



A black male dressed in black and wearing a white cloth over his face brandished a black semi-automatic pistol when he robbed the Handy-Way Store at 1301 W. Airport Blvd. at 10:48 p.m.

Josephine Armstrong, 66 .was the clerk on duty and was unharmed. The robber escaped with from 830 to 850. The police have the incident recorded on video tape from the store.

Joe Cephas Hanks, 35, of Geneva was pronounced dead at Columbia Medical Center-Sanford at 2:50 a.m. after being taken to the hospital by a Sanford Fire Department rescue team which responded to a call from the Lake Jenny Apartments at Santa Barbara Drive.

The Sanford Police report said that according to witnesses. Banks stripped to his undershorts and jumped into the deep end of the awimming pool at the apartments. He was pulled from the pool five minutes later,

## Schools' tax bite to hurt less

The Seminole County School Board unanimously and without much discussion approved on Thursday a tentative school budget of 6485.819.944. a 10.6 percent increase over last year.

The 1997-98 proposed fiscal budget reflects an operating budget of \$278,472,464 which includes salaries and benefits for the school district's staff, materials and supplies. utilities, maintenance, building operations, and student transportation.

Capital projects comprise \$134,769,912 and include construction and renovations for Goldsboro Elementary School, Lake Brantley High School, Rock Lake Middle School Gymanstum, Sanford Middle School, and Seminole High School. Oviedo will get a new middle and elementary school and one other elementary school on a site yet to be determined.

#### Controversy continues over city's report card

LAKE MARY - Joel Ivey told the Lake Mary City Commission last night that the selection of the firm that will prepare the Evaluation and Appraisal Report has been "iong, arduous and frustrating."

lvey is a principal in the firm of Ivey, Harris and Walls, which was chosen to proceed with work on the EAR, a report card on the city's comprehensive plan, at the July 10 commission meeting. But the ranking of Ivey's firm is now in jeopardy because of questions raised concerning the procedure used in selecting the team that selected the firm.

Doug Porner, civic activist and member of the Local Planning Agency, challenged the legality of the selection process at the July 24 commission meeting and City Manager John Litton, 'in an abun-

dance of caution," asked the city list, ranking and selection commitcommission to allow city staff to start the selection team process over again. "go(ing) back to that place in the process where questions were raised."

City Planner Matthew West reported to the commission last night that "it has become apparent that only the city commission is the appropriate body," and asked the commission to review, rank and select a consultant. West had said last week that the Local Planning Agency would be charged with picking the selection team, and would solely determine the members of the board, which may or may not include the original team. or any members of city staff. But after speaking with members of the board, West reported there is apparently no one on the board suitable to serve in that capacity and asked the city commission to "appoint Itself as the review, short-

It was at this point, during the discussion of the agenda item that ivey asked to be allowed to address the commission concerning the matter, ivey said, "If I was affluent or lazy, I would withdraw from this process completely." He said he would not because the choice of his firm was a 'legal choice, the process has been overly reactive and I have no desire to back down to bullying from one citizen, and we believe we are the best firm."

#### Senate passes tuna-dolphin bill

WASHINGTON, DC+-The U.S. Senate voted on Wednesday to enhance protections for dolphins and other marine life in the Bastern Tropical Pacific (ETP). The Senate passed \$396 the International Dolphin Protection Program Activative reaching a compromise on the bill's provisions late last week. The bill is endorsed by the Center for Marine Conservation (CMC). which has helped lead the charge for stronger measures to protect dolphus and the marine ecosystem in the ETP

This is a victory for dolphins, the marine crosystem, and consumers," said CMC President Roger E. McManus "Weappland the Senate for recognizing that only a binding international, science-based agreement will protect dolphins in the Eastern Tropical Pacific tuna fishery. We hope the bill will move swittly from Congress to President Chaton for his signature

The bill passed today will require Congress to provide \$11.8. million over the next four years to fully fund studies into dolphin health and biology and will life the current tunaembargoes for signatory countries once they common to an international agreement to protect dolphins, other marine life, and the tuna fishery. The bill also calls for a three-year study to verify that tuna can be caught in a manner that is sale for both dolphins and other marine life. The "dolphin-safe" label could be modified to mean that no dolphins died or were seriously injured in the harvest of tuna labeled dolphin sale pending the outcome of that study. The bill now must go back to the U.S. House of Representatives, which passed its own version, H. R. 408, in May 1997.

