Heathrow Vote: Who And Why

The impact of the 1,800-acre Heathrow planned unit development on the city of Lake Mary and the problem of an enclave were the focus of three Seminole County Commissioners' hearing on a Lake Mary offer to negotiate the de-commissioning of 60 acres of land connected with a highway between the airport and the city.

Bill Kirchoff voted against the de-commissioning proposal. Lake Mary city attorney Gary Massey offered to negotiate the de-commissioning in a letter to County Attorney Harry Murrett. In return, the city asked that the county drop its lawsuit.

'The other area, according to Kirchoff and Kwiatskowski, concerns the provision of utility and fire and police services to the area requested. "The reason we're involved in this is that it creates an enclave; and the city has to provide basic services," commented Kwiatskowski. He said he doesn't feel the city can adequately serve the enclaved area.

Berliner in New York To Begin Spy Swap Deal

NEW YORK (UPI) — East Berlin lawyer Wolfgang Vogel has arrived in New York to pick up Robert Thompson, a former U.S. Air Force cryptanalyst who is serving a sentence at Lewisburg, Pa., penitentiary after being convicted of being a Russian spy. Neither Vogel nor Thompson officials at the U.S. State Department, who announced the swap, would comment on their mission, saying they might endanger the prisoners' safety.

Shvchenko 'Welcome'

UNITED NATIONS (UPI) — State Department spokesman John Trainor said Wednesday Arshady Shvchenko "is welcome to stay" in the United States after formally resigning his job as the highest-ranking Soviet official at the United Nations. He left with \$75,000 in severance pay and benefits "strictly in accordance with U.N. staff regulations," a U.N. spokesman said.

Shvchenko said, "I now intend to take the necessary legal steps to establish residence in the United States, where I hope to be free to lead a normal and productive life."

Small Terrorist Sentenced

NAIROBI, Kenya (UPI) — A Somali court has sentenced a woman terrorist to 30 years imprisonment for hijacking a West German airliner to Mogadishu and killing its pilot. Somali officials said there could be no appeal. The terrorist, Soraya Anasri, was the sole survivor of a band of four hijackers shot when West German commandos stormed aboard the Lufthansa Boeing 737 jet and freed 88 hostages after it was commandeered to Somalia last October.

Castro, Ethiopian Remp

MIAMI (UPI) — Cuban President Fidel Castro and Ethiopian leader Mengistu Haile Mariam joined in a show of unity Wednesday and said their troops are ready to continue fighting in Africa. Castro, in a speech broadcast over Havana radio and monitored in Miami, said "it should be clear that Cuban troops will not stand still if there is any invasion of Ethiopia."

Israeli Hunt Bombers

By United Press International Israeli security forces today sealed off the center of the occupied West Bank town of Nabliin, keeping residents indoors while they searched for suspects in the bombing of a West German tour bus that killed two people and wounded six.

World War II Bomb Explodes

RHEINE, West Germany (UPI) — Three persons were killed and nine others injured Wednesday in the explosion of a bomb dropped by an Allied plane during World War II. Police said the bomb exploded when it was struck by a beam above a construction site between the railroad station and city hall.

Afghan Soldiers Try Coup

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) — Afghan soldiers today opened fire on the presidential palace and the interior ministry in Kabul in an attempted coup. The Afghan army, the government of President Mohammad Daoud, declared martial law.

