This should not be so, as the harm that hookworm disease may do may be greater and far more widespread than that resulting from an epidemic of some acute

strength and saps the vitality of its victims. It stunts growth, energy and cripples ones capacity for work yet in many cases the actual signs of the disease may for a long time be so slight that the patient merely feels tired and laxy. The baby hookworm enters the body through the skin, and travels in a round-about way, through the lymphatics, blood stream, lungs, throat, and stomach to the intestines, where they grow to maturity. During their travel through the hody symptoms are

through the body symptons are not usually produced.

The first indication of the disease may be an irritation of the skin, where the larvae penetrates. This is called "ground-itch". The hookworm is a blood-sucking par-asite that daily consumes many times its weight in blood. Because they are blood-suckers a child may have a sufficient number of hook-worms to use up blood faster than the little body can manufacture it. He then becomes pale from lack of blood His body functions are retarded, he grows very slowly, the state of the sufficient state of the sufficient s
