





For Graham: A \$43.74 Windfall



TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Troops and police opened fire today on revelers celebrating the departure of Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi in two key towns, hours after troops and demonstrators hugged and kissed each other. First reports said 17 people were killed and at least 50 wounded by gunfire.

Witnesses said troops started shooting at demonstrators in the southern oil city of Ahvaz around 9 a.m. "They're still blasting away." a Western resident of Ahvaz told UPI over telephone.

Iran Quake Toll: 1.000

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — An earthquake that wiped out three villages within minutes of the shah's forced departure killed more than 1,000 and injured at least 1,000 others, Iranian newspapers said today. The revised death toll from the Tuesday quake, which devastated three villages in northeastern Iran, was not immediately confirmed by Moslem clergymen working in the far-flung quake area near the city of Qaen.

Shah Shares Woes With Sadat

ASWAN, Egypt (UPI) — The shah of Iran spent his first full day away from the Peacock Throne in the seclusion of a plush Aswan hotel, telling Egyptian President Anwar Sadat about his ordeal and flight from his homeland.

'Top Secret' Spy Data Forged?

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Soviet KGB circulated a "Top Secret" U.S. Army document purporting to have been issued March 19, 1970, by Gen. William Westmoreland, then Army chief of staff, professing to recommend infiltrating U.S. Army intelligence agents into the armed forces of host countries and also into insurgent forces and extreme radical groups. U.S. officials say if was forged.

Skyjackers Free 82 Hostages

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) — Five Lebanese Shiite Moslems released 82 terrified hostages from a hijacked jetliner today, saying all they wanted was to focus world attention on the plight of their missing religious leader, Imam Musa Sadr, who vanished last August while visiting Lebya.

U.S. Pushing Mideast Talks

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Special U.S. envoy Alfred Atherton today began efforts to get the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty talks moving again, but his mission was complicated by an Israeli Cabinet decision to create new military outposts in occupied territory. Administration sources in Washington said Carter is sending a strong protest to Israel over the planned creation of the three new settlements in the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

156 Hostages At Embassy

SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (UPI) — Armed leftist youths, demanding the release of "hundreds of political prisoners," have taken 156 hostages in a seizure of the Mexican Embassy and an Organization of American States office. Mexican officials said one security guard suffered a leg injury because he resisted occupation of the building. There were no further reports of violence.

Fears Envy, Forfeits \$51,282

TOKYO (UPI) — A Japanese office worker who won \$51,282 in a year-end lottery burned his ticket and forfeited the prize to avoid hostility and envy among the people of his hometown, Japanese news media reported

Gas-Leak Blast Destroys **Bell Telephone Office**

ABERDEEN, Miss. (UPI) - An explosion destroyed the South Central Bell Telephone Co. office building in the northeast Mississippi city today, cutting off service to some 4.000

Fire department officials said the explosion, which occurred shortly before 4 a.m. CST, was apparently caused by a gas leak. It was not immediately known if there were any injuries. Tom Bailey, a telephone company spokeman in Tupelo, Miss., estimated damage at over \$1 million. Bailey said crews were trying to restore emergency service and that portable offices and trailers would probably be moved in later today.

Explosion Destroys 3 Homes

SHAW. Miss. (UPI) — A natural gas transmission line exploded in a sparselypopulated area southeast of this Mississippi Delta town today, destroying three homes and forcing the temporary evacuation of a small number of local students.

Carter Taps Bella Successor

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Mariorie Chambers, president of the American Association of University Women, who advocates a slow "chip-away" method of solving problems, will be named acting head of the women's advisory panel that clashed with President Carter on policy, sources say. The move was seen as an attempt by the White House to prove it intended to keep the panel alive despite the mass resignations that followed Carter's dramatic firing of Bella Abzug as co-leader last week.

N.Y.: 24-Hour Hospital Strike

NEW YORK (UPI) — Interns and residents of the nation's largest municipal hospital system defied a state Supreme Court injuction and began a 24-hour strike today to protest planned cutbacks. The strike was the first walkout by physicians against the municipal hospital system in the city's history.

