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### Nazi Girls Cross Hitler And Birth Rate Is Declining

**New Babies Are 11  
 Percent Below  
 Number Expected**

 There is no crisis for babies  
 Announcement in Berlin that the Reich expects every German woman to bear a child—latest development of a plan started six years ago to increase the German birth rate—now is met by revelation that the Nazi baby market is down, not up.  
 Despite the Fuhrer's orders the German birth rate is falling and now is 11 percent below the level needed to maintain a positive population balance. The figures are revealed in a new book, "Hail Hunger," published by Alliance Book Corp., New York.  
 The book, written by Dr. Martin Gumpert, now a practicing New York physician and former head of a Berlin clinic, is based on scientific information which slipped through German censorship.  
 "The fecundity of the Ger-

man woman under the Third Reich," he asserts, "falls far below the record of the wretched year of economic crisis, 1933, when for every thousand women capable of bearing children (that is, between the ages of 15 and 45) there were 22.3 births."  
 "In 1937, under Hitler, that fecundity sank to its lowest level, 17.1 per thousand. And according to the latest computations of the Statistics Department of the Reich, the number of mothers with four or more children declined between the middle of 1933 and the beginning of 1937 by 150,000."  
 Fall in the German birth-rate follows the decline of the marriage rate. From the high level of 1934 (18.3 per thousand) marriages receded to 8.9 per thousand in 1937, according to Dr. Gumpert.  
 Heinrich Himmler, head of all Nazi police, recently urged women to have children, either in or out of wedlock. Special sponsors would be appointed for all children "of good blood born in or out of wedlock whose fathers fall in war," promised Himmler.  
 While the birth-rate is falling notwithstanding such pleas, says Dr. Gumpert, the mortality rate is rising. At least 80,000 more persons now die annually in Germany than before the Nazi regime. In 1937 the death-rate for infants under one year was 6.4 percent. In New York

### Dewey Advocates National Plan For Farm Prosperity

LINCOLN, Neb., Mar. 2 —(AP)—Thomas E. Dewey, New York district attorney who leads the Republican presidential nomination, said last night agricultural prosperity can come only through a national plan to "improve health, vitality and balance in our entire economy."

Delivering over the radio the main address of the Nebraska Republican leadership day celebration, Dewey declared "government must first seek the advice of the farmers rather than the advice of statisticians and theorists. That it must act on that advice."  
 Dewey, describing himself as a man whose only savings are invested in a farm, told his audience of city folk and farmers, he knew of "no single source that will solve the farm problem overnight" but did outline an eight-point plan he deemed to be "part of any proper agricultural program, but only part."  
 1. Establish a fair parity between agricultural prices and industrial prices.  
 2. Provide government crop insurance at reasonable levels.  
 3. Adopt a broad program of soil conservation.  
 4. Convert sub-marginal land to

### New Yorkers See Television Photos Of City From Air

NEW YORK, Mar. 2 —(AP)—Televised from the sky in the first public test of the kind ever made, New York city unfolded itself on receivers all over the metropolitan area and in Schenectady yesterday afternoon just as it looks to aviators winging over head. Results were regarded as pretty good.

Viewers sitting before eight by 16-inch receiving screens easily picked out big buildings, new automobiles speeding along the parkways, and boats in the Hudson and East rivers, looked down on the world's fair grounds and followed the skyline in the more congested areas.

 Highlights of the television-from-the-sky came near the end of the 45-minute news program when views of a 21-passenger plane accompanying the camera machine were shown on the screen. A board with newspapermen looking on a specially installed receiver. Thus they could see their own plane in action.  
 The test broadcast, designed to indicate some of the possibilities from the entertainment standpoint as well as hunting at what might be done some day in military maneuvers, was put on by the Radio Corporation of America and the National Broadcasting company in cooperation with United Airlines.  
 The camera plane, carried a newly developed 700-pound portable television transmitter operating on a 104-centimeter wavelength. One camera was pointed out a window, while a second was located in the baggage compartment with the door open. While intended primarily for use on the ground, the transmitter was adapted for airplane purposes.
