for educational purposes. Each state was expected to sell the land at a fair price. The money was to be put in "irrevocable" trusts so that only the interest would be used to help school children learn the better way of life.

It is true the federal government seemed to guard the land grants with all the protective legislation a person could want, the most potent of which was a requirement that if any of the principal of the fund should be lost, stored, or be stolen, the state would have to make it good.

Some states simply dumped the endowment money into the state treasury to see for salaries and roads. In turn they promised to pay to the schools the yearly equivalent of 2 1/2 per cent interest on the money so directed.

In the midst of an agricultural depression, poured out the school money in the form of loans on farms. Quite a few chunks went to favored sons of the state political party then in power as loans on worthless or nearly worthless properties their owners never expected to redeem.

"It was the price we had to pay for recovery," answered one politician, when called to account by a succeeding administration.
