MONEY TALKER AT CONVENTION

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) — Gov. Haydon Burns and his five opponents will appear before the Florida Education Association convention in Miami Beach this month, and you can bet they'll be talking money.

The FEA, which recently illustrated that when it speaks the politicians had better listen, will meet April 19-25. Two major items are on the agenda for the 15,000 delegates.

—Adoption of a new legislative program to be pushed at the next meeting of state senators.

—A proposal to merge with the predominantly Negro Florida State Teachers Association (FSTA).

The first is sure to include demands as the teachers did unsuccessfully at the 1965 legislative session, for big pay boosts. The second is expected to be adopted without trouble.

When the 1965 Legislature didn't give the state's public school teachers the raises they asked for, the FEA called on the National Education Association.

The NEA promptly sent an investigating committee to Florida and came up with a stinging report recently which charged that political red tape was choking Florida school administration at the lower levels.

A major issue at this session of the convention will be the vote for unification of the Florida Education Association with the Florida State Teachers Association (FSTA).

George Dabbs, of Altamonte Springs, FEA president-elect, will present the proposed by-law changes including the planned merger. But a decision may not be reached until after the convention adjourns Saturday afternoon.

Unification would require a two-thirds vote of approval by each association's delegate assembly. (The FSTA will be meeting concurrently in Miami.)

If the merger plan passes, it would become effective July 1. The single organization would be known as the Florida Education Association and would represent a combined membership of more than 50,000 professional educators.

Federal tax returns on income earned during 1965—with checks, if there's a balance owed—must be postmarked by midnight, April 15.

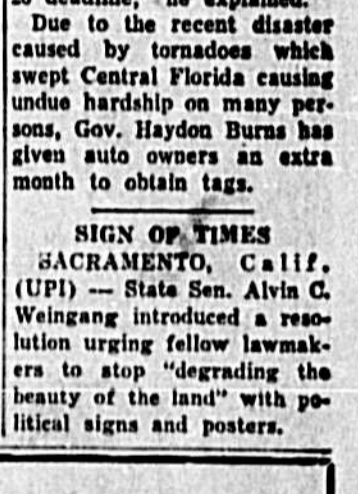
Late filers are penalized five per cent a month on their unpaid taxes.

Iraqi Strongman Killed In Crash

BAGHDAD, Iraq (UPI) — President Abdul Karim Qasbi's 1744 strongman who acted as a bodyguard in 1968, and several of his top aides were killed Wednesday night when their helicopter crashed in a sandstorm in southern Iraq, radio Baghdad announced today.

Qasbi, the 56-year-old former Iraqi Prime Minister, reportedly died in the crash. He was on a mission to inspect a dam in the south of Iraq.

Qasbi was accompanied by several other officials, including the Iraqi ambassador to the United States, and a number of other high-ranking officials.

Kilgo also discussed the importance of safe driving habits for children, and the importance of safe driving habits for the elderly.

