Riders Suspended In Racing Probe On Canadian Track

HAMILTON, Ont., Aug. 9.—Jockey Robert Wankmueller of Newark, N. J., described as the ringleader of riders involved in rigged horse races on Ontario tracks, was arrested yesterday on a charge of defrauding the public. He denied the charges.

Wankmueller's arrest by Ontario provincial police came shortly after the Ontario Racing Commission ruled him off Ontario tracks for life.

It was the first action by police against a jockey as a result of the Racing Commission probe of race throwing in the province. The commission's ruling said: "Jockey Wankmueller is suspended for life for offering bribes to other jockeys to induce them to interfere with the true running of horses entered in races on race tracks in the province of Ontario, effective immediately, and the subject matter of the commission shall be forwarded to the attorney general of Ontario for such further action as he may deem fit."

Even jockeys appeared before the commission yesterday. All testified that they had been approached by Wankmueller to accept money for holding their horses back in various races.

Three men have been arrested on charges of defrauding the public. They were picked up at Fort Erie track while attempting to cash tickets for large sums of money on races believed to have been fixed.

Americans Abroad May Be Forced To Register For Draft

FRANKFURT, Germany, Aug. 9.—Maj. General Lewis B. Hershey, U. S. Selective Service director, said today it is highly probable that young American men living outside the United States will be required to register for the draft.

Hershey said he has come to Europe "to get the feel of the draft situation in regard to Americans living here."

"We are giving a great deal of study to this question but a decision on how and when has not been made," he said in an interview.

Hershey said he will confer with State Department and Army leaders in Germany on the problems of drafting American youths outside the U. S.

New Cargoes Open Up New Industry On Inland Waterways

WASHINGTON, D. C. Aug. 6.—(Special)—Diversification of cargoes moving on the inland waterways is effecting a concurrent diversification of industry along the navigable rivers and canals of the United States, according to Chester C. Thompson, president of The American Waterways Operators, Inc., the national association of the barge and towing vessel industry.

"New cargoes are moving by barge up and down the inland waterways and new plants are being built at water-side to process these cargoes," the inland waterways leader said.

Thompson cited the Mississippi River at New Orleans as typical of a national trend.

Barge traffic on the Mississippi River in the Port of New Orleans probably will exceed 15,000,000 tons this year. In addition to the water-borne commerce more than 6,000,000 tons of barge traffic on the Mississippi River will move through the Port of New Orleans for processing elsewhere.

The inland waterway freight includes hemp, sisal, manilla, jute, grain, canned foods, coffee, sugar, molasses, rubber, animal feeds, post, poles, piling, wood, sawmill products, sand, gravel, crushed rock, iron, steel mill products, semi-manufactured iron and steel in advanced stages of manufacture, aluminum ore, concentrates, base alloys, scrap, construction machinery, sulphur, clays and earth, petroleum and petroleum products, gas oil, distillate fuel oil, chemicals, cotton, fertilizer, paper, sea shells, oil seeds, stone and cement.

Barge movement of these cargoes either into or out of or through the Port of New Orleans attracted to the city's industrial area, in recent months, a \$2,000,000 twin mill, a \$70,000,000 aluminum reduction plant, a \$1,500,000 bulk yeast plant, two cement plants, a \$6,500,000 refinery addition, a \$2,000,000 match factory, additional grain storage and handling facilities, an engine factory, new and enlarged plants for processing grain, sugar and coffee, chemical plants, steel warehouses and fabricating plants, woodworking plants and new industries for processing by-products of these new industries.

Thompson cited barge traffic figures for 1949 (the latest U. S. Corps of Engineers totals) as a measure of the supply of raw materials available to the new and expanding industries. The 1949 and 1951 movements will exceed those during 1949 in most instances.

Cargoes barged into the Port of New Orleans in 1949 represented a total tonnage of 7,740,461, and 104 categories of raw materials, semi-finished products and finished products. Included in this inbound traffic were:

Iron and steel, 106,462 tons; construction machinery, 114,872 tons; motor fuels, 509,556 tons; residual oil, including bunker, 815,372 tons; distillate fuel oil, 852,368 tons; crude petroleum, 4,067,460 tons; sand, gravel, crushed rock and limestone, 496,990 tons; wood and wood products, 28,805 tons; grain and grain products, 344,284 tons; indigestible vegetable products (including rubber but excluding fibers), 132,079 tons; sea shells, 846,844 tons; building and monumental stone, 50,300 tons; chemicals and chemical products, 1109,038 tons.

