REME COURT'S MANY LIQUOR CASES TO DECIDE

Controversies Arising Out of Enforcement of Prohibition Act Constitute Big Source of Present Actions

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Controversies arising out of the enforcement of the Volstead act constitute one of the most prolific sources of litigation reaching the Supreme Court.

Many important and high-interesting problems arising under the prohibition amendment have been decided, others crucial to enforcement remain to be solved. Some may be decided soon after the court reconvenes in October. Others will be presented in oral arguments early next term.

Cover Wide Range

The cases pending cover a wide range from attempts to nullify the treaties which General Andrews regards as one of the most important instruments in combatting bootlegging, to technical questions in rather ordinary cases, such as the Canadian steamship "Quadrant" off the Farallone Islands, liquor laden, on the ground that she was within one hour's sailing by her own power of the California coast, will be the basis for testing the jurisdiction of federal courts to try cases alleged to have originated outside the territorial limits of the United States.

Physician's Prescriptions

Dr. Samuel W. Lambert of New York City, with the support of the American Medical Association, has challenged the Volstead act restriction upon physician's prescriptions. William E. Dodge and others, owners of the "Ray of Rhoad Island," have attacked the right of the federal government to forfeit a boat seized by the Rhode Island police.

Automobile Companies in Alabama and Washington State

Automobile companies in Alabama and Washington state are questioning the right of the government to sell automobiles seized without traffic when title to the cars has not passed to those purchasing them on deferred payment basis. The authority of Oregon to prohibit insurance companies from issuing policies to identify automobile companies against loss through such seizures, also is under litigation.

Padlocked Premises

Other questions before the court include: The use which federal officers can make of evidence obtained by state officers; whether claims to property can be cancelled as a part of the premises had been padlocked; whether certain San Francisco policemen were attempting to enforce or violate the law when arrested on a dock at which liquor had been landed; whether Joshua E. Russell, former prohibition director for Ohio, was involved in a conspiracy to unlawfully transport and sell liquor in Cleveland and other places; and whether a former prohibition director for Nevada committed an offense punishable under the law when he failed to report to the United States attorney alleged violations near Reno.

And now, at 60, a multimillionaire, Getz has made his boyhood dream come true.

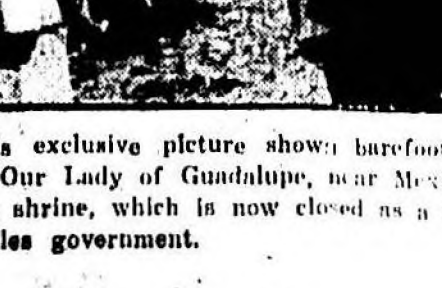

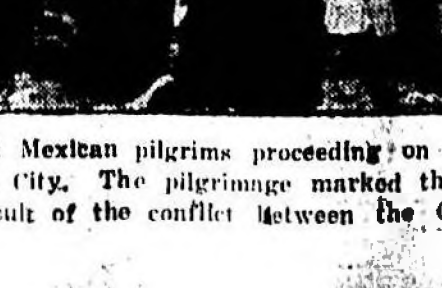
