### Computers Err In Estimates Of Tax Revenues

NEW YORK (AP) — This has been a rugged year for the forecasters, most of whom have been kept busy undoing, correcting and painfully reforecasting and, in the U.S. Treasury's case, revising downward.

The errors are so widespread—and generally on the low side when measuring anticipated revenues—that mankind has a right to wonder if the electronic computer is his friend, or at least as reliable as a friend should be.

The computer, and its tendency to look unemotionally into the future, is the machine that has made us so dependent, so reliant not just on the present but on what is yet to come.

Among the recent statistical revisions are federal income tax revenue, the death rate, state lottery returns, retail sales, the stock market.

The list is literally endless, but it is most painful and treacherous when it includes forecasts of revenue much higher than this year's reality.

New York State established a lottery this year to raise \$198 million annually for schools. But so slowly that it appears as if the \$60 million will be raised.

Early this year the Johnson administration anticipated tax collections fully \$7 billion higher than the rate at which they are now arriving at the Treasury.

### S-S Tax Hike Opposed, Poll Shows

Congressman A. Sydney Herlong Jr. today announced the results of his questionnaire on the principal issues before the Congress at the current session.

On the question of increasing Social Security taxes, the tally was 43.1 per cent in favor and 56.9 per cent against.

On the question of abolishing the Electoral College system and adopting popular vote in the election of the president and vice president, 53.9 per cent were in favor of abolishing it.

On the issue of providing tax incentives to encourage industry cooperation in a program of abating air and water pollution, the vote is 77.2 per cent for and 22.8 per cent against.

On the question of a six per cent surtax, the tally was 58.8 per cent against and 41.2 per cent for.

On the anti-poverty program 89.6 per cent opposed increases in appropriations and 10.4 per cent were for increasing them.

Total of 73.4 per cent of those replying would reduce anti-poverty appropriations and 26.6 per cent would not reduce them.

On elimination of them all together, 60.8 per cent were in favor and 39.2 per cent were against.

On the Federal Rent Subsidy program 86.1 per cent were opposed and 13.9 per cent were for.

On the question of firearms control laws, 48.3 were for and 51.7 per cent were against.

### Health Fraud Racket Outlined For Retirees

By JANE CASSELLBERRY  
Department of Health and Welfare slides on the health fraud racket on the theme, "The Same Old Snake Oil," were shown at the August meeting of Chapter 286, National Association of Retired Civil Employees.

The chapter includes members from Casselberry, Longwood, Park Park and Altamonte Springs.

President Carl Setz reported that over 200 civil service retirees stopped for information at the NARCE booth in the Winter Park Mall and 18 new members have joined as a result, with more expected.

Setz has appealed to congressmen on behalf of legislation for the return of full credit for medical costs towards income tax and in opposition to proposals to eliminate retirement income credit for income tax purposes.

He explained the new proposed bill on Social Security which would raise the minimum from \$44 to \$50, the maximum from \$142 to \$150, and special benefits for those over 72 from \$15 to \$40, and the Medicare bill which would increase from 90 to 120 days for one spell of illness with the patient required to pay one-half the cost of additional days. Payment to doctors, in addition to present methods of payment, will be made on submitting itemized bill rather than requirement of paid receipts. Out patient hospital service would be transferred to the medical insurance program. Changes are effective January, 1968.

Earning limitations would be increased from \$1,000 to \$1,400, effective that date.

All members having Social Security were advised to write their congressmen for approval of this bill, HR 12080 and the Medicare Bill.

There were 48 members and 17 visitors present. Among the visitors were Chester M. Wamser, president of Orlando Chapter 86 and Mrs. Wamser, two past presidents, Edward Levy and Herbert S. Mahurin, and Mrs. Mahurin.