Cargoes barged out of New Orleans in 1949 represented a total tonnage of 2,880,019, and 102 categories of raw materials, semi-finished products and finished products. Included in this out-bound traffic were:

Aluminum ore, concentrates,

and scrap, 178,304 tons; animal and animal products, 33,413 tons; sugar, 183,831 tons; coffee, 16,444 tons; animal feeds, 42,630 tons; textile fibers, 43,140 tons; wood products, 24,961 tons; sulphur, 267,182 tons; iron and steel, 186,644 tons; gas oil

and distillate fuel oil, 280,429 tons; crude petroleum, 800,917 tons; motor fuels, 624,424 tons; kerosene, 217,370 tons; residual fuel oil, 146,784 tons; petroleum asphalt, 42,531 tons; chemicals and products, 82,223 tons; miscellaneous commodities, 122,992 tons.

FLORIDA TO WISCONSIN Low-cost inland waterway transportation has made possible the erection of a fertilizer plant at Prairie du Chien, Wis., to supply farms in Minnesota and Wisconsin. The new plant is 2400 miles from the source of supply for its principal raw material. Phosphate rock is being barged from Tampa, Fla. to the Wisconsin plant via the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway and the Mississippi River, it is reported by Chester C. Thompson, president of The American Waterways Operators, Inc.

Tows moving this cargo in barges of 1200 tons capacity are also transporting fertilizers 2500 miles from Tampa to St. Paul, Minn.

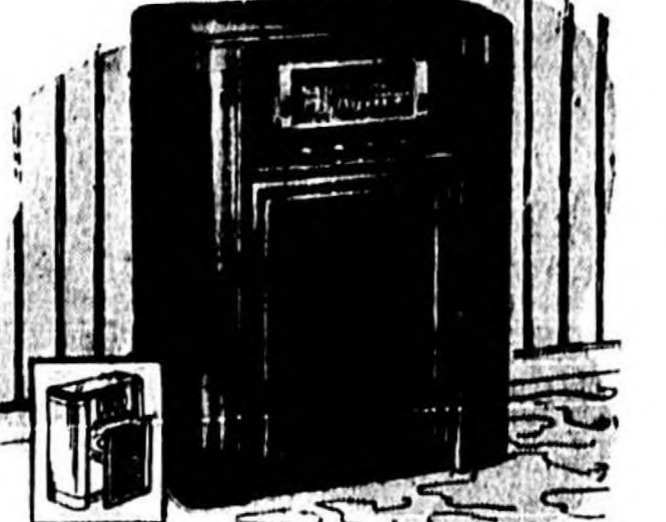

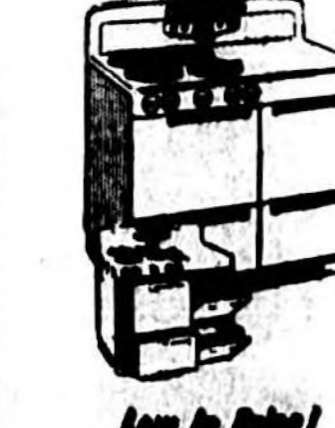

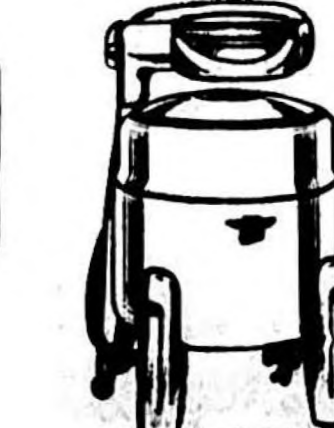

### Defense Production Agency Tries To Control Scramble For Metals

NEW YORK, Aug. 9.—(AP)—The government is extending its control this fall over civilian as well as defense use of steel, copper and aluminum. Its aim is to see that civilian goods shortages don't become acute next winter. To that end, it will hand out almost every pound of the metals.

The Defense Production Administration hopes in time to end the present wild scramble for these basic metals, which it says has been brought about in part by some manufacturers asking for a lot more metal than they need for defense work.