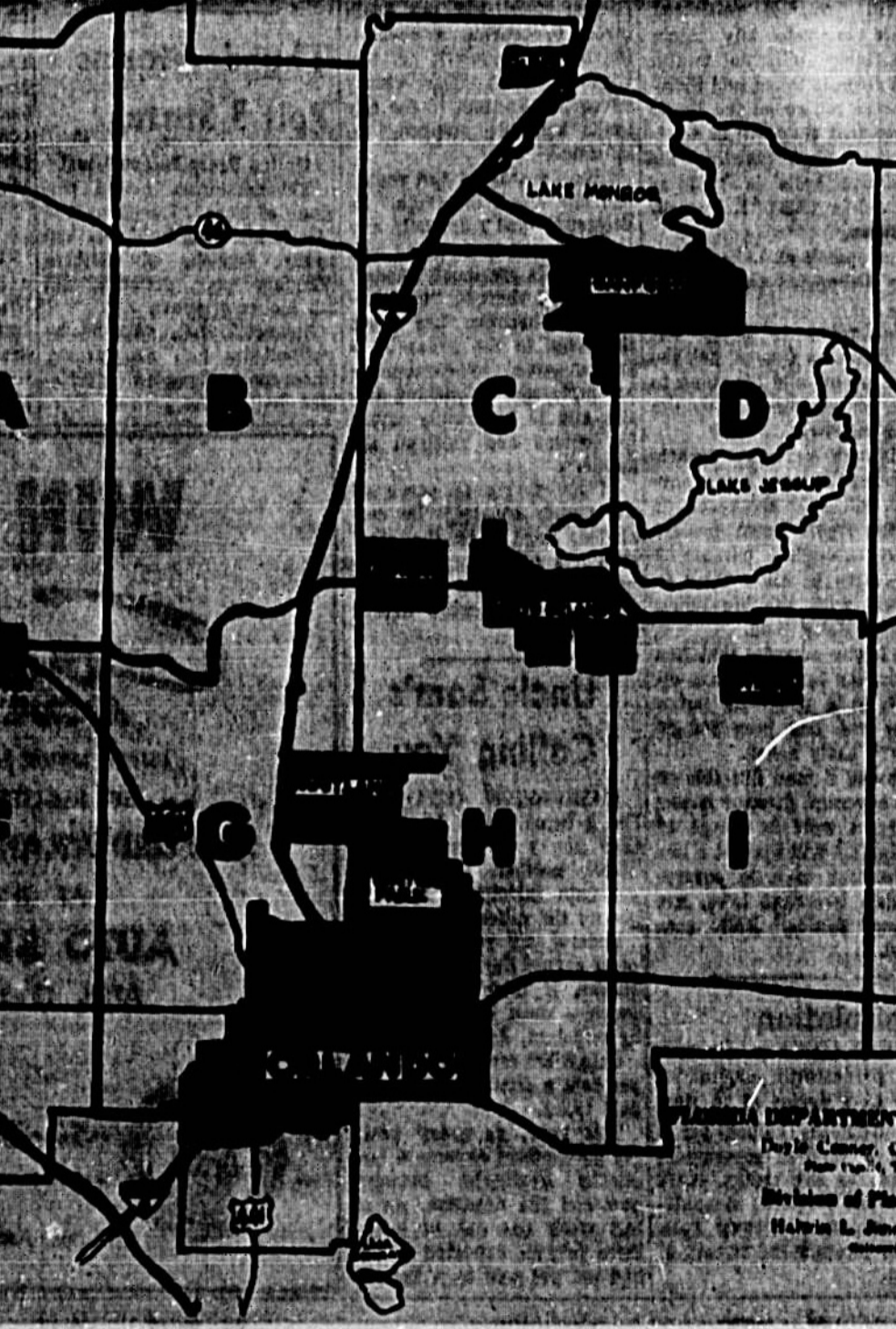
Area Deaths

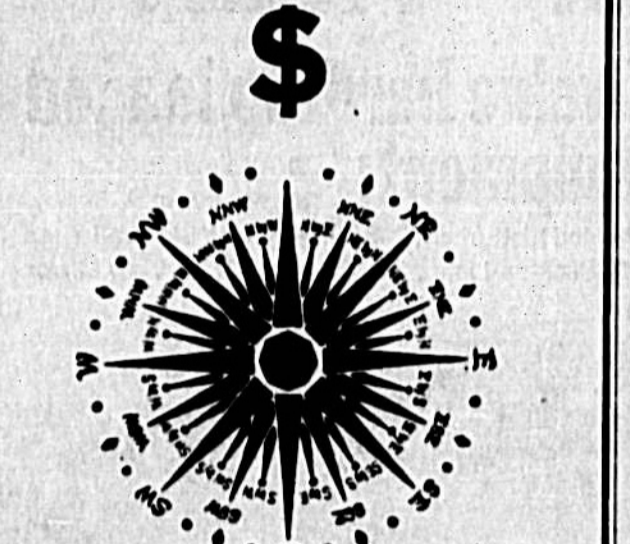
