Two critical after cave-in at work site

SANFORD — Two persons are reported in critical condition and one other was injured this morning, when the earth caved in at a construction site on Airport Boulevard. Tim Robles with the Sanford Fire Department said it is unclear whether the cave-in may have been caused by construction or some other factor.

As of 10:45 this morning, all three men had been extricated from the hole, described as 20 to 30 feet in girth, and approximately 10 feet deep. It occurred at the construction site in the 300 block of West Airport Boulevard, where the new GreeneWay bridge is being built over the boulevard.

The two persons said to be in critical condition were immediately taken to Central Florida Regional Hospital in Sanford.

Sanford Fire Fighters and EMT personnel were at the scene handling the rescues.

No names were immediately released.

City closer to agreement with police

SANFORD — City Commissioners approved most of the recommendations of a Special Master's report in an attempt to settle a contract impasse with the city's police union.

The union can agree to accept the commission's offer or reject it and head back to the bargaining table for further negotiations, which have been going on for more than a year. Either way Sanford City Manager Tony VanDerworp said there would not be a disruption of services.

"The police would continue working

under the old contract," VanDerworp said.

The main point of contention is police salaries and raises.

"Sanford has fallen behind the median pay of other agencies in Seminole County," said John Head, the attorney representing the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge 140.

While the commission agrees salaries

need to be adjusted, it disagrees with the union — and among its members — on how best to do that. Head said the union recommends boosting the salaries within the current 15-step pay plan. However, Mayor Larry Dale disagrees with a step plan because, "It could put the city in financial jeopardy."

"You get locked into a pay plan that increases every year. We might not be

able to afford it some years," Dale said. "The economy is good right now, but what happens in two years if it takes a drastic drop?"

Commissioner Brady Lessard expressed his belief that the city needs to make a commitment to fund public safety in good economic times and bad. Lessard suggested the city could do that by establishing an indexing system for public safety salaries. Such a system would survey salaries of surrounding public safety agencies and then establish Sanford pay rates accordingly. Lessard didn't offer a specific proposal, but said

Lake Mary eyes new fire station

If Commissioners OK design funds, voters will need to approve financing for construction

LAKE MARY — The city's fire department may be next in line for a new building.

City Manager John Litton has included \$180,000 in the city's FY 2001 proposed budget for the design of a new fire station. The city plans on demolishing the department's current facility on Rinehart Road and constructing a new building on the site.

However, the public will have some input concerning the funding of the new station.

"From a financial standpoint, we will not be able to build the proposed station without a referendum," Litton said.

During Thursday's commission meeting, Commissioner George Duryea asked Litton if the city could start planning the design of the building before the beginning of the next fiscal year, which begins Oct. 1.

"This easily will be a two-year process," Duryea said. "Is there anyway we can get something started now?"

According to Litton, the architect who designed the new police station is still available for the city's use. He also suggested the option of reviewing other cities' facilities in order to save money.

"We could go ahead and work on a design or we can go out and find something we like and not spend as much money."

Lake Mary Fire Chief Craig Haun said he already sent a request via the Internet for designs for other fire stations. Eight departments have responded to the request.

However, none of the designs are large enough to accommo-

Residents alerted to take steps to prevent heat-related health issues

About the only thing hotter than the Florida Lottery these days, is the temperature. And while the lottery fever goes up and down depending on winners or roll-overs, the outdoor temperatures don't seem to fluctuate.

Temperatures in Sanford and

the Seminole County area in the heat of the day have been in the 90s practically every day for several weeks.

Paula Ritchie with Seminole County EMS Fire/Rescue said since July 5, there have been seven calls regarding heat exhaustion or strokes.

"This is just a little over two weeks," she said. "In a comparable time period from May to

June, there were seven for the entire month. So we consider this a serious increase."

Most area residents however, are apparently well aware of the problems that can be caused by the heat. Fire Departments in Sanford and Lake Mary say they have not had any such calls in the past few weeks.

Nelson has supreme ambitions

SANFORD — Debra Nelson's call to law came as a North Miami Beach schoolgirl. She was determined to get a degree, pass the bar exam, work in the state attorney's office, and establish her own firm. Then, she'd become a judge — and one day sit on the Supreme Court.

