

King Troubled By Communist Accusations

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. currently is having a rash of difficulties defending his non-violent integration movement against accusations that it is being infiltrated by workers for world communism.

King calls this a smoke-screen by "segregationists and race baiters" to obscure and deflect the national move by Negroes for civil rights.

The latest incident on this score involves a rather mysterious figure known variously by four names but most often as Jack O'Dell. Two congressional committees have labeled him as part of the Communist setup in the United States. He has worked twice for King's Southern Christian Leadership Conference, mostly as a money raiser.

Following published reports last week that O'Dell still ran the New York office of SCLC, King summoned reporters to insist that O'Dell had left the employment of his organization "by mutual consent" in June.

This came despite a conflicting acknowledgement the same day from King's New York office that O'Dell still worked there as administrator. King said the discrepancy obviously was from confusion and not fact.

A spokesman for King later explained that O'Dell had dropped by the SCLC office on the day of inquiry but was not working there.

King credits the flurry of Communist charges to two Southern governors — Ross of Mississippi and George Wallace of Alabama — who testified before the Senate Commerce Committee against the proposed new civil rights bill.

Both held aloft a large newspaper photograph which they identified as a picture of King attending a meeting at the Highlander Folk School in Tennessee. They said this was a place frequented by Communist sympathizers.

King also defended the school, now defunct because of a revoked charter, saying he had nothing to be ashamed of for being there one time he paid a visit.

But the problem still chases the nation's number one Negro civil rights chief. Currently, Georgia Atty. Gen. Eugene Cook has "invited" King to tell him all he knows.

King has been defending himself and his movement against communism since his early days as a leader of the Montgomery, Ala., bus boycott, in his book on that episode, "Stride Toward Freedom," he relates how in 1946 he studied the Communist manifesto and the writings of Karl Marx in an effort to "try to understand the appeal of Communism for many people."

"I drew certain conclusions which have remained with me," King wrote. "I rejected their materialistic interpretation of history. Communism, avowedly secularistic and materialistic has no place for God . . . since for the Communist there is no divine government, no absolute moral order, there are no fixed, immutable principles. Consequently almost anything — force, violence, murder, lying — is a justifiable means to the end. This was abhorrent to me. Constructive ends can never give absolute moral justification to destructive means."

Committees Recall Rail Union Leaders

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy's proposal to let the Interstate Commerce Commission settle the railroad dispute were put on a standby basis today and congressional committees called union leaders back for questioning on the work rules controversy.

Labor Secretary W. Willard Wirtz met separately Sunday with train crew unions, engine crew unions and management representatives in an effort to work out a settlement without legislative action.

But a spokesman said there was nothing to report after the talks and the mediation discussions had been put on a standby basis while the hearings continued in Congress.

Chiefs of the five railroad brotherhoods were called to testify today before the House Commerce Committee on

President Kennedy's proposal to let the Interstate Commerce Commission settle the strike-threatening dispute. H. E. Gilbert, president of the Firemen and Enginemen's Union, charged Sunday that the railroads had refused to bargain. He said that if a nationwide strike occurred, it would be the railroads' fault. Gilbert said that the unions had offered to eliminate 3,500 jobs in the next two years through retirement, but the railroads had not even replied to the offer.

Ruins Searched For More Quake Victims

SKOPJE, Yugoslavia (UPI) — Rescue crews today used French sound detection equipment to search the earthquake rubble of this city for possible survivors following Sunday's rescue of a couple trapped 55 hours.

Little hope was held out that others remained alive under the debris, but French disaster squads working with the Yugoslavs were using equipment of the type that located survivors buried in the 1960 earthquake in Azadir, Morocco, in which 12,000 died.

The toll of the quake that struck this city of 200,000 persons has been placed unofficially at 2,000. At least 1,000 bodies have been recovered and an equal number are feared buried.

A Belgian woman and her husband were brought alive from the ruins of the Macedonia Hotel Sunday after having been trapped under its shattered walls since the quake struck before dawn Friday.

The woman, identified as Mrs. Sissie or Suzzie Zamker, was reported in fair condition, but a witness who watched the rescue operation said her husband's leg had to be amputated.

The rescue of the couple was carried out after their voices were heard underneath the ruins.

Today, Yugoslavs who had lived and worked in the city when it was a model provincial capital were streaming out to find new homes. It was estimated that half the population of 200,000 had left. Some said they would settle permanently in other towns and try to start new. Others planned to return to rebuild their homes.

Cultural Center For Americas Step Nearer

Land Being Cleared For Huge 'Interama' At Miami

MIAMI (UPI) — On a lonely stretch of mangrove swamp, where Seminole Indians once gazed at the blue-green Atlantic, a dream will come true in two years and the industry and culture of the Americas will meet.

Now only dredges and sand graders ply the 680-acre tract of mud located between Biscayne Bay and the ocean near here, but more than 75 million people are expected to visit "Interama" in the first five years after its completion.