"We may now have in this bill the international solution to dolphins drowning in tuna nets," said CMC Marine Mammalogist Nina Young "Strong implementation of this legislation could eliminate dolphin deaths in the Easter Tropical Pacific tuna fishery





### Playing ball with good grades

We believe it is gratifying to hear about colleges granting scholarships to students who have excelled in sports, with the stipulation that they must also have good grades. This has not been the case in the past.

For years, it has been a disappointment each time some college or professional sports star reveals that he or she only got to college because of sports proficiency. Some will admit their high school grades would never have qualified them for college admittance.

We tend to forget or overlook the fact that college is supposed to be an educational institution with sports as a sidebar.

Unfortunately, some sports enthusiasts wouldn't agree. They couldn't care less what a grade point average has been, so long as their favorite college is able to obtain an outstanding football or basketball player.

But who is supposed to benefit from what transpires in college? Students, or sports fans who sit in the grandstand or watch on TV?

Listen to the interviews on television. Some of the nation's top athletes, who went to the pros from college, openly sound (and conduct themselves ) as if they hardly passed the eighth grade. It's not difficult to see how that person got to college, or got through college. This person got a degree throwing a ball around while others knock themselves out to study and learn.

What kind of role model are we setting up for our youngsters? Many people have heard a youngster boast that he doesn't need to study in school. "I'll be so good at basketball that they'll pay me to go to college," he may say. "I'll make a million bucks without having to study."

Very few make it. and we end up with unefficated people who may have had big dreams, but now face a difficult future.

## Rising demand for college education

The problem of accommodating demand for a college education by the state's rising tide of high school graduates has produced more than a few solutions likely to send tax-phobic Floridians scurrying for dry ground.

One widely publicised "solution" would have

the state establish a network of four-year "teaching colleges that would forgo research in favor of mass producing only bachelor's degree graduates at a rate sufficient to absorb the thousands more high school grade expected to be college-bound from now well into the next century. That's a workable notion only if we exclude the capital costs of creating such institutions and believe, naively, that they never will be pressured to add more costly graduate and research programs by host communities anxious to reap the economic development rewards such educational activities foster.

The key features of a sound, cost-effective way of dealing with the state's shortage of baccalaureate degree opportunities can be found in the University of Central Plorida's joint use of community college facilities for delivering junior and senior level courses leading to bachelor's degrees. The sharing of expensive facilities, such as libraries and laboratories, under UCF's pioneering "Two Plus Two" partnership with community colleges in Brevard and Volusia counties has

in check. Simultaneously, the collaboration has extended educational opportunities to thousands of students unable to study on the university's main campus in Orlando due to financial constraints, jobs or other obligations.


today's Furthermore, Information technologies provide affordable means for delivering high-quality instruction over distances. Two-way, interactive televised classes beamed to UCFs branch campuses already enable Brevard and Volusia students to join their Orlando-based counterparts in classrooms led by faculty whose teaching is enriched by acholarship and research. Internet-based courses with professors who serve less as lecturers and more as one-on-one electronic coaches and mentors extend the reach of instruction even further by making time and place largely irrelevant in students' pursuit of undergraduate degrees.

UCF's experience with the branch campus model and with distance-learning technologies

Florida's community colleges and public universities can address the access challenge in a way that optimises existing resources and minimises new outlays. The major capital casts would be confined to appropriate information technologies and university buildings on community college campuses to house such support services as student advising and financial aid. Operationally, costs would be minimised by sharing staff and

Importantly, the model honors the spirit of the "Two-Plus Two" legislation, which carved out a primary role for community colleges in the delivery of lower division courses and allocated responsibility for undergraduate level third- and fourth-year courses to the state universities. It also can be franchised statewide with an array of programs and services specifically tailored to the needs of the different areas of Florida

In our increasingly knowledge-driven economy and society, everyone's best interests are served by broadening access to higher education. The flood of college-bound high school graduates will lift all boats if we find the will and a way of satisfying baccalaureate degree ambitions. We have at least one costeffective way of accommodating demand. Whether we have the will in lean certain.