At 46, Ms Nelson is fulfilling her supreme ambitions.

On Friday, J. Preston Silvermail, the chief judge of the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit, appointed Nelson as the chief administrative judge of the Seminole County Court. She is the first woman to hold the job.

As the court's senior officer, Judge Silvermail said he was certain that it was in the best interest of the judicial circuit to select Judge Nelson as administrative judge, overseeing all matters in Seminole County.

Chief Judge Silvermail came

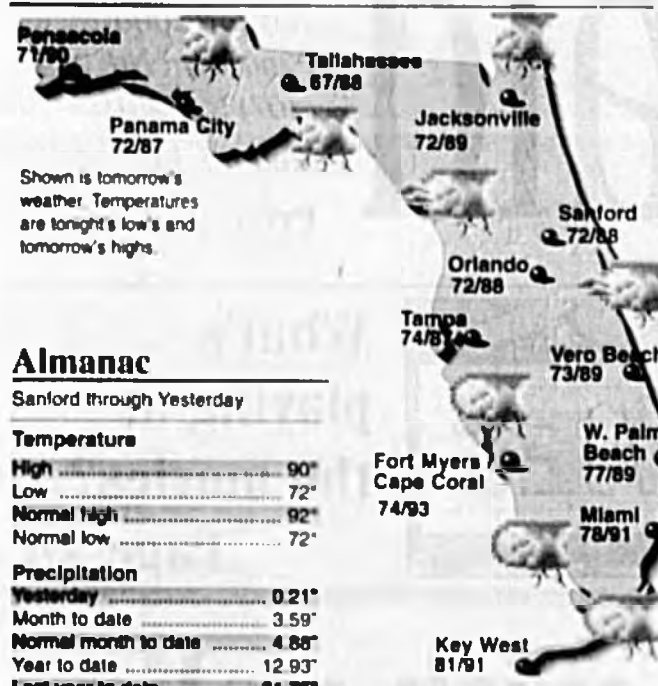
here from his office in Viera on Friday to personally congratulate Nelson and to address the