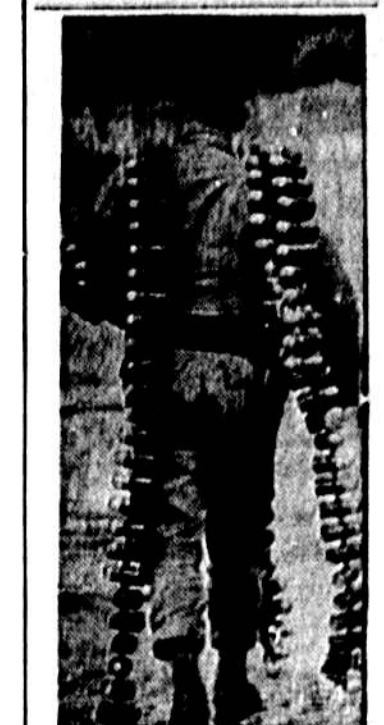

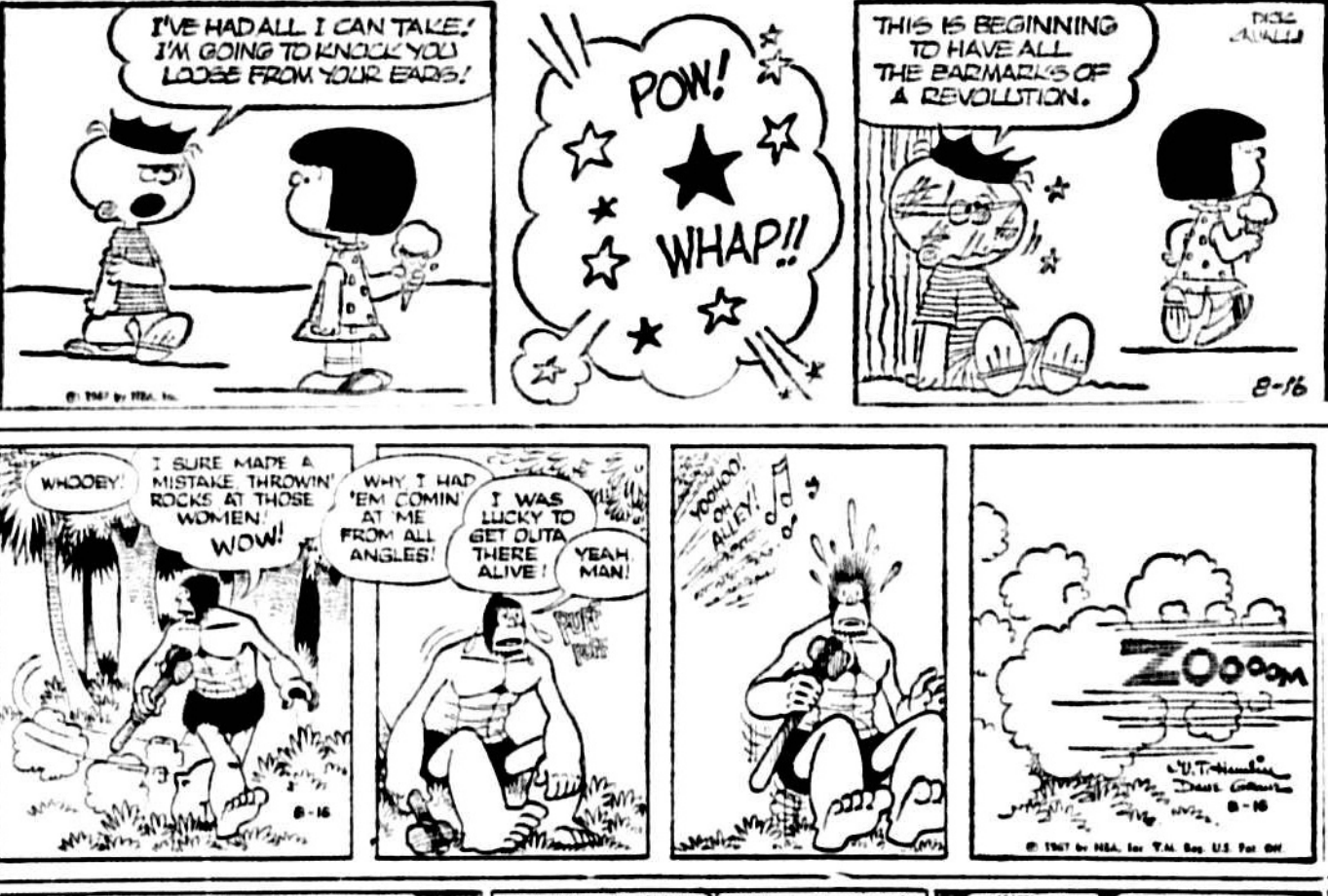
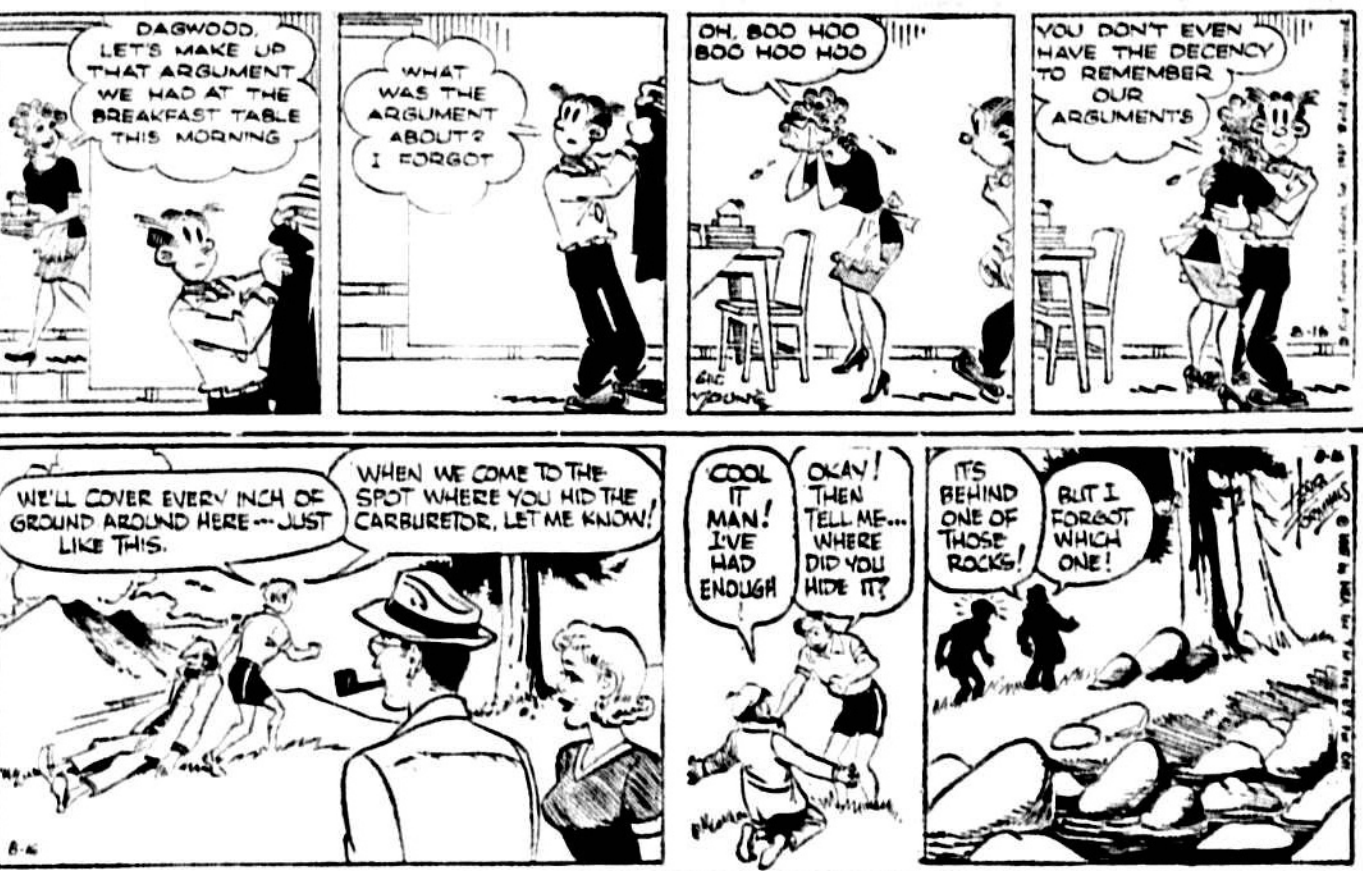