### Dems' debate: More than new vs. old

House Minority Leader Dick Gephardt, D-Mo., faces a tough uphill battle as presidential rival to Vice President Al Gore, but the debate between them on the way to manage "the new economy" will enrich us all.

I plead guilty to joining in caricaturing the fight as 'old' Democrats (Gephardt) vs. 'new' Democrats (Gore). This plays into Gore's hands, and Gephardt is right in saying that their rivalry is both more complicated and more interesting than that.

There's no question that Gore wants to be identified as "new" and reinforce the idea that Gephardt is merely "old." On July 9. in a speech to the Center for National Policy. Oore described America's "new economy" in glowing

Recounting his travels around the country. Gore said, 'I have seen the new economy -- an economy driven by information, research, knowledge and technology. A new economy that values the productive capacity of people above all clse. A new economy linked to the global marketplace that saps dollars. Deutsche marks, and data around the world at the speed of light. A new economy that brings the promise of a better life to all Americans. ..."

Concluded Gore, 'I have seen the new economy .. and I am here to tell you that it

Then on July 18, he addressed the Democratic Leadership Council as "my fellow new Democrats" and said the choice facing the party was between those who 'embrace change, with all the promise and possibility it

brings, or fight vainly against it."

Gephardt insisted in an interview convincingly, to me -- that he is not fighting change but plans to engage in a searching debate with Gore on how to manage it.

On policy, Gephardt and Gore already are at odds over balancing the budget, free international trade, means-testing Medicare, and President Clinton's signing of the 1996 welfare reform bill.

But Gephardt said. There is no question that we're in a new world with a new economy and that this is a new country. The challenge is, how do we deal with #?"

On trade, for instance, Gephardt contends that his fight with the administration is not one of "protectionism vs. free trade," but "on what terms free trade will take place."

Said Cephardt, 'I'm for world trade agreements, but I insist that labor rights, human rights and environmental protections be part of them, just as intellectual property and capital investments are protected."

"Human rights and labor rights are not just a moral issue, but an economic issue." Gephardt said, because higher standards abroad will even the playing fleld between the United States and foreign countries and increase demand for U.S. goods.
On the budget, Gephardt said that "moving

toward balance is a strategy for m

higher growth and productivity, but it should not be the goal itself."

Gephardt claimed that instead of insisting

on exact balance by 2002, the economy will be better off if the budget is in 'rough balance' -- one percent of ODP or so -- with the deficit spent on "human investment" and atimulating

The Clinton administration is basing its economic forecasts on Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan's idea that 2.3 percent is as fast as the economy can grow each year without igniting inflation.

"I agree with Jack Kemp," Gephardt said, "that we can have growth of 3 to 3.5 percent a year, though obviously I disagree completely with the means he proposes," which are deep tax

On Medicare and Social Security, Cephardt holds to the traditional liberal position that means-testing of benefits or premiums will undermine universal political support for these social insurance programs and cause them to

He says he is not, however, against reforming Medicare by giving seniors choices of coverage similar to those in the federal employees' health insurance system.

interesting as his ideas are. Gephardt is going to have a tough time prevailing against Gore -- both intellectually and politically. For one thing. Gephardt has tied himself to a base in labor union movement and traditional liberal constituency groups, which have resisted nearly every attempt to adapt to the new sconomy and leaner government.

These groups have succeeded in dominating the Democratic 'nominating process just once in the last 25 years - in Walter Mondale's year of 1984, and then just barely.

Moreover, it's proven virtually impossible for anyone in either party to defeat a sitting vice president for the nomination of his party. Veeps have stature, staff, time, money-raising capacity, and connections that even congressional leaders can't match.

Staffers say that Gore jokes, when asked about Gephardt, that he's going to do his damnedest to make Gephardt speaker of the House in 1998, hoping that Gephardt will be establed with that perch.