The giant exhibit will show off the culture, industry and history of the Americas.

Total cost of the dream, which many people thought would never come true, is expected to be in the neighborhood of \$500 million.

Folks At Home May Have Last Say On Test Ban Treaty's Fate

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The folks back home may play a big part in determining whether the Senate ratifies the three-nation nuclear test ban treaty.

This became evident today as more and more senators indicated they were keeping an open mind on the agreement reached in Moscow by the United States, Britain and Russia.

Many senators said privately they were waiting to test the sentiment among voters back home.

As a result, ratification of the treaty by the required two-thirds vote shaped up as no sure thing despite optimistic predictions of its ardent backers. One veteran senator noted that it is hard to get two-thirds support for anything in the Senate.

Under Secretary of State W. Averell Harriman, who initiated the agreement for the United States, and disarmament chief William C. Foster faced a bombardment of searching questions at a three-hour closed session Monday with members of three powerful Senate committees.

They won general praise for their performance and the announced support of two of the committee chairmen. But more than half of the senators interviewed later said their minds were not yet made up.

Chairman J. William Fulbright, D-Ark., of the Foreign Relations Committee and Sen. John O. Pastors, D-Ill., of the Senate House Atomic Energy Committee said they intended to support the treaty in its present form.

But Chairman Richard B. Russell, D-Ga., of the Armed Services Committee was non-committal.

The preparedness subcommittee of Russell's group will resume hearings Thursday on the military aspects of the treaty, with the heads of two major U. S. nuclear weapons laboratories scheduled to testify.

Chairman John Stennis, D-Miss., said the witnesses would be Dr. John Foster, director of the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory, Livermore, Calif., and Dr. Norris E. Bradbury, director of the Los Alamos, N. M., Scientific Laboratory.

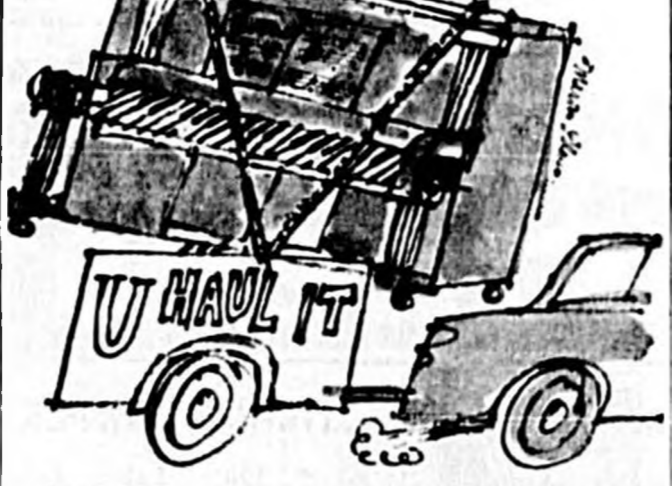
"These respected scientists will be the first of a number of scientific and technical witnesses which we will hear in the next few weeks," Stennis said.

One question troubling many senators, notably Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen, Ill., is the pact's "veto" provision, which forbids any amendment to the treaty except by unanimous agreement of the three original signers.

Another is the exact meaning of its "withdrawing clause," which would allow any member nation to pull out of the agreement in case of a violation. A third point is the possible restriction on use of nuclear blasts for purely peacetime uses, such as an excavation for construction.

Four distinct areas of exposition are planned for the cultural and industrial center, and the setup will include modern buildings, plazas, pavilions, gardens and student guides from the three Americas.

The industrial area, "meeting place for industries of the western hemisphere," according to Interama officials, will tell the story of man's search for knowledge and his gains along these lines in the different countries.

The cultural and festival areas will stress native music, art, entertainment and recreation found in the western world. Included in the cultural area will be an opera house and a reproduction of a Shakespearean theater.

Gov. Farris Bryant is executive officer of the Interama Authority and appointed its membership.

The idea for the center took hold in 1950 when Congress supported the establishment of Interama with the basic purpose of improving ties with Latin America. President Harry S. Truman endorsed the project fully in 1952, a year after it was created as a non-profit organization.

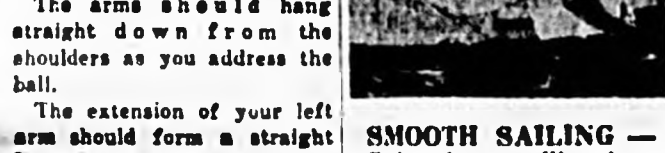

9-Left Arm Position
If the toe of the club is sticking up, you are standing too far from the ball. If the heel is up, the toe drooping you're too close.



The extension of your left arm should form a straight line with the club. The hands, as you look down the shaft, should be slightly ahead of the ball. Work on attaining the proper stance until it becomes automatic with you. Grip first, stance second, and you're on your way to shooting par. These two fundamentals will start you off correctly so that you will shift your weight properly and thus develop a smooth and rhythmic swing.

