COULDN'T KILL MULE

"OLD TOBE" NONE THE WORSE FOR LONG IMMERSION.

Incident of the Civil War Shows How Hard It Is to Separate Government Pack Animal From Uncle Sam's Rations.

Z. P. Holchkiss, adjutant of Phil Sheridan post G. A. R. of Oak Park, Ill., tells the following experience with a government mule. As an army telegrapher Mr. Hotchkias was attached to the staff of General Canby in the final Mobile campaign.

"The entire outfit for the construction of the army telegraph lines," says Mr. Hotchkiss, "was carried on the backs of forty pack mules. A coil of half a mile of wire hung upon each side of the saddle.

"There were six young operators, one from each corps, mounted on horses. To these boys had been intrusted the government cipher and knowledge of the advance movement of the troops. These secrets were safe, as none of the young fellows ever betrayed a trust.

VARIETIES OF STOVES

NATIONS HAVE DIFFERENT METH ODS OF KEEPING WARM.

Russian Sleeps Over Brick Contrivance in Which Slow Fire Burns-

Holland's Heating Arrangement Perhaps Most Economical.

The stove is, comparatively speakng a new invention. So late as the time of Queen Elizabeth people didnot have chimneys; they built their fires in a round hearth in the middle of the room, and when chimneys were introduced, the old fashioned folk all grumbled, because, they said, smoky nir was good for colds. But to the eastward stoves of brick and porcolain were commonly used.

A stove made of brick in used in Russia, and in it a slow fire burns all night long. On top of it, when night comes, the peasant and his whole familly, in their sheepskins, lie down and go to sleep. It is nice and warm, rather like a window seat that is over a radiator, and sometimes there is a second shelf overhead for any stran-

ger who may be staying overnight. The brick stove of the llussian peasant, in all probability, came overland from China too long ago to talk about, for the Chinese have stoves of brick and clay shaped something like

In Japan there is not much need of keeping warm, but whatever stoves there are in a Japanese home are low, for the life here is all carried on sitting or kneeling on the floor. ST. JOHNS RIVER ITEMS ARE SAVED INTACT

Washington, 'April 13.-The annual river and harbor appropriation bill carrying \$40,000,000 passed the house today by a vote of 210 and 133 with every item as agreed on in committee unchanged. Scores of amendments to cut down items urged by representatives charged that the bill was a "perk barrel" measure were rejected during the two weeks' debate. Just before the final vote an effort was led by Republican Leader Mann to reduce the total to \$20,000,000 failed 200 to 149.



ANSWER: It make no difference which of these materials you use to soften water. Water is hard because of holding in solution certain minerals. The "softener" merely combines with these minerals to form insoluble com pounds, thereby removing from solution both the elements of "hardness" and the "softener" so the spray is practically free from both

ANSWER | We should use for this purpose a fertilizer analyzing 5 per cent ammonia and s per cent phosphoric acid made from well proportioned ammoniates and available phosphoric acid. Ban Jose Scale

My peach trees are not doing well. The young branches are dying back. There seems to be a kind of gray roughness on the bark

ANSWER: You have San Jose scale. It will kill your trees if not controlled. The proper treatment is to spray in dormant season with lime-sulphur mixed at the rate of one gallon to nine gallons water. This spray will burn the foliage. Now the leaves have started, great care must be taken in the application, but the cleaning up of the trunks and larger branches will help greatly.

Lime-Sulphur for Scale Would you advise spraying with

lime-sulphur solution for scale in fruit trees? Have been using Bordeaux alray and would like a little advice. ANSWER: Lime Sulphur solution is an excellent spray for scale on peach trees during dormant season using it at the rate of, one galion to nine gallons of water. There is danger of burning citrus foliage when lime sulphur is used stronger than one to forty and this will kill only the youngest scales. We therefore could not consider it an effective remedy. You had better use miscible oil.

Will Nitrate Of Soda Waste? Will nitrate of soda dissolve and draw into the ground if it is thrown on top of the ground, or will it evapo-

ANSWER: Nitrate of soda will dissolve and go down in the ground if it is sown on top of the ground and raked in exaugh to reach damp soft or left until rains come. There will be no loss whatever.