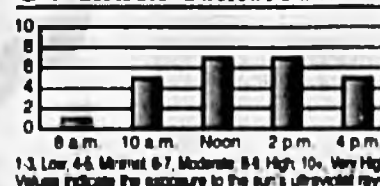

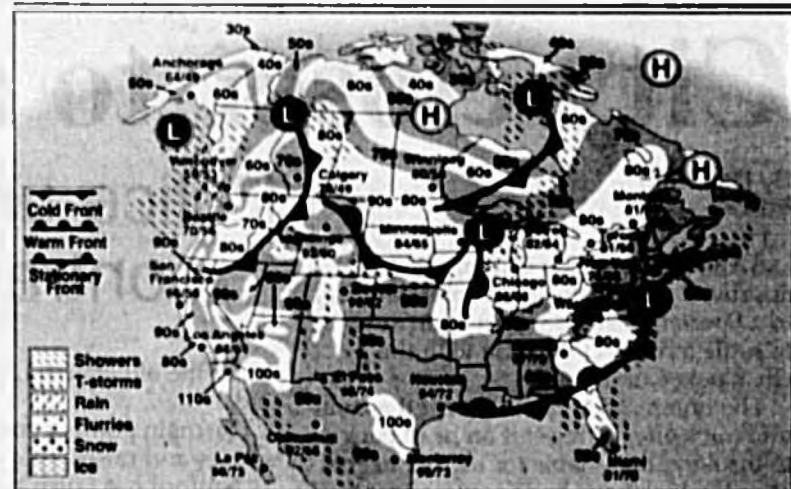

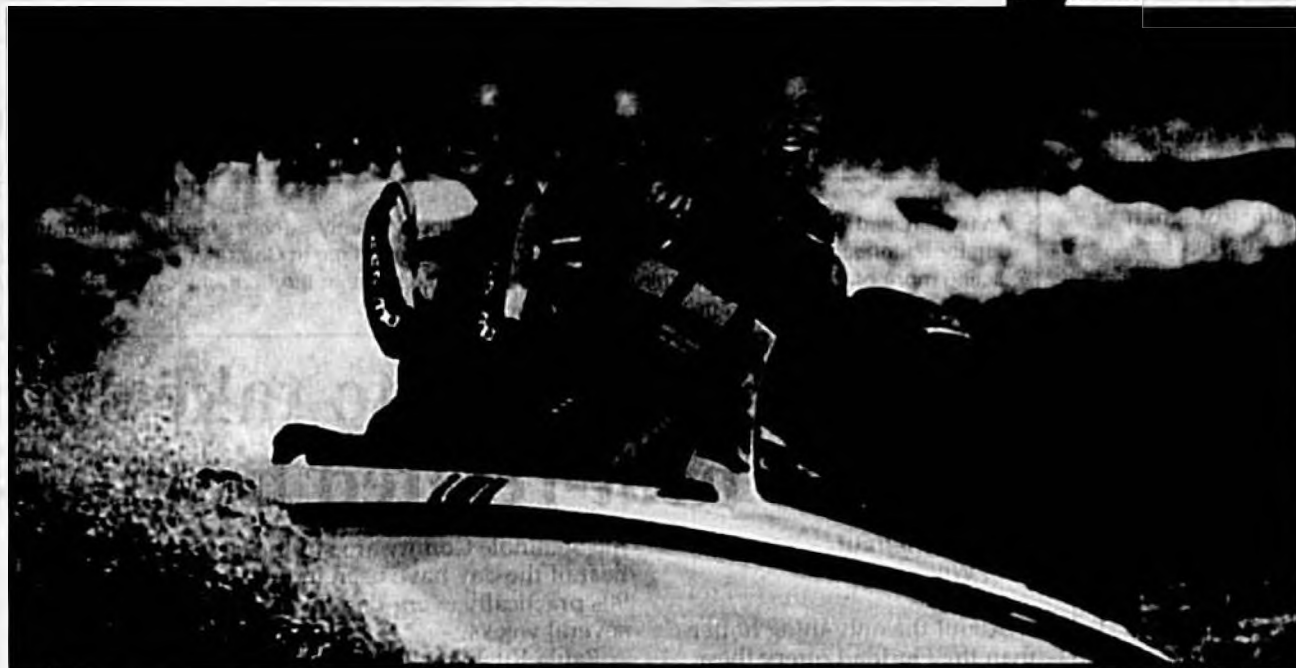

Now and then I look for lost things. Although I've never found what I believed to be lost, a number of other long-forgotten items do show up.

For a long while, I believed there was a logical explanation for the mysterious disappearances of items such as "Bugs" Raymond's T-206 cigarette card. Then, I realized logic just doesn't apply. "Bugs," like many of my other favorites, had gone to the haven for lost stuff. Sucked up and deposited into another realm.

I had the strangest feeling Sunday when I started leafing through a box of cassette

tapes. Did I really buy these tapes? Shirley Bassey, the Beatles, Bach, Beethoven.

Wait a second, the Bach case was empty. No Bach. Instead, there was "Bugs" Raymond.

"Hello," he seemed to be saying. "I was wondering if you would ever come to get me and the other fellows. We've been in here forever."

Incredibly, "Bugs" was uninjured. He looked better than he did the last time I saw him. Uninjured. Unwrinkled. Unsoiled.

The reason I'm telling you this story is to save you from making a similar mistake with items dear to your heart. It may be a piece of jewelry, a dumbbell, a Tupperware lid. You're going to be frantically searching for something and find it has vanished for good. Your hat, hankie or necktie has gone to the haven for lost stuff.

Boys and girls, I hope you find your lost article just as I found "Bugs." There are happy endings. Sometimes, if we're lucky, we can retrieve an item from the haven of lost stuff. That's what makes life so interesting.

In honor of my discovery, I am going to open an Arthur Lawrence "Bugs" Raymond repository. As of today, I'll place items I want to make sure don't get lost into this vault. Now, let's see, where is that "Bugs" Raymond card? Don't tell me.

Gott considers why people write to him

DEAR DR. GOTT: Why on earth don't many of your readers ask questions of their own doctors instead of writing to you for basic information?

DEAR READER: I, too, have speculated about this phenomenon. I receive about 2,500 letters a week, often containing questions that quite properly should be addressed by the readers' own physicians. I suspect that some people are shy about asking their doctors questions face-to-face; others have asked and received incoherent replies. Still others, unfortunately, do not have a family doctor in whom to confide. Finally, practitioners vary in their willingness and ability to answer questions.