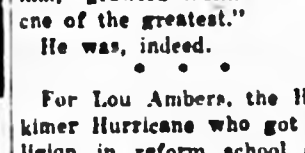

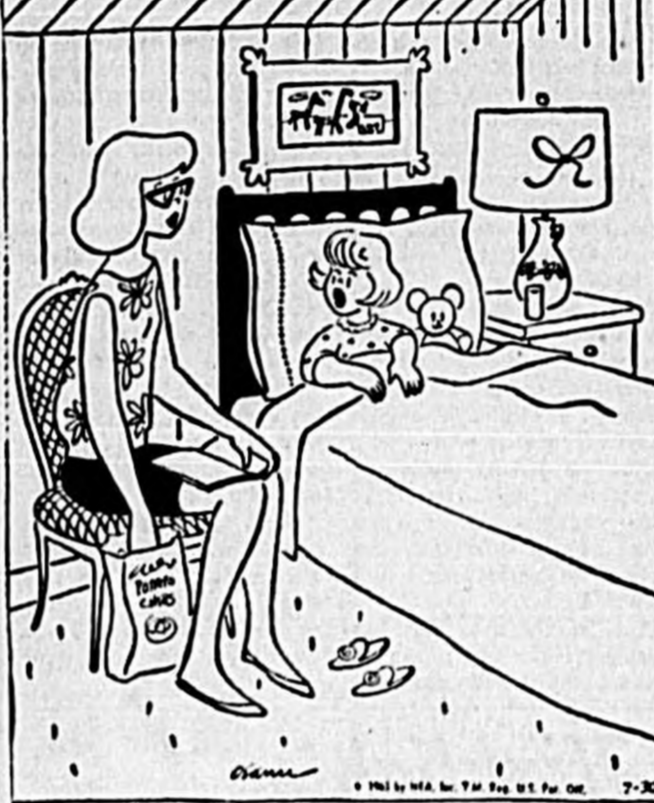

Rocket System Evolution Is Told Rotarians

The development of a comprehensive weapons system such as that which surrounds the Martin-Marietta Bullpup rocket was outlined for Rotarians by Charles S. DeNeen, requirements manager of the air-to-surface missiles department, Monday.

DeNeen, entitled his talk, "The Evolution of a Weapons System," used a western-type movie for an example saying that the missile was compared to the bullet from the cowboy's gun.

"But the gun, itself, as the force which launches the bullet, the cowboy's hand that holds the gun, the man, himself, his brain that tells the hand to pull the gun and shoot it, and the background reasons for his action are all part of what we call a weapons system," DeNeen explained.

He said that the Martin Company produces the whole system from the missile, itself, through the training of the men who handle it, the men who shoot it, the transportation, assembly and target practice.

"This comprehensive system was not always used," DeNeen said. He pointed out that in World War II, and before, a haphazard system was used, with different groups, companies and services all having a part in the building, assembly, use, training and servicing of a weapon, resulting in inefficient and ineffective arrangements.

"Now we design the entire weapons system from start to finish at one time, so that it can be expedited and used in a highly effective manner," DeNeen traced the evolution of the present attack missile from the ones used by the Germans in World War II, through the speedup in design, construction and use in the Korean War, to the present phase in the national defense system.

The Bullpup missile which Martin-Marietta builds is now in readiness with every attack aircraft and ground vehicle throughout the world, has been proved very reliable and is relatively inexpensive.

"Mass-production has reduced cost by 700 percent in the past five years," he noted.

DeNeen was accompanied by Jack Horner, safety officer at Martin, and Handall Chase was in charge of the program. A short film, showing the firing of the Bullpup at targets at an international weapons meet, was shown at the conclusion of the program.

Cherries May Be Lonesome In Frozen Pies

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Officials of the food and drug administration are inclined to agree with Sen. Philip Hart, R-Mich., about the lack of cherries in frozen cherry pies.

But they don't know what to do about it.

Hart contended recently that pictures on the packages of the frozen pastry showing luscious wedges of pie crammed with cherries were a snare and delusion.

The Senator said the pies more often than not contained far less cherries than the pictures would lead the purchaser to believe and even those floated in watery juice.

Hart, whose home state produces more cherries than can be sold, was indignant. He asked the FDA to investigate.

The first word today from Malcolm R. Stephens, chief of the FDA enforcement bureau, supported Hart's complaint.

"We think some of the pictures are not truly representative," Stephens said.

His inspectors reported the pies generally contain 40-60 cherries, although pictures on the packages indicate many more. The pie with the most, he said, contained 100 cherries, but had no vignette on its wrapping.

Thomas Della of FDA's food standards division suggested weight of the fruit might be the best standard for assuring the proper proportion of cherries.