But some industry spokesmen predict the confusion in the metals markets will be even worse for the rest of this year, while civilian industry switches over from the present "free market" to one where the government parcels out the metal needed for more than 4,000 products—everything from nuts and bolts to automobile bodies.

Some in the metals industry believe that by the first of the year the controlled materials plan can be working smoothly, if it is applied to all users—as the government says today it will start doing in October.

Under this plan, the makers of steel, copper and aluminum hope, each manufacturer of civilian goods will be getting his fair share of the metals, and makers of defense goods will be getting all they need. The plan is roughly comparable to that used during World War II, except that civilian goods makers will be getting a much larger share this time.

However, there are doubters around. A steel industry weekly, the Iron Age, says today: "There is no guarantee that CMP will be operating realistically—that steel

prices will match production—by the first quarter of 1952 or later." It contends that the government is assuming that many customers will not order as much steel as they are allotted; and it is assuming that many others will cancel steel contracts when they find their inventories growing too large.

The present acute scramble for steel, industry officials say, is due to the government's over-allotting the supply, especially among such finished steel products as alloy steels. The National Production Authority retorts that in many cases metal consumers have received certified orders from NPA for defense work needs and then have placed the same order with two or more steel mills to assure delivery. The Mills quickly have orders for more steel than they can produce. Other holders of certified steel orders are being turned away.

The company's new plant, which is being built at a cost of \$1,000,000, will be completed in 1952. The plant will produce 1,000,000 barrels of cement annually, an increase of 500,000 barrels over the current output. The new plant will be located near the existing plant in West Palm Beach.

### The Old Man Who Wasn't There Gives Black Hills Tourists What They Want

CUSTER, S. D.—(AP)—A small droopy-eyed house, and a grizzled old prospector, are the main attractions of the Black Hills in 1951.

### Letting West Berlin

The Red festival opened Sunday. West Berlin authorities reported that 177 had formally asked for asylum in the West. Of these, 23 have been tentatively accepted. The western policy is to turn them back unless they can prove it is "anxious for them to return home. Hard-pressed Berlin is already overburdened with the normal flow of refugees from the East, and so is Allied West Germany.

In East Berlin the Communists tried hard to keep their two-week show going at a lively clip for the half million youngsters they had brought in.

They had a program of sports, dances, circuses and street shows. But there still were thousands of the blue-shirted East German youth shuffling aimlessly about.

And, more and more, they sneaked into Allied West Berlin for a look at something better.

Most of these kids had no western money. They were awestruck by the facade of western prosperity. Many said that they were hungry.

The West Berliners did what they could to entertain them. Several score youth homes yesterday served 75,000 free meals to the eastern kids in one day.

This was such a drain on the homes' resources that they appealed for public contributions if this business is to go on for another 10 days.

Many West Berliners were wishing the Communists would cut short their program and get their kids back home. Even the Reds seemed to be hard put to sustain interest in their big parade next Sunday and a speech that night by Walter Ulbricht, East Germany's "Little Stalin."

The kids got constant doses of anti-West propaganda, but for tens of thousands of these shiny astor and full show windows in the West seemed to talk louder than the Communist orators.

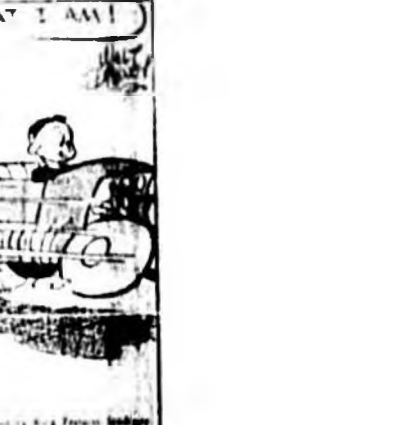
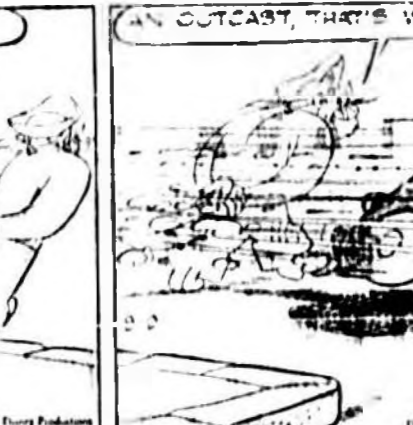