For my part, I'm delighted when patients question me, make suggestions or — in a few cases — take me to task. Although many questions are repeated requests — such as the reasons for constipation and falling hair, or concerns about medications — most readers ask for sensible answers about diseases and express concerns about the ways in which medicine is practiced today. In the main, readers keep me on my toes, instruct me, stimulate me and give me a rich source of material.

For obvious reasons, I cannot answer questions personally and, because of time restraints, I cannot promptly respond in this column to all the questions that I receive. Nonetheless, I try to cover the interesting ones sooner or later, as I work my way through my stack of mail. The bottom line is: I welcome readers' questions, so if you need information, ask me. If you don't agree with an answer, write. If you want to congratulate, grouse, chew the fat — write. I believe that an educated and informed patient is a better patient. I like the prospect of interacting with readers and their physicians, for the purpose of improving health and knowledge of disease.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I experience whirling sparks in my vision that my doctor calls "photopsia." My cholesterol level is high, but I am otherwise in good health. What do you suggest?

DEAR READER: Photopsia is a symptom of a serious eye disorder that needs careful attention by an ophthalmologist. The sensation of whirling sparks may mean that the retina — the thin film on the back of the eyeball that is essential for vision — is being inappropriately stimulated.

The two most common causes of photopsia are retinal tears (when part of the retina peels away from its base because of a defect) and posterior vitreous detachment (when the jelly-like filling of the eyeball retracts and peels part of the retina with it). In some instances, these conditions are related to elevated blood cholesterol levels, so you need to address this issue, using a diet and/or medication.

Fortunately, with modern laser surgery, these retinal problems can at least be stabilized, if not cured. To give you related information, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Understanding Cholesterol." Those planning to take ACT assessment must register by Aug. 18

The next ACT (American College Testing) assessment will be administered on Sept. 23. College-bound high school students must register for the college admissions and placement exam by Aug. 18, the deadline for having a registration postmarked. There is a late registration fee charged after Sept. 1.

ACT scores are accepted by virtually all U.S. colleges and universities including all Ivy League schools, and are used along with other student information such as high school grade point average, for admissions decisions and to help place students in appropriate courses for their academic achievement.

The test fee in Florida is \$26. Students can register for the ACT by getting information

from their high school counselors or online at ACT's website www.act.org.

The website also has helpful information, sample tests and the opportunity to order test prep materials including an interactive CD-ROM, ACT Prep, which contains actual, timed tests and helps students build a study plan.

The ACT assessment is given in all 50 states and is the most popular college entrance exam taken by high school students in 25 states including Florida. It is a curriculum-based test, designed to measure a student's academic achievement and the appropriate course level for college placement.

There are four sections to the exam, English, reading, math and science reasoning. Approximately 1.8 million students took the test last year.

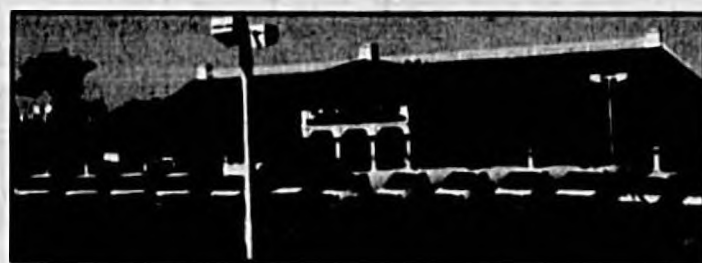

Nonetheless, the problem may exist for several more weeks, and we aren't suffering alone. Almost the entire state is undergoing these extreme temperatures, and state officials are urging caution. "The recent heat wave should remind us all to use common sense and caution when outdoors," said State Meteorologist Andy Devasas.

In Tallahassee, the Department of Community Affairs Division of Emergency Management has offered a number of safety tips:

- Never leave children or pets in a parked car.
- Slow down. Schedule strenuous activities for the coolest time of the day, preferably evenings.
- Dress for summer.

body maintain normal temperatures.

