



Measure Now Goes To Senate Where Its Foes Anticipate Strong Opposition

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7,--(AP)—The House has passed the hotly disputed strike control bill sponsored by Representative Francis Case of South Dakota. The vote was 257 to 155, on a roll-call count. Just before the final ballot, the House shouted down an attempt to send the measure back to committee. The bill now goes to the Senate, where its foes predict it will encounter strong opposition. It would set up a federal mediation board to handle labor disputes, prohibit strikes or lock-outs for 30 days, forbid boycotts and violence in picketing and allow civil suits against violators of labor-management contracts. The bill seems certain to meet a stiff fight in the Senate Opponents predict that it will be killed either by a Senate rejection or a presidential veto.
