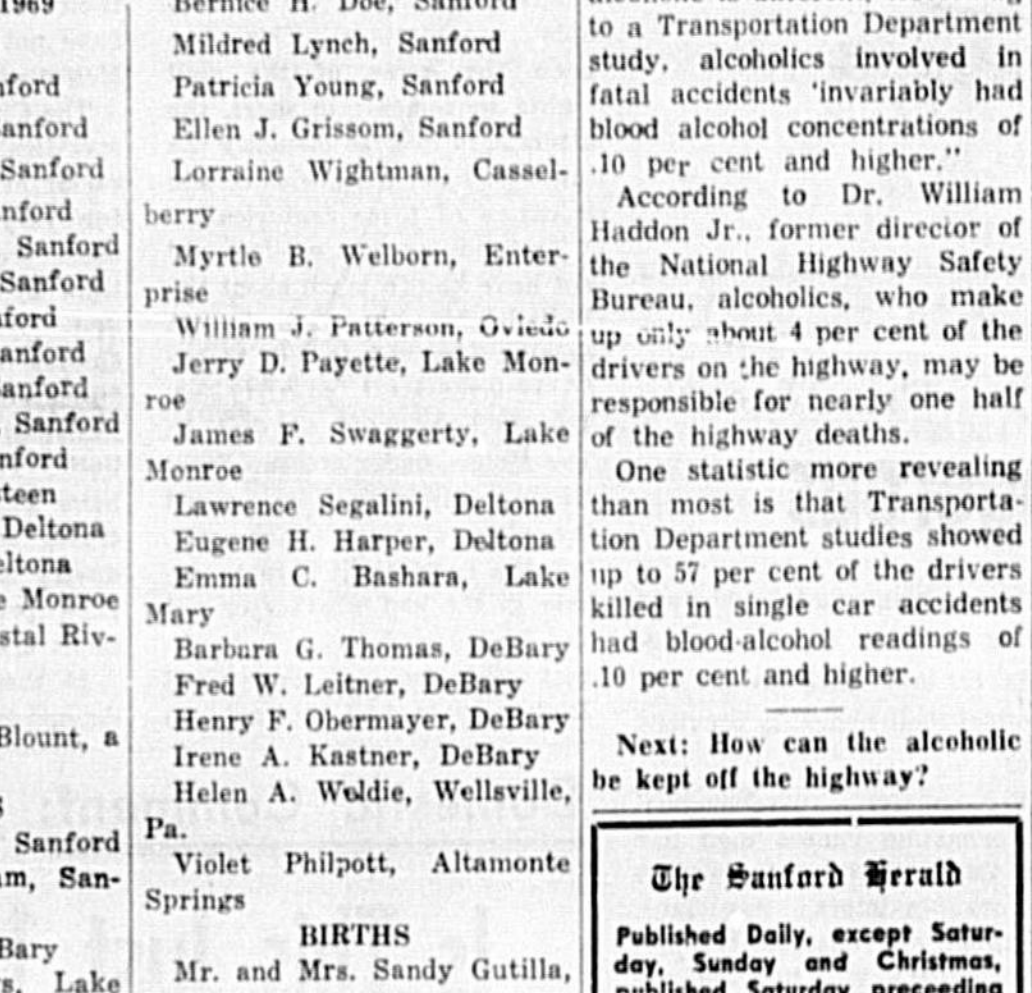

Republican Hopes Riding High In 1970s