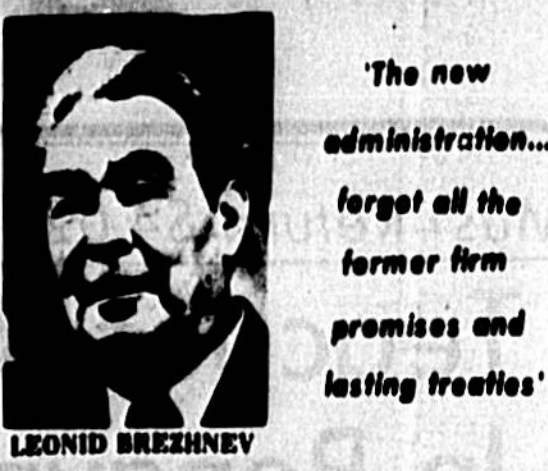
Ex-Agent Grounded

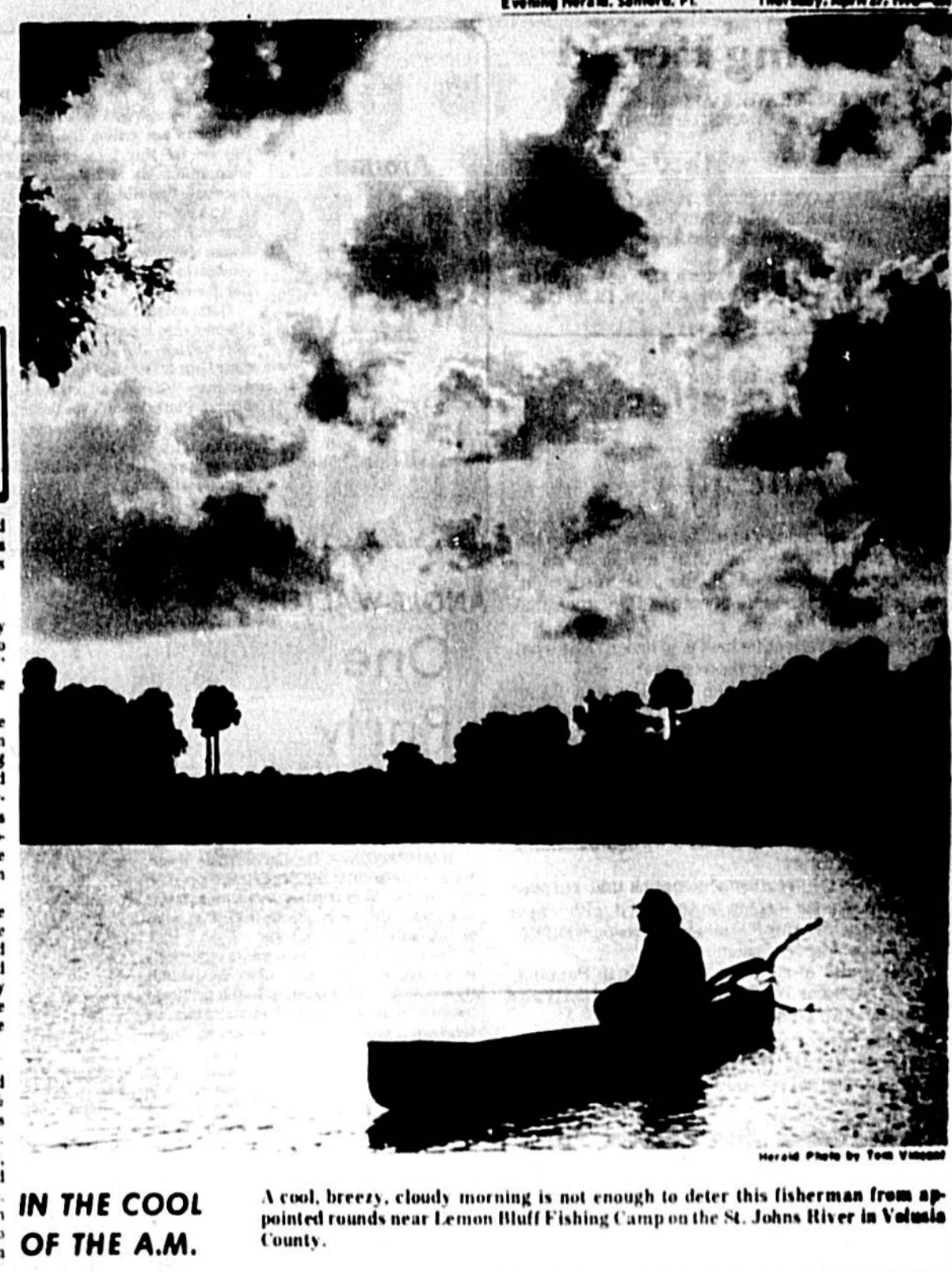

Longwood: Federal Repaving \$

Longwood City Council has voted to use \$1,000,000 in federal revenue-sharing funds to resurface Grant Street from SR 44 north to Longwood Circle and West Warren Street from SR 47 to Lemon Lane.

Council also voted to seek bids to pave Lemon Lane to SR 54 with 100 percent of the cost to be apportioned among the adjacent property owners.

Projects is that there be no discrimination by race, religion or nationality by the contractor. Council Monday night also approved a preliminary plat for Woodgate subdivision presented by Rick Perlman and Gary Lazar of V.P. Classic Custom Homes, with the stipulation that there be an 8-inch water loop and two additional fire hydrants and that permission for retention area under transmission lines be secured from Florida Power Corp.

The plat calls for 41 lots, 78 ft. by 130 ft., with homes to sell from \$48,000 to \$60,000, according to Perlman.

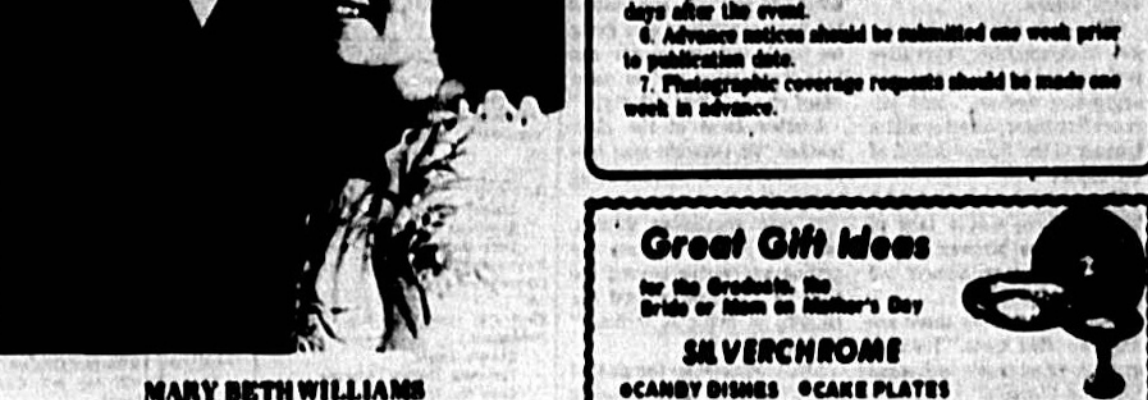
