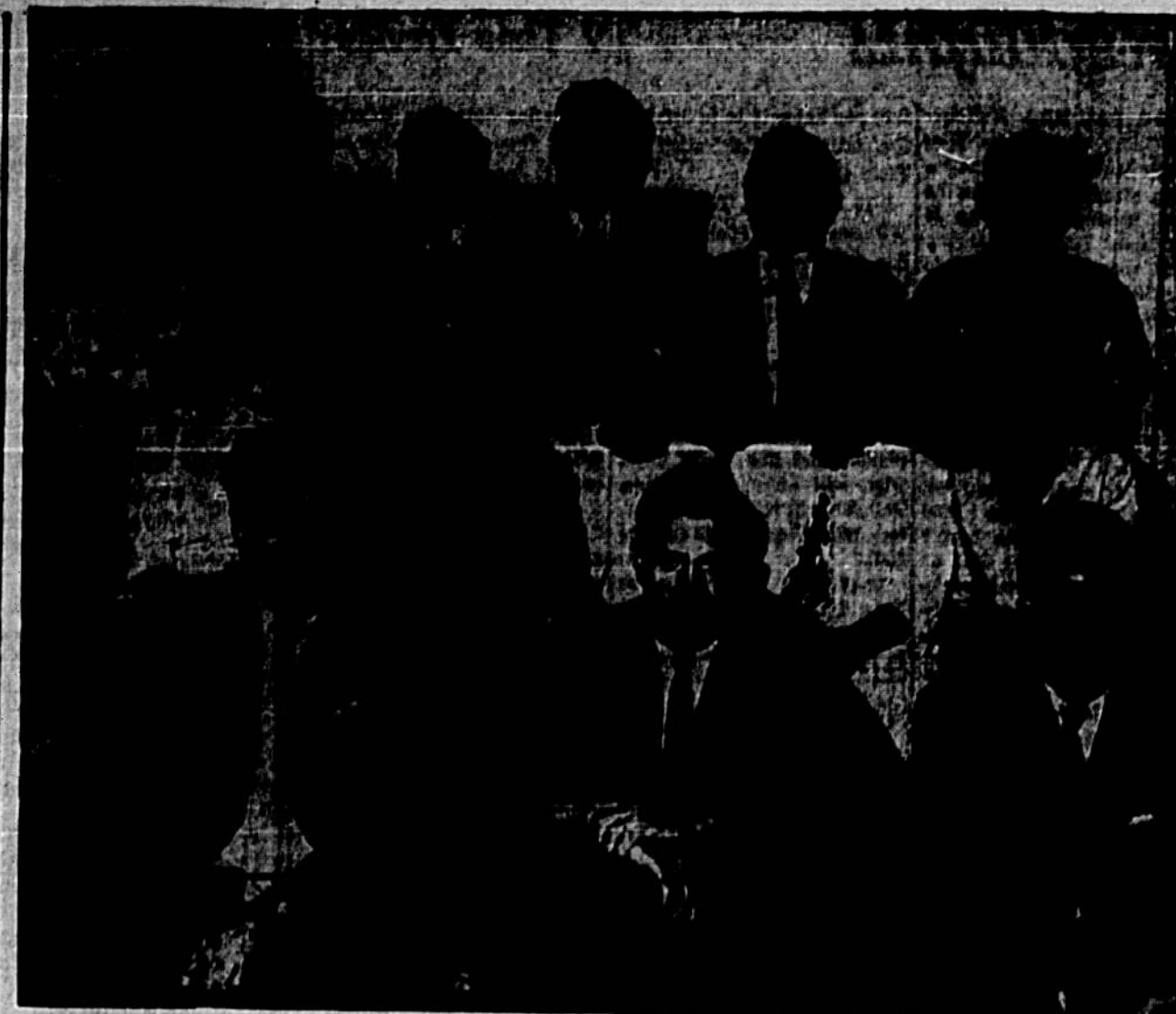

**McNamara's Management Of War Under Heavy Fire**  
WASHINGTON (UPI) — Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara's management of manpower and equipment for the U. S. war effort in Vietnam is coming under increasingly heavy congressional fire. Senate investigators, raising new charges of supply shortages in Vietnam, charged that the Pentagon had sold or stockpiled equipment needed in the war.  
Fifteen staff members who recently returned from a tour of the Far East and Europe planned to present their case when the Senate foreign aid appropriations subcommittee begins hearings Tuesday.  
It was the latest in a series of allegations that U. S.

**Money Orders Lead To Arrest**  
TAMPA (UPI) — Ramon Sears Barnett, 37, of Tampa, was arrested by the FBI on a five-count federal indictment charging interstate transportation of "falsely made" American Express money orders.  
Federal agents said the money orders were part of a group of 70 stolen in two armed robberies of small Miami area grocery stores in December of 1964.  
The indictments, returned by a federal grand jury, charge the money orders were transported from Tampa to New York.

**'Snow Job' On War Charged To 'Mac'**

WASHINGTON (UPI) — House Republicans leaders, calculating their attacks on President Johnson and his lieutenant, claim the administration is making false and evasive statements about Vietnam.  
One predicts the war will "undoubtedly be a major political issue" this election year.

Why? Because it's nuclear powered. And nuclear is the world's biggest atom bomb.

It's not, of course. Although the ship is propelled by a globe of uranium, the chances of an atomic explosion are, statistically, next to nothing.

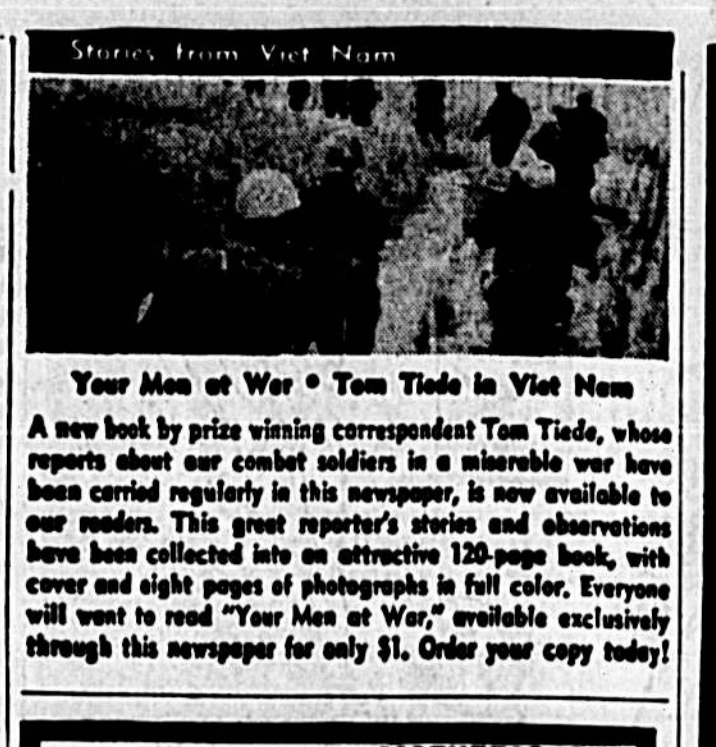