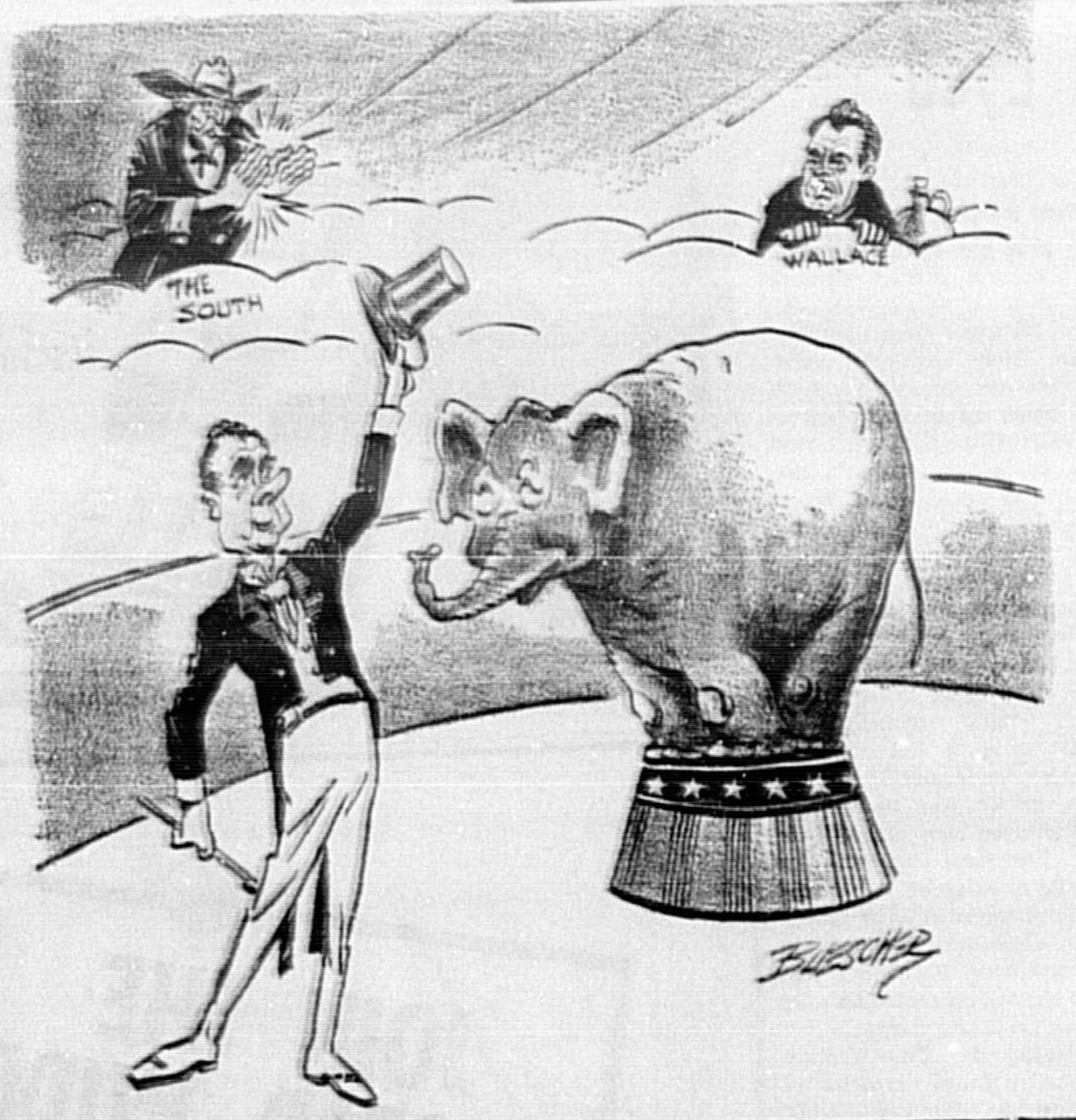

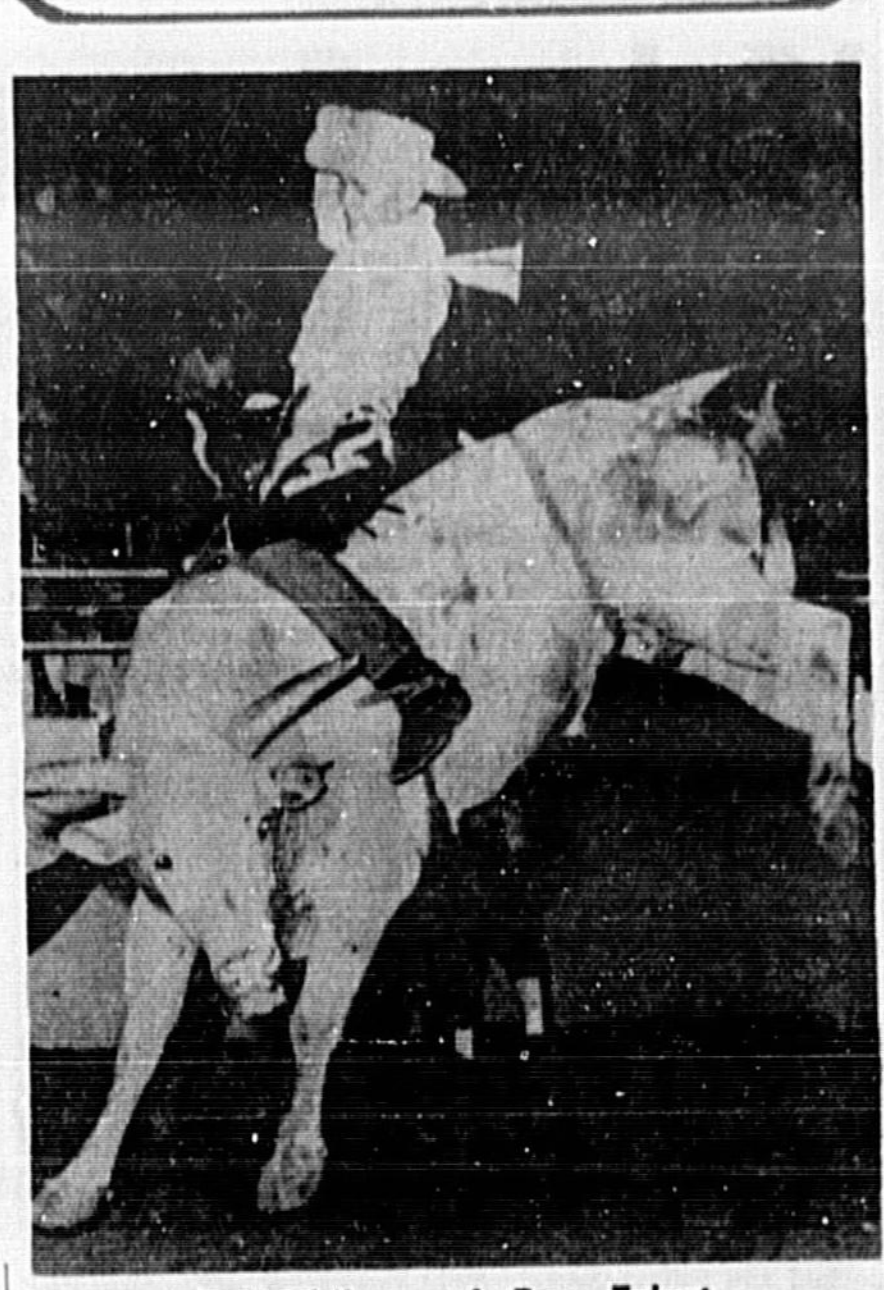