Revoke Tennessee Pardons?

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (UPI) — The state attorney general's office said it is trying to determine if Gov.-elect Lamar Alexander could revoke the 52 pardons and commutations signed by Gov. Ray Blanton Monday night. The actions included 23 communications for murderers and one pardon for a man convicted of murder. Fifteen of the others were convicted of armed robbery. Twenty-nine of the total had their sentences commuted to time served.

Vessel, 25 Tons Pot Seized

MIAMI (UPI) — The Coast Guard seized a 65-foot Venezuelan fishing vessel today with an estimated 25 tons of marijuana aboard worth up to \$16.5 million at street prices — 250 miles southwest of Key West.

Tractors Moving Toward D.C.

Missiles: One Up, One Down

CAPE CANAVERAL (UPI) - The Air Force successfully tested one air-to-ground missile over the Atlantic Ocean today but aborted a second test due to technical difficulties. The first "Short Range Attack Missile" was successfully fired from a Strategic Air Command plane into a predetermined target area, Air Force spokesman Capt. Roland Rabb said.



Cost Of Trade War

Trade bargaining under the best of conditions is a lengthy, bitter process.

Under the added pressures of inflation recession and fuel shortages, negotiation is nearly

The current talks at Geneva were initiated more than five years ago at a conference in Tokyo with a 1977 deadline for dealing with a code on trade barriers.

The deadline was not met. Neither was the new target of Dec. 15, 1978, and there is no hint of imminent accord. But the alternative to a workable agreemen

could be an all-out trade war in which victories would be few — casualties many.

The United States' position has helped to complicate the Geneva talks.

Congress, sensitive to pressure from industrial constituents, failed in its last session to extend President Carter's authority to waive import duties on products benefitting from subsidies abroad. European exporters of canned hams and

cheese, in particular, are irate. The "protectionist" mood of Congress is reflected in hints of retaliation by trading partners with quotas and added duties on such exports as

tobacco, citrus and clothing. The president has pledged to seek renewal of his waiver authority in the new Congress but the

Europeans are skeptical of his success. Under the circumstances, it may be just as well that no policies have been adopted at Geneva. The president has been successful thus far in

blocking congressional measures that would restrict his ability to lift meat import quotas and negotiate reductions in textile tariffs. He should be able to presuade Congress to give him the flexibility he needs to maintain the free

flow of trade. The protections sought by U.S. producers against competition from abroad would be of fleeting benefit, if our own export trade is brought

The effort to find a equitable trade policy to reduce the serious trade deficit demands that the president's negotiation team have the ability to give and take in the discussions.

Restoration of bargaining flexibility should be a priority of this new Congress.

A proposed music-entertainment festival ordinance was sent back to the drawing boards by Seminole County Commissioners Monday after a 90minute workshop and after one commissioner branded a section dictatorial and another asked if it is the county's responsibility "to be all things to all

people."
At the same time, Commission Chairman Bob French, who saw nothing wrong with the proposal authored by Office of Management, Analysis and Evaluation (OMAE) director, Jeff Etchberger, supported the ordinance planned to replace a less restrictive one. French noted that practically all music festivals applying for permit approval in the past few years have been planned for his district. French's district is comprised of parts of Casselberry and east to Oviedo and Geneva where

many open fields are available for festivals. A provision that all those attending a music festival be 17 years old unless accompanied by a parent or guardian was branded "dictatorial" by Commissioner Bob Sturm. He said teen-agers beginning at 14 are interested in the festivals.