## Pro-life or pro-choice

## Church attendance, abortion issue linked

Florida Voter, a bi-monthly political opinion publication generally looks at issues and events being brought up in Tallahasee or Washington, D.C. The magazine is published in cooperation with the University of Florida Department of Political Science, and the Graduate Program in Political Campaigning.

For the June/July edition however, the magazine took a new look at a very controversial subject: abortion/pro-life/pro-choice/etc. Not that it haan't approached the subject before, but this time, it reported on findings of feelings in comparison to church attendance.

This was the basic finding: that the more people attend church, the more they will be "pro-life" advocates. Those who never attend church or do so only a few times a year, are more apt to be pro-choice.

At the offset, the survey begain to seek what differences there may be in pro-life feelings between Catholics and Protestants. The results were surprising.

Rather than give any marked difference, it was eventually proven that the percentages were nearly the same, based on church attendance.

For Catholics interviewed who said they never attended regular church or did so only a few times a year, the percentage of pro-lifers was 25 and 27 percent.

For Protestants who never or only occasionally attended church, the percentages were 22 and 27.

For Catholics who said they went to church every week, 67 percent were pro-life. For Protestants, the figure was 68 percent. Why, was the next question.

According to a Fiorida Voter observation.

"Attitudes toward abortion are much more dependent upon church attendance than religious affiliation.

Clearly, the congregants to whom priests and ministers preach each Sunday do not identify with pro-choice believes."

The magazine concluded that church attendance probably reflects a voter's psychological commitment to a particular religion and the general moral tenets of Christianity. Stronger religious attachments increase attendance, since devotion for most people is best expressed within the walls of a church.

It continues, it is also possible that regular attendance exposes voters to anti-abortion propaganda from fellow parishioners or clergy.

As for others, the report said that people

without a religious affiliation tend to support unregulated abortions.

The document adds that Jewish voters had a tendency to not respond when asked their opinions in the survey.

As the study was conducted by a publication designed to give "political opinions," other factors were also weighed in the public support of pro-life and pro-choice.

POLITICS - Most political scientists saw little difference in a party affiliation, but the publication states, "pro-choice attitudes increase as voter identification moves from strong Republican to strong Democrat."

EDUCATION — The survey indicated voters who did not finish high school exhibited predominantly pro-life views. Voters with college experience were more pro-

AGE — Older voters are more likely than younger voters to exhibit pro-choice views. The survey said older voters have more knowledge of abortion restrictions prior to Roe v. Wade, which clearly has altered

many points of view.

One point should be noted however. Of the persons saying they were either for or against abortions, the majority, over two-thirds, indicated they believed there should be stipulations added to the situation.

SANFORD You saw the headlines: Mark Brunnell, \$35 million.

That's become as much the mark of an athlete these days as theuir uniform number

or team name. People don't say, Mark Brunell is the Jacksonville Jaguars' quarterback, do they?

No, from now on, they'll refer to Brunell as the 835 million quarterback. That's too bad, because Brunell is a bar-

gain at 35 mil. Okay, that sounds absurd, right? Nobody deserves 835 million even ifi it's for five years.

Guess again. Shaquille O'Neal makes 8108 million. Ju-

wan Howard is at 890 million. Mike Tyson earns nearly 840 million every

time he enters the ring for a bite to eat.

Brunell is a bargain. Name one athlete in professional sports who means more to his team than Mark Brunell.

Start with baseball. The Chicago White Sox without Fran Thomas still have Albert Belle, without Ken Griffey, the Mariners still have Randy Johnson. Jeff Bagwell at Houston? Craig Biggio.

Move on to basketball. Without Jordan, the Bulls easily make the playoffs. So do the Lakers, Jazz or anyone else in the NBA.

in football, the only player in the league close to being a one-man team besides Brunell is John Elway, who is treated rather

well in Denver. But whrn the chips were down last December. It was Brunell that singlehandedly carried his team to victory. Over Elway's team.

To understand Brunell's importance, you have to look past the Jaguars. Brunell is the only real hero in the history of a city with no real history.