- Drink plenty of water or non-alcoholic fluids. Drink plenty, even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Persons who have epilepsy or heart, kidney, or liver disease, are on fluid restrictive diets or have a problem with fluid retention should contact a physician.
- Do not drink alcoholic beverages.

Avoid protein rich foods. They increase metabolic heat production and water loss.

- Avoid using salt tablets unless directed to do so by a physician.
- Stay indoors as much as possible.

Move the victim to a cool shaded location

- Give the victim lots of fluids (avoid sodas and alcohol)
- Wet the victim by using washcloths

"First, it is important to know the signs," said Alan Harris with the Injury Prevention Division. "Muscle cramps, heavy perspiration, weakness and nausea can mean that heat exhaustion and possibly a stroke is likely. A victim of heat related illness needs help immediately."

Altamonte Springs firemen say patients who cool off after a short amount of time should still avoid the heat for approximately three hours. Just because a person feels better does not mean they are ready to battle the sun and heat again.

date everything the city would like to place in the new station, including administration space.

"I read an article on a station in Baltimore," Haun said. "It is the only one I can find on the East Coast that includes administrative offices."

Plans for a new fire station have been considered by the city for several years. At one time, the city also discussed building two stations. However, the Commission decided to continue participating in the First Response Program and only

build the station on Rinehart Road.

In a side note, while discussing the fire department's budget, Litton mentioned the consolidation of the Sanford and Seminole County fire departments.

"Sanford and Seminole County have had informal discussions regarding consolidation of the two departments and in all reality, this Commission may be asked to participate," Litton said.

In the meantime, the city manager said the county would

like to see Lake Mary get its own transport vehicle, which would include hiring six additional paramedics. The city currently uses a unit from Seminole County.

The total proposed cost for the truck and additional personnel is estimated at \$213,870. "I do want to stress that should Commission choose not to fund the rescue unit at this time, I do not believe for a minute that Seminole County would pull their equipment and personnel from our station."

Quota Hunt applications available at commission regional offices

In addition to the regular nine-day and special quota hunt program that has been under way since

June 1, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) offers additional quota applications to participate in some rather unique hunts.

Applications for permits for these hunts are available from any of the Commission's regional offices. Applications to be included in the random drawings for these hunts must be received before July 28.

The Commission has established hunts for hunters who have mobility impairments and who require special equipment to have the opportunity to enjoy outdoor recreation. These hunts will be held on the Three Lakes and Seminole Forest wildlife management areas (WMAs) in central Florida, the Holton Creek WMA in northeast Florida, and the John G. and Susan H. Dupuis, Jr. Wildlife Environmental Area in the Everglades Region.

These hunts have been set aside for the exclusive use of mobility-impaired hunters. These hunts are not intended for hunters who have the Florida disabled hunting and fishing license, but rather those persons permanently confined to a wheelchair, persons requiring the use of mechanical aids (crutches and walkers) to walk or persons with complete single leg amputations. Ask for the Mobility-Impaired Persons Hunt application.

Another unique hunt that the Commission offers is the one established for young hunters at least eight-years old and under the age of 16.