"What is the purpose of the 17-year-old requirement?" asked Commissioner Dick Williams. "Why write something that is unenforceable? Are you going to grab someone and say 'where are your parents?' That would be a switch." French said he would like to see 18 as the minimum age permitted without parent or guar-

"How about enacting the ordinance for District 1? handle the process on the next request," French

"Is the county government trying to be all things to all people?" asked Commissioner Sandra Glenn. Mrs. Glenn also voiced concern that the issue of liquor, beer and wine was not mentioned in the ordinance, saying a provision either allowing or forbidding its sale at the festivals should be in-

"The broad issue is whether we are going to allow brown-bagging of liquor. That issue may have to be addressed in the ordinance," Etchberger said, adding the promoter could acquire a beer and wine license for the event. Sturm asked whether circuses or the Florida

Symphony Orchestra concert held annually at the Springs could be interpreted as a music festival? Etchberger responded that both would. Williams urged that the types of entertainment to be regulated be included in the definition of the words "music festival" in the ordinance. "How about field



22 New Jobs In Seminole

\$185,000 CETA Funds Approved

The Seminole County Commission Tuesday approved the allocation of \$185,000 in federal funding through the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) program to create 22 new jobs in seven governmental and civic units. Approved were:

-Two electrical trainees, two plumber trainees and six carpenter trainees at total cost of \$77,974.51 for the Sanford Housing Authority to preserve existing housing stock, revitalization of neighborhoods, involve local financial institutions, create jobs and long term employment.

-A coordinator for cultural affairs at annual cost of \$9,338.31, requested by the Council of Arts and Sciences for Central Florida Inc., to identify existing cultural resources in the county and conduct needs assessment for cultural awareness, conduct research including interviews and surveys.

- Two instructional aides at cost \$12,797.90 requested by the Seminole County School Board, to develop reading program for grades six through eight at Sanford Middle School to instruct basic reading skills, word attack skills, comprehensive skills and study skills and assisting reading specialist.

- A clerk-typist at cost of \$7,147.32, requested by the Seminole County Health Department, to issue burial transit permits, check birth and death certificates for accuracy, send embalmers affidavits to ments of other counties.

- A pool maintenance worker, part-time, at cost of \$4,389.82 requested by the city of Altamonte Springs to maintain swimming pool, chlorine room, pump room, suanas, restrooms, locker rooms and keep all areas clean for use of the public.

- A senior counsellor and two supervisors at cost of \$41,812.88 for the Seminole County Sheriff's Department to coordinate and supervise juveniles assigned to the work project by an arbitrator or by the juvenile

- Four homamakers and one homemaker lead at cost of \$32,897 for the Bay Area Home Health Services to provide homemaker assistance to citizens including indigent and underprivileged, who are homebound and physically unable to maintain their home

Welcome Mat Out, Waiting For Refugee Family

Two Sanford churches are awaiting the arrival of a Laotian refugee family which they are co-sponsoring Refugees from Northern Laos, the family has been living in a refugee camp in Northern Thailand for three years and has been promised a place to live and a job by the Lutheran Church of the

Good Shepherd and Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, which are cooperating on the project. The family, consisting of the father, Cha-Va, 31; mother, Ma-Thor, 28, son, Chieng Seng Cha, 5 and daughter, Ma-linee Cha, one month, comes from an ethnic group in Laos called the Hmongs

(pronounced mung). The committee, headed by Tamar Braden, is readying an apartment in anticipation of the family's arrival sometime in

Members of Good Shepherd were asked to bring food items such as rice and cooking oil to church Sunday to stock the apartment and members of Redeemer will donate towels and linens. A special fund has been set up for cash donations.

The family was located through the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service, which will loan them the money for the flight to Orlando from Thailand.

The idea for the project was sparked by Mrs. Braden, who is a member of the Social Concerns Committee of the Florida-Georgia

District of the Lutheran Church. "Last spring I attended a committee meeting at St. Petersburg where the need was stressed for finding sponsors to help relocate refugee families. "Ascension Lutheran Church in Casselberry has had a Vietnamese family for more than three years, as has had St. John's in Winter Park. Some churches are on their second and third family," said Mrs. Braden, "so I thought I would approach the congregation at Redeemer, I didn't expect a positive answer, but I thought if I said I would provide the housing and job, it would be harder for them to turn it down."

The church agreed to look into the sponsorship of a refugee family and a committee was formed. In October the congregation voted its approval and after Mrs. Braden spoke at Good Shepherd, the congregation there voted to cooperate in the project. "It's a venture of faith, we don't know what is ahead," said Mrs. Braden. "We've been told they don't speak English, but we are hoping the father may have picked up some basic English in the