Think about it. Florida's blue-collar town up on the St. John's River. Grimy Jacksonville, the place that other Floridians roll their windows up for every time they are headed someplace further north.

Jacksonville is only two hours away from Orlando and anyone here would be challenged to come up with even one event in the history of the city of any importance.

Actually, the place was the birth place of the film history (true story). Most of the famous Charlie Chaplin silent movies were filmed there and it was thriving after the turn of the century before some religious zealots found the movie crowd to be unacceptable and sent them fleeing to California (again, true story).

Since then, the city has nothing to show for the last 60 years until Jacksonville shocked the world by being awarded an NFL franchise three years ago. Suddenyl, Jacksonville had a dateline in major newspapers that didn't inleude the state and people learned to find.it on a map.

Still, it didn't have a hero. Then, coach Tom Coughlin swindled Green Bay out of Brunell for a fourth-round pick. Brunell spent a half-season on the bench and the rest became the biggest thing in the city's history.

So tell anyone in Jacksonville that Brunell doesn't deserve 835 million. Look at last season and Jaguar fans can dream about the future. When the season started, the Jags were coming off a 4-12 season with little hope of improvement. Brunell racked up yards and fired three or four interceptions per game. He seemed shy around the media and, a walk through the Jags' locker room gave no indication that Brunell was the leader of the team.

Forward ahead nine weeks. By that time, Brunell led the league in touchdowns, passing yardage, rushing yardage and intercep-

He made bad decisions that arguably cost Jacksonville at least two wins.

Then, troublemaking wide receiver Andre Rison was released and the mantle of leader was turned over to Brunell. For a wild final five games of the season, Brunell was a changed quarterback. No interceptions and he made the term, "Brunell to McCardell", a popular SportsCenter phrase.



## Expert: Bug zappers are useless

If masquitoes and other in-sects are taking a bite out of your summer fun, don't bother with one of those electric bug zappers, says a University of Florida pest control expert. "They are a total waste of money: Bug sappers will not control masquitoes or other biting insects such as horse-flies, doglies or deerflies," said Jonathan Day, associate pro-fessor of entomology with Uni-versity of Florida's institute of Food and Agricultural Sci-Food and Agricultural Sci-

They simply do not work as advertised. In fact, bug sappers actually make things worse by attracting more mosquitoes into your yard, and...killing thousands of beneficial insects that don't bother people."

Devices have been on the market for more than 30 years, and prices range from 630 to more than 6200 for those sold in upscale stores and catalogs. They all have an ultraviolet light that attracts bugs to an electric grid that electrocutes

While the UV light in these bug sappers draws a wide range of insects, mosquitoes and other biting insects are more attracted to the carbon dioxide exhaled by people and pets. They are also attracted to carbon dioxide that is passed through human akin.

The main reason bug sappers don't work is that mosquithem. toes are extremely sensitive to carbon dioxide." Day said. They see the UV light in your to see and hear buys fry. That's yard, but once they pick up one of the great attractions of even the slightest trace of car-

bon dioxide from people, they change direction and sero in on the source of that odor. They are expert at detecting carbon tiquide at levels as low as 50 perts per militar.

Some suppers claim to inter-rupt the mosquito breaking cy-cles, and others premise to control pests over an acre or more. Both of these claims also are false.

Even some of the new elec-tric bug zappers that have been fitted with an octenol packet -- which he described as "the latest marketing gim-mick" -- are virtually use-less mick" -- are virtually use-less for controlling mosquitoes.
Compared to the powerful attraction carbon dioxide has for mosquitoes, octenol is a minor chemical insect attractant and will not improve the overall performance or effectiveness of the device.

Test at the University of Plorida/IPAS Florida Medical Entomology Laboratory in Vero Beach show that thousands of beneficial insects -- not mosquitoes -- are the main victims of the electric devices. Out of some 10,000 insects destroyed by one bug sapper during a one-night test period, only

eight were mosquines. Beventy-one billion nontarget Beventy-one billion montarget imports are sapped by these devices across the nation every year. Most are beneficial beeties, moths, ants and midges along with perasitic wasps that control other insect pests.

