



NEW YORK (UPI) — East Berlin lawyer Wolfgang Vogel has arrived in New York to pick up Rebert Thompson, a former U.S. Air Force cipher clerk who is serving a sentence at Lewisburg, Ps., penitentiary after being convicted at being a Russian spy. Neither Vogel nor Israeli efficial Shabtai Kalmanowits, who accompatied him, would comment on their mission, saying they might endanger the prisoners' safety.

## Forget Treaties, Look Ahead

leading this nation out of the last vestiges of colonialism—but the talk about the Panama Canal treaties is still lingering.

So a quick reflective look is in order. Just what did we do by ratifying those pacts?

With ratification of the new Panama Canal treating the most research patien in the

treaties, the most powerful nation in the hemisphere has shown that it can adapt its national interest to the aspirations of one of the weaker on an issue igniting emotions in both countries.

The aim of these treaties, as the supporters had to argue to the last minute, is to provide the best framework for assuring the security of the Panama Canal in the future.

Whether the treaties accomplish that purpose now will depend largely on the spirit with which

now will depend largely on the spirit with which the Panamanian people meet the responsibilities they will gradually assume.

The center of attention shifts now to Panama,

where Gen. Omar Torrijos must reconcile divisions within his own people.

There are Panamanians who believe the treaties do not go far enough, soon enough, to recognize the sovereignty of Panama over the

While President Carter successfully sold the treaties to two-thirds of the U.S. Senate, Gen. Torrijos must still mollify a segment of his population that may be impatient with the phased transfer of control called for in the treaty ratified April 18 along with the U.S. role in guaranteeing the canal's neutrality covered in the treaty ratified

The Senate made his job easier by clarifying the intent of the so-called DeConcini amendment which reserves the right of the United States to intervene militarily to protest the canal. Such a Took is the states, would be to

only to keep the canal itself "open, neutral, secure and accessible"—an answer to Panamanian criticism that the amendment would open the way for interference in the internal affairs of Panama. The administration's thin margin of support

The treaties are not a retreat for the United States, but an advance into a relationship with the Third World based on the realities of the close of the 20th century rather than the realities of Teddy Roosevelt's world at its beginning.

The United States did the right thing in seizing the opportunity to build the Panama Canal in 1903. Our country has done the right thing in recognizing the sovereign interest of Panama in the canal in

In a sense the treaties will not change the status of the Panama Canal. Since the day it opened, the United States has operated it on behalf of the world's commerce and as a key element in

The haggling in our Senate over the in-terpretation of the treaties has made it clear to Panama that the canal must always be operated on

It is part of the heritage of all the senfaring nations of the world and that it will remain.

Some of the dichard opponents of the treation now have taken their case to the country. They are urging the voters to throw out those senators who had the guts to stand up to be counted and supported the controversial pacts.
