13 and a half cents, and the government will use those figures in an effort to show that General Motors did not bargain in good faith.

In Washington a United States Steel Corporation spokesman said that the company's president, Benjamin Fairless, is on his way to the capital. The spokesman said Fairless was to confer with government officials but the government would not be held at the White House.

Government officials offered the opinion that Fairless wished to discuss the issue of a rise in the price of steel, stabilization and conversion facilities, but he had decided that an increase of about \$4 a ton will be granted eventually. This compares with the \$7 Fairless has urged to cover wage rises.

A new wage agreement with the Radio Corporation of America may set the pace for settling the two-week-old strike of 200,000 CIO electrical workers. The union accepted a 17 1/2 cent hourly wage boost for 40,000 workers. The new wage package was reached without a strike and without government assistance. It climaxed three months of negotiations.

"Amazing" contribution by newspapers, to help finance and win the toughest war in history, Little said, "should make every newspaperman proud of his profession, proud, too, of the leadership and patriotism of his associates but most of all, proud of the glorious war record that newspapers made which will go on long way toward furthering the cause of a free press throughout the world."

"During the war years newspapers had more problems than ever before yet there was never a time when the Treasury called upon them for help that they failed to come through."