Some people say the only good bag is a dead bug, but they don't understand the relationship of insects to the overall ecosystem. Whether it's for pollimation or fined for history

ecosystem. Whether it's for

pollination or food for birds and other, vertebrates, the vast majority of insects are beneficial. We would be in bad shape if we killed all our meets".

To ward off mosquitoes and other biting insects in the yard, Day recommends using an insect repellent containing an active ingredient called deet. He said it's the most effective repellent developed in the past 40 years. Wearing protection ciothing or simply going indoors also are options for battling posty insects.

Since mosquitoes breed in standing water, Day recommends emptying birdbaths, kiddy swimming pools and other water sources in your yard or adding a briquette with altectd to kill mosquite larves.







### Is obesity linked to genes?

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please comment pulse) are at higher risk for stroke on the recent media attention focusing on a genetic coupe for obesity.

DEAR READER: As I reported more than a year ago, obesity does seem to be genetically determined.

In the past few weeks, researchers have confirmed that some forms of extreme obesity may be linked to

Leptin, a compound released by fat cells, tells us when we have had ugh to set. Apparently, obese people tack such a cue; without it, they continue to est, irrespective of satia-tion. Consequently, they gain weight. This is a genetically governed pattern.

Before you overweight renders find cause for celebration, let me state the obvious: Although a genetic flaw may explain obesity, diet is still the cornerstone of therapy. In short, since obese people out more than they need, they can lose weight by dieting - whether the cause of the overweight is genetic or not. Such patients need to tailor their caloric consumption to their metabolic needs. Thus, while it's true that most of us want to stop eating when we have had enough, some people don't respond to this cue; therefore, they have to reduce calories consciously - and stop eating EVEN WHEN THEY DO NOT PEEL SATIS FIED.

Recent research suggests that leptin, when added to the diet, reduces the craving for food. However, diet remains the single most important method of losing weight. In leptindeficient patients, this may be a daunting task: for the rest of us. it's simply a question of self-discipline and commitment.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I work in construction. This causes my hands to become rough and dry; eventually, the skin splits and cracks. This is very painful. I've unsuccessfully tried various over the counter creams and lotions. Do you have a suggestion?

DEAR READER: Actually, I have

Lotil, a nonprescription cream, is an excellent antidote for the dry, cracked skin so common in construction workers. Apply it at night and your hands should feel better in a few days.

thrombin times," to assess the degree of anticongulation and make adjust-ments in the amount of medication. You could be especially susceptible to the effects of Coumadin and may require daily doses well below the average of 5 milligrams.

In any case, you must work closely with your health provider to discover the dosage that is right for you. One that will effectively anticongulate your blood without causing bruising.

In principle, four teams from the Cape Town Zone 4 Championships (two open and two women's) qualify for the Bermuda Bowl and Venice Cup world championships to be played next October in Tunisia. However, trying to force teams to play in last year's World Team Olympiad in Rhodes, the World Bridge Federation decreed that one had to play in Rhodes to be eligible for

Tunisia This had an effect in Cape Town. where Egypt won the women's series but didn't play in Rhodes. So, the team finishing third will presumably go to Tunisia. However, at the end of the semifinals there was a tie for third between Pakistan and South Africa. These


teams had to play eight more boards. Pakistan came to the final deal needing six points to win. Both Souths were in four spades At the first table, the Pakistani West

led the diamond queen at trick one. The declarer, Shirley Murray, played low from the dummy. Now a club switch defeats the contract, cutting declarer off from dummy's heart winners, but West continued with the diamond jack: plus 420 to South Africa. In the other room, Maureen Holroyd

led the heart five. Declarer, who may remain anonymous, cashed her top trumps before continuing with her other two heart bonors. Now, rather than play a club to the ace and discard a diamond loser on a heart winner, declarer conceded her spade trick. West switched to the diamond queen. South completed an undistinguished performance by covering with dummy's king. This allowed the defenders to take three diamond tricks to defeat the contract: plus 50 to South Africa.

Thus South Africa was third, winning by 20-5.
