





The local negro who was cutting down a tree the Paola road last week did not climb up the power the Phota road last week and not climb up the power com-pany's pole and play with the electric wiring. He did not find a broken but live wire lying on the ground and thoughtlessly pick it up. He simply chopped down a tree, much as any other wood chopper might, but the tree happened to fall against some wires. He reached up and took hold of the branches of the tree to drag it off the wires.

The tree happened to be full of sap, forming an ex-cellent conductor for the electricity, and the negro was killed instantly. A white man working nearby also tried to remove the tree from the wires, but fortunately seized the tree lower down, farther away from the wires, and was only slightly injured. Had he touched the negro while the negro was touching the tree, or had he touched the tree himself as high up as the negro had, he too would have been killed instantly.

So you cannot be too careful where electric wires are involved. If you are ever in any doubt as to whether the wire is live or not, you had better assume it is. For if you should make a mistake and conclude that a line is dend, when it is alive, you would probably never live to tell the tale. Keep away from electric wires, and keep away from anything that happens to be in contact with live wires.