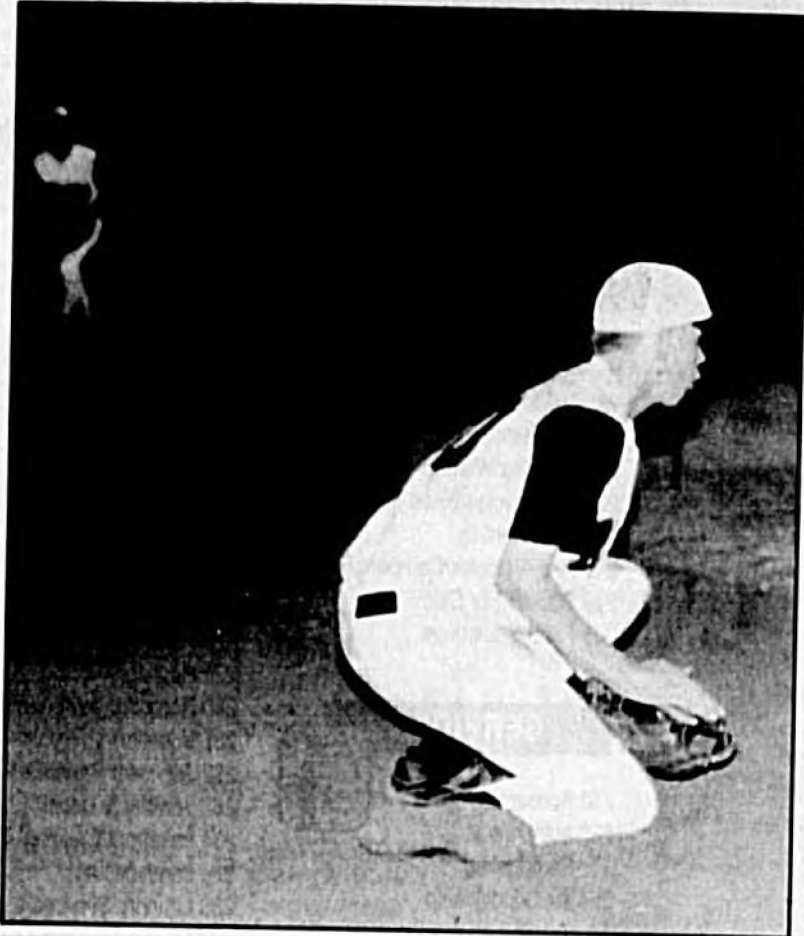
Two WMAs in northeast Florida, Camp Blanding and Andrews, offer the opportunity for adults to take young hunters on a public hunting area where the number of hunters and the hunting areas are rigidly controlled to provide an optimum learning experience.

These hunts have been very popular and the number of applicants exceeds the number of spaces available each year. Ask for the Camp Blanding and Andrews Supervised Youth Hunt application.

The Goethe WMA in Levy County has a quota on the number of groups that may use dogs to hunt. The Commission has established a quota of seven groups ranging in size

On the good side, Orlando Magic guard Darrell Armstrong was named among 99 professional athletes as part of *The Sporting News'* "Good Guys in Sports".

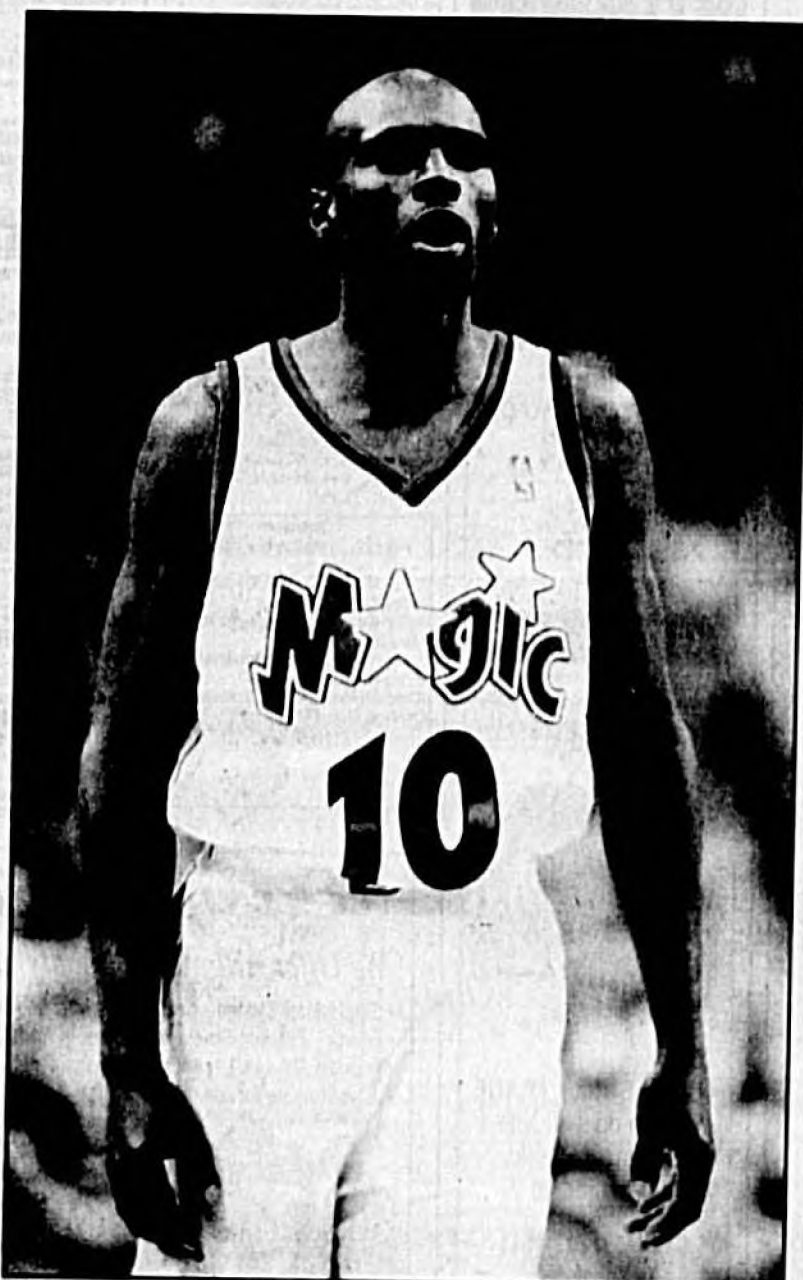
But on the bad side, starting power forward Ben Wallace and back-up point guard Chucky Atkins have apparently agreed to terms with the Detroit Pistons.

from five to 15 hunters. Goethe Dog Hunt applications will also be available from the regional offices.

The wildlife management areas in the southern part of the state offer hunters an unusual challenge because of the glades-like habitat. Hunting these areas requires special vehicles, and the Commission has established quotas on the number of these vehicles.

Permits to operate a track vehicle on the Rotenberger, Everglades and Holey Land WMAs are issued in two random selections. Track vehicles that were included in the 1999-2000 random selection, and received a permit for the Everglades, will be included in the first random selection. All other track vehicles will be included in the second random selection. Ask for the Track Vehicle application.

Applications for permits to operate airboats on the Everglades and Francis S. Taylor WMAs are also available from the regional offices of the Commission. Like the track vehicle permits, airboat permits are also issued in two random selections.

Those airboats that were included in the 1998-99 random selection, but did not receive a permit, will be included in the first random selection. All other airboats will be included in the second random selection. Ask for the Everglades Airboat application.

A new unit was added to the Blackwater WMA in northwest Florida. A quota hunt permit will be required to hunt quail on the Blackwater Hutton Unit. There are seven two-day hunts available, and the quota is two groups per hunt. A group may consist of up to three hunters. Shooting hours end at 3 p.m., and the bag limit is 12 quail per group per day. Ask for the Hutton Unit Quail Hunt application.

Approximately 47,000

requests for regular nine-day and special quota hunt permits were received during the June 1-11 application period. Data entry into the computer is continuing at a steady pace. The drawing will take place as soon as the data entry has been completed. The projected date is July 24.

Hunters will receive either a quota hunt permit or a rejection notice. If you are one of the estimated 10,000 that will receive a rejection notice, there will be instructions on the notice for reapplying for other areas that may still have permits available.

SHUPE'S SCOOP

Many hunting experts advise hunters to sight their rifles in two inches high at 100 yards so their gun will be "dead on" at 25-300 yards. Most shots are well under 100 yards, and I sight my gun dead center at 100 yards. Out west, where long shots are the norm, it might make sense to be prepared for 300 yard shots.

FISHING FORECAST

Bass action in the river

south of Puzzle Lake is still good for this time of year. As long as the water is in the banks, anglers will continue to have fast action with fish from 1-5 pounds. The bass are hitting a wide variety of artificial lures, from topwater to plastic worms. Catfish and bream are biting worms and mussels in the deep bends.

Sebastian Inlet has good catch-and-release snook action with fish to 20 pounds. Also expect redfish, trout, and a few flounder. Some king mackerel are just off the beach.

Captain Jack at Port Canaveral reports that king mackerel are just off the beach to 8 A reef and Pelican Flats. Tripletail and king mackerel are in the buoy line, and sheephead and flounder are hitting inside the Port. Trout and redfish are rated as fair in the Banana and Indian rivers.

Ponce Inlet has good action with sheephead, drum, redfish, jack crevalle, and ladyfish. Live or dead shrimp is the best bait. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.
